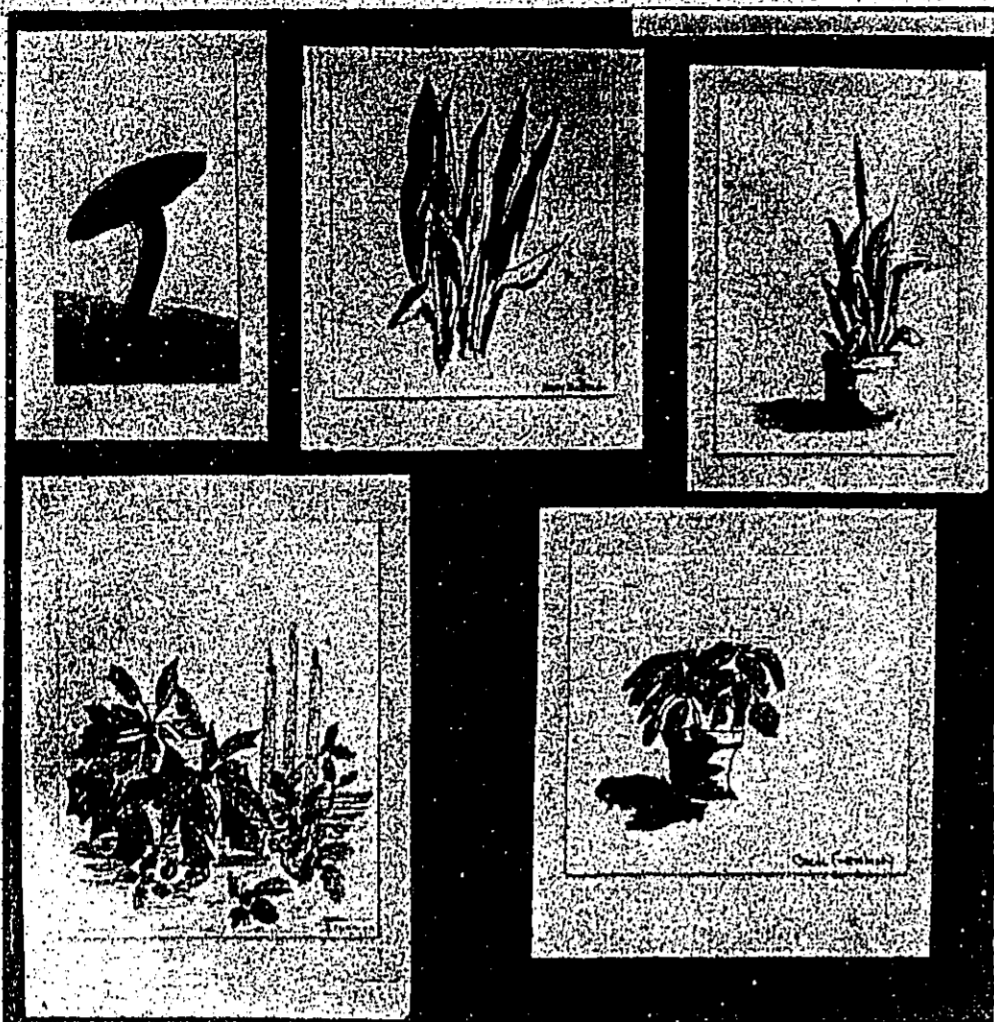

Voters Approve Bonds

Taxpaying voters of the Woodville Independent School District Saturday voted to approve the issuance of \$400,000 in bonds to rebuild and repair buildings destroyed by fire and damaged by a tornado.

The tally was 394 in favor to 104 against issuing the bonds.

The bond issue will supplement insurance settlements in construction and repairs to the buildings.

The school district lost one building in a fire which destroyed a school landmark, the old Rock building which housed elementary grades. On February 20 an early-morning tornado swept across the school grounds at tree-top height, taking part of the roof from the gymnasium, damaging the entire north wall of the high school building, and causing damage to the brick elementary building which is 45 years old.

Roofing on most other buildings was damaged and had to be replaced, and engineers called in by the school architects found that the brick building was unsafe following the tornado damage.

Elementary pupils have been attending classes in the educational buildings of the First Baptist and Woodville Methodist churches since the tornado except for the first and second grades who are in a new section of buildings and for the sixth grade which was moved to Wheat Junior High.

The pupils attending classes off campus at the two churches are being transported back and forth by buses both in the morning and afternoon as well as for lunch at the school cafeteria.

RC & D Plan To Review At Liberty

The Southeast Texas Resource Conservation and Development Project Board of Directors met in Kowitz on March 30 in the county courtroom.

They reviewed a work plan to conserve, develop and utilize the natural resources in San Jacinto, Polk, Jasper, Tyler, Newton, Liberty, Hardin, Orange, Jefferson and Chambers Counties.

This work plan will next be reviewed by state and federal agency representatives on April 20 in Liberty. After this meeting, the plan will be sent to the governor. Upon his concurrence, it will go to Washington for final action.

The Southeast Texas RC&D Work Plan includes over seventy requests from groups and communities for various project measures. Assistance has been asked to install water supply systems, construct flood prevention, provide needed technical and financial assistance to farmers, ranchers and woodland owners, perform animal health research, etc.

The plan has been in a development stage for fifteen months.

Commissioners Courts, Soil and Water Conservation Districts, Drainage Districts, River Authorities and Navigation Districts in the ten counties are sponsors of the RC&D Project.

The next Board meeting is scheduled for June 29.

In the Woodville district, W. S. Jarrott received 377 votes; W. S. Nichols 377 and Dr. L.G. Burton 372 votes. Five persons each received one written vote.

In Warren school district, J.R. Elliott received 63 votes; J.V. Harris, Jr. 60, and K.C. Kimbrough received two written votes.

At Colmesneil, Herbert Sutton received 92 votes and John Allen Pittman 91 votes.

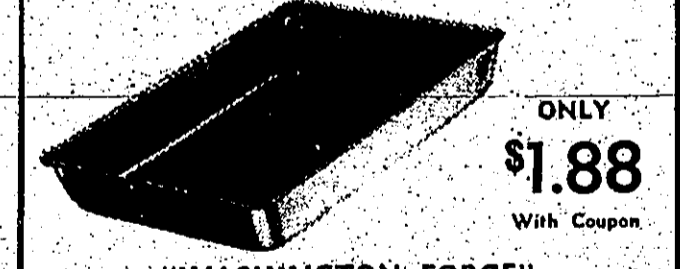
