Tornado Damages Peterson Home



Monday afternoon's tornado slammed these treetops into the side of the home of Roy Peterson in the Cheswood addition, breaking out two windows and causing damages to the roof. (See story at right and another picture below).

Tornado Hits Cheswood Area

A tornado which swept through the outskirts of Woodville Monday afternoon damaged two homes, twisted and uprooted numerous trees, and scattered debris in its northeasterly path.

The funnel dipped out of low-lying, dark boiling clouds about 3:50 p.m. (Daylight Saving Time). It knocked out electric power in Woodville and disrupted telephone service when trees were blown across the lines on the Chester Highway.

The homes of Billy Frank Eaves and Roy Peterson were damaged by the blow. At the Eaves home, air vents were blown off and the roof damaged, and trees were blown into the Peterson home, breaking two windows and causing other damage. Other homes in the Cheswood addition of the Chester highway narrowly escaped damage as trees were blown down and tops twisted off by the twister.

The funnel traveled on across the Colmesneil highway and uprooted and twisted the tops out of some huge trees in the Roy Pate pasture. Many of the tops were dumped near the railroad tracks east of the Pate place. A section crew working in the area took refuge under a railroad trestle when they saw the funnel cloud approaching.

The twister's path was reported by 2:30 a.m. on the east side of Tyler County. In Park County, a twister struck Chetaska about 2 p.m. Monday, damaging the post office, Methodist church, and homes. It is said a twister caused damage to homes and farms

in the northern part of the city.

This is the second tornado to hit Woodville within 10 weeks. On February 20 an early morning twister damaged homes, the schools and the Woodville Junior Company. Elementary school children are still attending classes at the church educational building as a result of the February twister.

Jail Escapees Have Fisherman's Luck

Two young men being held in Tyler County jail on forgery charges had a brief fling at freedom Wednesday of last week after sawing a bar and scrambling to the ground down a nearby tree.

David Thomas Wilson, 19, and Jerry Von Turner, 18, gained their freedom sometime in the wee hours Wednesday morning after sawing a bar off a window in the jail's west side. They were back in custody Wednesday night after Capt. Warden Billy Moore discovered the two floating down the Neches River on a log-soaking wet.

Wilson is being held in lieu of two \$1,000 bonds set March 10 on a charge of forgery and passing, and Turner is under \$1,000 bond on a forgery charge.

Sheriff Grady Ray filed charges against two Colmesneil men in connection with the escape. The two had been in jail on minor charges and had been released, and according to the sheriff smuggled a hacksaw to Wilson and Turner. They were picked up last Wednesday morning following an investigation by the sheriff.

They are Frank Ervin Williams and William Vincent Korngog, who waived preliminary hearing and are now in jail unable to make \$2,500 bonds.

WOMAN KILLED IN WRECK AT TOWN BLUFF MONDAY

Mrs. Lillian Morgan Blythe, 54, of Chance-Loeb was dead at the scene following the collision of a pickup truck which she was driving and a large truck at Town Bluff Monday about noon.

Highway Patrolman Joe Wilmon said that the accident occurred when the pickup driven north by Mrs. Blythe suddenly swerved into the path of a southbound truck belonging to H. J. Hurst Company. Wilmon said that a tire may have blown on the pickup, since both tires on the impact side were flat.

Driver of the Hurst truck was not injured, although a passenger was brought to Tyler County Hospital for treatment. He is Clayton Young, who apparently had minor injuries.

The accident was investigated by Wilmon and Sgt. Ralph O'Quinn of the Highway Patrol. Justice of the Peace E. B. Sheffield conducted an inquest at the scene of the accident.

CAMPFIRE GIRLS DISTRICT TO BE RE-ORGANIZED HERE

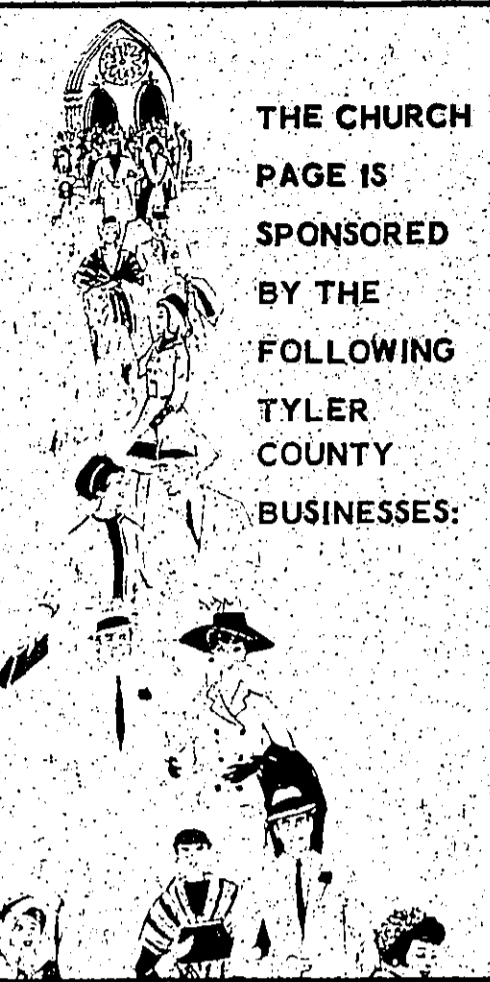
