## Jury Returns Finding In Damage Suits

An 88th District Court jury late Saturday returned its answers to 38 issues involved in a damage suit on behalf of two plaintiffs against Harold Allison, doing business as Allison Pole Company.

The lawsuit was filed against the pole firm following a car-truck collision on Highway 69 at the entrance to the pole plant which resulted in the deaths of four persons. However, before testimony was completed last week a motion for a non-suit was granted two of the plaintiffs in the consolidated suit, and the jury returned its answers in only two of the cases.

The two cases reaching the jury were those in which Violet Moya, the surviving mother of Clarine Moya and Betty Jean Moya, surviving wife of Alvis Moya, were plaintiffs.

Withdrawing from the trial on the non-suit motion were Edna Andrews and Woodrow Glover.

In its answers to the court, the jury found that Alvis Moya, driver of the car, was negligent in driving at high rate of speed and not having the car's headlights on in the early morning fog. It also found that the pole company was negligent in not having a flagman on the highway and fares out

when the truck pulled onto the highway.

The jury recommended that Violet Moya, as the surviving mother of Clarine Moya, a passenger in the car, be awarded \$5,000 as compensation for the death of her daughter. It also recommended compensation to Betty Jean Moya in the death of her husband in the sum of \$10,000 and also \$15,000 to each of the three Moya minor children.

Lawyers in the case this week were preparing motions for judgment to be presented to Judge J. A. Coe, who presided in the trial. After the case was filed, Judge Coe will enter judgment in the two cases according to the answers to the issues by the jury. The accident on which the suits were based occurred June 9, 1966, when a car driven by Alvis Moya was in collision with a trailer-tractor loaded with short lengths of pole cutoffs from the pole plant. The car struck the truck at the rear dual wheels as it was pulling onto the highway.

Killed besides Alvis Moya were Clarine Moya, Johnny Lee Andrews, and Woodrow Glover. Driver of the truck, James Merle Abbott, was not injured.

The size of payment a farmer gets," Clark said, "reflects the degree of participation in a program. Putting some kind of limit on the size payment a farm could receive would jeopardize the success of the program in its primary purpose— to keep production in line with demand.

In the case of price-support loans, the chairman pointed out that the purpose of the price support program is to help farmers get better prices for their production out of the marketplace itself. Crops are put under loan only to keep them from rushing onto the market at harvest time in great quantities and depressing prices, he said.

"Therefore, if we limited the amount of price support loan that larger farm operations could obtain we would just be turning loose heavy volumes of wheat, or corn, or cotton, or other supported commodities on the market. This would exert pressure on the market and prevent the most intelligent orderly marketing that the program was designed to assure. In a situation like Nacogdoches, with the small volume operator would be the first to get hurt," Clark said.

Price support or equivalent payments are made to eligible producers of cotton, feed grains, wheat, wool, mohair and sugar. In the case of cotton and grain, payments are offset to reductions which have been made in the income farmers have to pay for their crops by placing them under loan and turning them over to the government in settlement of the loans.

Payments on wool and mohair are intended to provide an incentive to increase production. The demand for these commodities still is heavier than the domestic supply.

Sugar payments are more than offset by taxes imposed on sugar processed both domestic and imported.

Conservation payments are made as a cost-share arrangement. Land owners or operators must share in the costs of carrying out approved conservation practices.

Chairman Clark said that in administering conservation programs, more than in the commodity programs, AEC committees have more leeway to encourage maximum participation for those subjects that contribute to the entire community and other wide-spread benefits to benefit farm families who live in rural communities.

To work out surpluses where they still exist.

To maintain a reasonable balance between production and the use of farm commodities.

To maintain and improve farm income.

To hold down and cut if possible the costs of farm program administration.

The chairman noted that the goals are achieved through incentives and payments. The incentives encourage producers to voluntarily reduce their crop acreage and production. Diversion payments are made in cotton, feed grains, cropland adjustment, cropland conservation and conservation reserve programs.

## Farm Programs Designed To Meet Four basic Goals

Chairman John C. Clark of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation County Committee, was a reply for those who think farm program benefits should be limited to assisting only the smaller family size farms.

"They should remember the 'why' of farm programs," he said.

The USDA official said that recently there has been some criticism of farm programs for providing benefits to larger farms instead of concentrating all the benefits on smaller farms operated as family enterprises.

"What these critics overlook," Chairman Clark said, "is the intent of and authorization for these programs as outlined by the U. S. Congress. Programs were designed to meet national agricultural problems. He outlined the four basic goals in the current programs:

## Hygienic Meats
