Thornton Found Not Guilty By Jury

An 86th District jury Friday returned a verdict of "not guilty" in the trial of Tax Assessor-Collector A. L. (Pete) Thornton who was charged with the embezzlement of \$16 in fees collected by his office.

The jury of 10 men and two women took 14 minutes to reach the not guilty verdict. The trial of Thornton began Wednesday morning following the completion of a jury Tuesday afternoon. Testimony by prosecution witnesses centered around the fee of \$1 collected for tax certificates, in which taxes due on a certain piece of property are shown (or if paid this is shown).

Mrs. Norlin Bandy, a former deputy and at one time chief deputy in the office, testified that the procedure in the office included putting the \$1 fee on tax certificates in a cigar box at the end of each day along with notary fees and farm license affidavits.

Mrs. Bandy testified that Mr. Thornton on occasions took money from the box stating that he "had to go buy some feed". She testified that money in the cigar box was not included in the reports or in the deposits made at the bank.

Mrs. Wanda Brasher, also a former deputy in the office, testified that the money for tax certificates was put in the cigar box, and that she on one occasion had seen Mr. Thornton take some money from the box with the comment that he "had to go buy some feed".

She testified that Mr. Thornton was the only person she had seen take money from the box.

Mrs. Barbara Tolbert, another former deputy in the office, also testified as to the procedure for handling the tax certificate money.

Defense attorney Stanley Cue put Willie Bean, tax assessor-collector for Hardin County, on the stand. He testified that shortly after Tyler County changed to a salary basis from a fee basis for paying its officers that Mr. Thornton came to his office in Kountze seeking information concerning the money collected as fees for tax certificates. He said he took him to the office of the county attorney of Hardin County, but he was not in his office. He then took Thornton to the office of District Attorney R. A. Richardson, who was in, and that he left Mr. Thornton there.

Clay W. Foreman, an auditor for the State Comptroller's office, testified that his duties were to make audits of tax offices in several counties for the state. He identified two instruments concerning audits made in Tyler County. He testified that in audits of county tax offices he was primarily concerned with seeing that the state got the tax money coming to it and did not audit the county's share of tax collections. He did run what is called a "spot check", he said, which was to determine if the tax assessor-collector had enough money on hand and in the bank to meet his obligations for taxes collected. He testified that it was the usual custom to take the tax assessor's word for the correctness of collections other than the state's share.

He asked Mr. Thornton, Foreman testified, if his office collected for tax certificates, Mr. Thornton told him that he did only from the large companies. He testified that his audit made in December 1966 covered the previous fiscal year, which was July 1, 1965 to June 30, 1966.

Mr. Thornton took the stand and testified that when

he went to the office of Mr. Richardson in Kountze, he was told that he would have to get any information from the county attorney of Tyler County. Mr. Thornton testified that the county attorney, Clyde Earl Smith, Jr., had told him that he was the attorney for the commissioners court, but that Mr. Thornton could look up the information in two large law books which he pointed out. Thornton testified that he was not a lawyer and had no idea where to look for the information he sought.

Mr. Thornton in his testimony stated that the fees for tax certificates, notary work and farm licenses were put in the cigar box in the safe. He said that he never used any of it to buy feed, but bought supplies for the county which the commissioners court could not furnish. He testified that he paid for an electric typewriter, a Polaroid camera and on occasion when the office ran out of supplies such as adding machine paper, typewriter ribbons and pencils and he would not get immediate authorization from the commissioners court that money in the cigar box was used to buy these. He also stated that he used the money in the cigar box to pay dues to meetings of the tax assessor meetings for himself and employees. He testified that the county allowed him only \$30 a month for gas to drive over the county assessing taxes, and that he also used the money in the cigar box to buy gasoline during the assessing period when he would drive several thousand miles. He said that fees in cigar boxes were not enough to cover all extra expenses and that he had to pay the balance out of his paycheck.

Testimony in the trial was concluded late Friday afternoon. Judge H. A. Coe read his charge to the jury and the prosecuting and defense attorneys made their summaries to the jury and the jury retired about 6 p.m. At 6:14 they called for the hall to report that they had reached a decision.

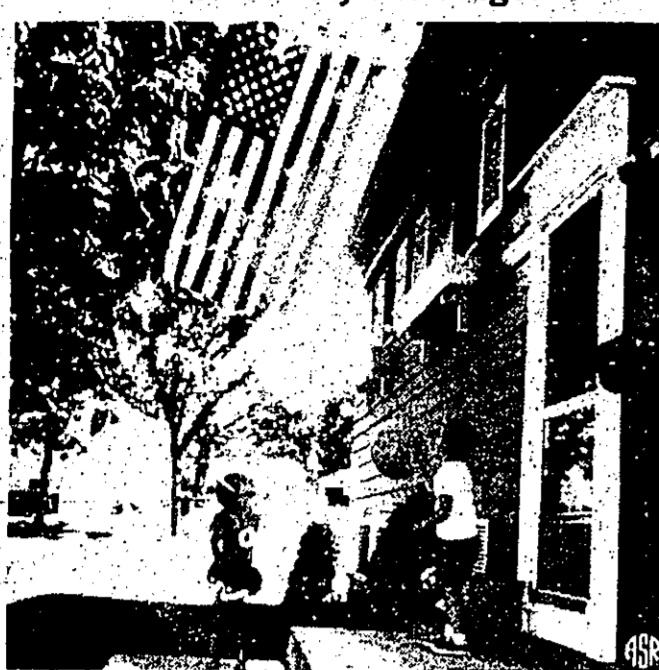
