## Citizens State Bank Sets Grand Opening Sunday

The Citizens State Bank of Woodville will have an open house Sunday from 2 to 6 p.m. to show off their enlarged banking facilities. Dedication ceremonies are scheduled at 2:30 p.m.

The enlargement project has been underway for several months with the main banking lobby and adjacent areas widened, an addition added to the rear of the building, a drive-in banking area with a closed circuit TV.

Sunday's grand opening is expected to attract several thousand people. The bank has arranged for a number of attractions in the parking lot to entertain the children, including a merry-go-round, ferris wheel, and a trained monkey. There will also be pop-corn, cotton candy and sno-cones for the youngsters and refreshments for everyone.

The bank is offering \$100 and \$50 as door prizes to be given away at 5 p.m. Also at 4 p.m. the same amounts will be given to the persons with the lucky bumper stickers on their cars.

The Citizens State Bank began its 48th year of operation in May. It was first opened on May 8, 1920. The first president of the bank was Alex Thompson, who was founder and principal organizer of the bank. Dave P. Mann and L. M. Feagin were the first principal officers of the management team of the bank.

During the early years of the bank's life there were three banks in Woodville which were the Tyler County State Bank and Woodville State Bank in addition to the Citizens State Bank. Of the three banks the Citizens State Bank was the smallest, Woodville State Bank was reorganized into the Guaranty Bond State Bank. During the bank moratorium of the 1930's the Citizens State Bank, although being the smallest, proved to be the strongest of the three banks and absorbed the Guaranty Bond State Bank while the Tyler County State Bank dissolved and went out of business. At the time Woodville served as principal trade area for the county which had a larger population than at present. This was at a time when farming and pine timber provided the economic base for the entire county. There were over twenty sawmills in the county, five cotton gins and it took five hours to go to Beaumont.

Since its organization exclusive of the present staff, the bank has had three presidents, namely Alex Thompson, J. M. Feagin, and D. P. Mann.

Today the bank offers among its list of 34 services: checking and savings accounts; commercial, real estate and installment loans of all kinds; trust and fiduciary powers as well as Drive-In-Motor bank facilities using closed circuit television considered to be the most modern in the world. In its new enlarged banking facilities, Citizens State Bank of Woodville was the first bank in Southeast Texas to begin construction on a television motor banking facility.

The bank has over 10,000 square feet of area and 400 automobiles. A community room is included for use by the public and any community group which may desire the use of this facility. This room is adjacent to a social room which serves as a lounge for bank customers and employees. The bank is proud to be the only location in Tyler county where facilities are available for flying both the United States and Texas flags. The décor of the interior is of contemporary design using modular furnishings with walnut accessories. Cork paneling is used to accentuate the area for five loan officers on the loan platform.

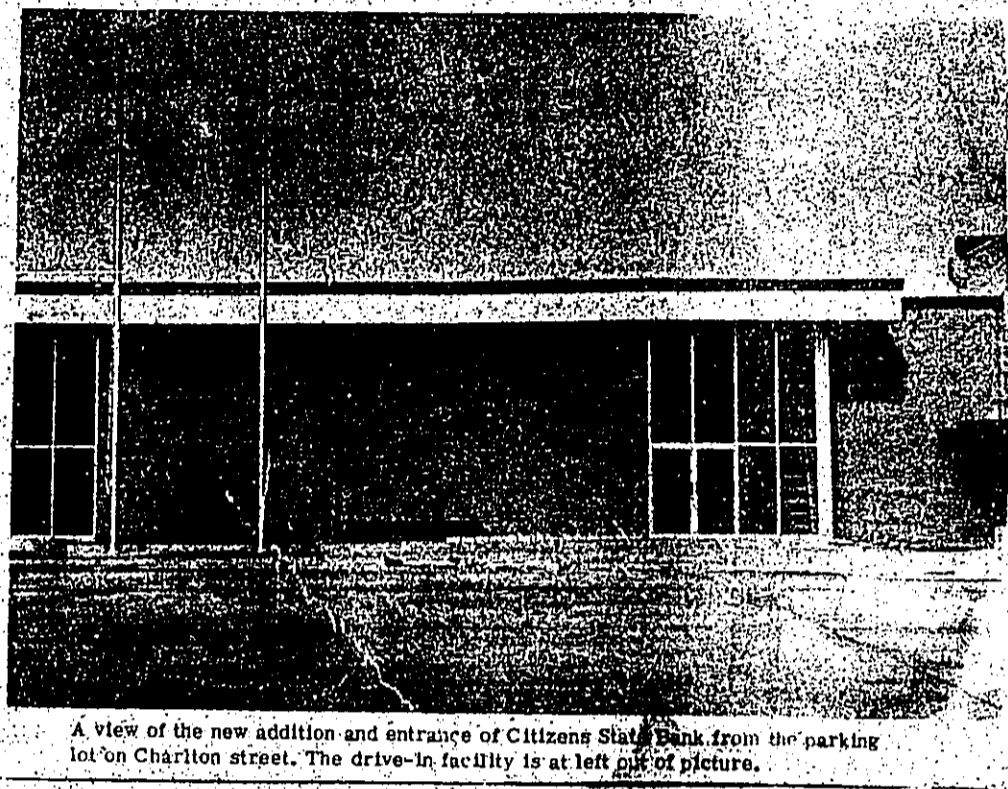

## City Fails To Get Grant For Water And Sewer Job

L. J. Cappelman, state director of the Farmers Home Administration, has notified Congressman John Dowdy that the application of the city of Woodville for a grant for construction of water and sewer facilities does not meet requirements due to its low minimum water and sewer charges.

The letter, a copy of which was mailed to City Attorney Josiah Wheat by Mr. Dowdy, follows:

Honorable John Dowdy, House of Representatives, Washington, D. C.

Dear Mr. Dowdy: Thank you for your letter of June 22, concerning the application for a grant filed by the City of Woodville, Texas.

In establishing justification

for recommending grants in connection with the construction of rural community water and sewer facilities, a comparison is made between water and sewer rates in the applicant communities and those of surrounding communities. The minimum water and sewer bill for the City of Woodville is only \$3.25 per month. The average water and sewer charge for the preceding year was only \$5.70. The minimum rates for other communities in the area are \$6.00 to \$7.00 per month and bills average approximately \$7.50. We believe the City of Woodville could increase water and sewer rates enough to repay a loan. Therefore, we do not believe there is sufficient justification for recommending a grant.

You are aware of the limited amount of grant funds which were made available for the State of Texas during the 1967 fiscal year. We have made every effort to insure that these funds were used to the greatest advantage. Since they were needed to provide minimum bills in a neighborhood without undue hardship.

Your continued interest and support of the Farmers Home Administration are deeply appreciated. If there is further information or assistance we can provide, please let us know.

Funeral services for Lee Feagin, 80, prominent local civic leader in Tyler county, were held Friday at 11 a.m. at the First Baptist Church here. Officiating was Pastor T. Mr. Feagin died in Tyler County Hospital Wednesday of last week after suffering an apparent stroke on Tuesday. He had been at his desk in Citizens State Bank the previous week and was in apparent good health.

Mr. Feagin was a native of Chester and attended public schools in the county. He attended Baylor University and was graduated from the Eastern College of Business. He began work with Thompson & others Lumber Company at Denette, and was associated with their bank, the Guaranty State Bank, founded in 1911, which later became the First State Bank of Colmesneil. Mr. Feagin was president of the Colmesneil and Chester banks, and at one time was president of all three banks in the county.

He was a past president of the Tyler County Chapter of the Kiwanis Club, and a past member of the Kiwanis Club of Colmesneil. He was also a past member of the Kiwanis Club of Woodville, and a past member of the Kiwanis Club of Marshall. He was a past member of the Kiwanis Club of Galveston.

Mr. Feagin was very active in church work. He was a deacon in the First Baptist Church of Woodville, and taught a boys Sunday School class for several years. He had been treasurer of the church for 10 years. He was a trustee of East Texas Baptist College in Marshall, where a dormitory for boys was named after him. He was on the board for the Baptist Theological Seminary in New Orleans, in helping build the Southeast Texas Baptist Hospital in Beaumont and was a trustee of that institution for many years.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Wylie Mae Feagin; one son, David A. Feagin of Colmesneil; one sister, Mrs. Evie Sanders of Lufkin; and a number of nieces and nephews. ## Fancy Nets Readied To Catch Game

Peace and tranquility on the open range sometimes is disturbed in the name of science as the rifle deer and antelope are being hunted from Texas Parks and Wildlife Department operations.

Out in the Texas-Pecos Wildlife Biologist Tommy Halley is riding herd on fawn antelope with a weird night-vision contraption mounted on a high-slung pickup truck. With the aid of powerful aircraft landing lights Halley expects to get close enough to catch the camouflaged specklers in ordinary daylight.

The young antelope will be tagged as an indispensable part of Department studies to determine movements, age changes and possibly some clues to recent herd losses.

Equally ambitious is a new, knee-extended net under experiment at the Kerr Wildlife Management Area to be used as a trap net to catch exotic animals. Smaller nets of this type have been successfully used to snare deer, waterfowl, doves and quail.

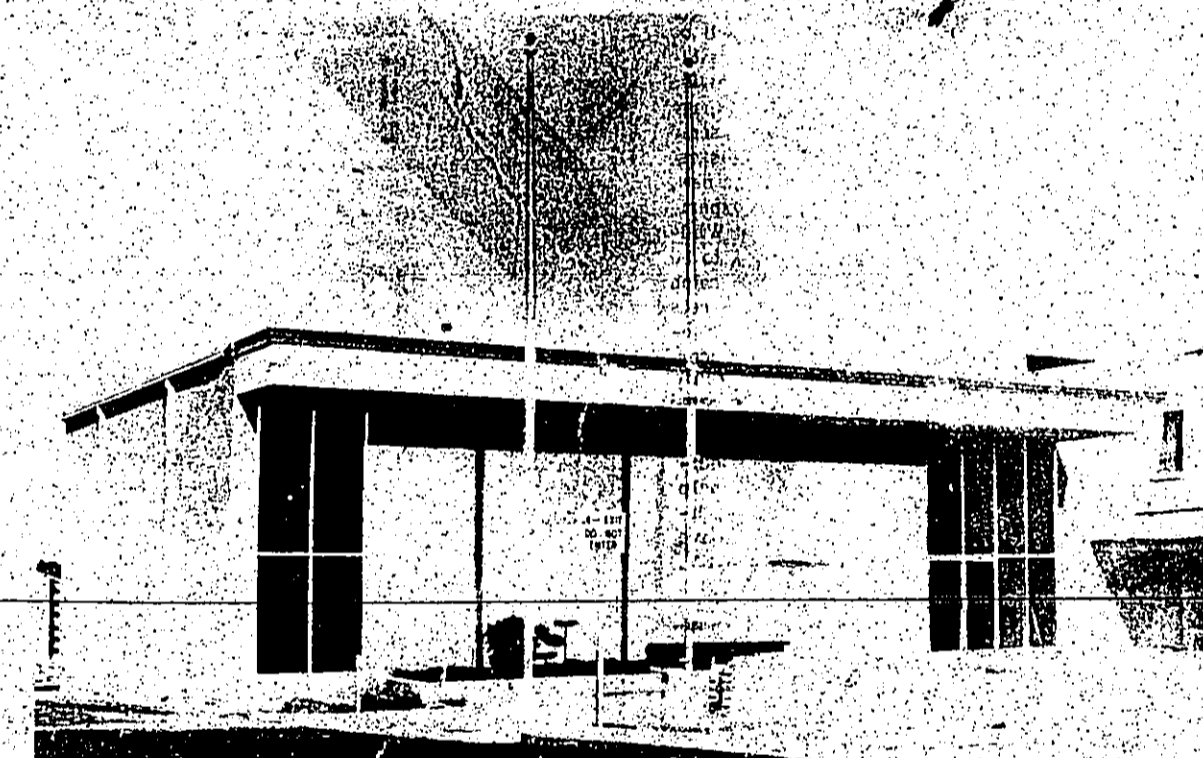
