Miss Texas Pageant To Be Telecast

Sixty-three of Texas' loveliest girls arrived in Fort Worth Monday to prepare for the annual Miss Texas Pageant. All are competing Wednesday through Saturday for the coveted Miss Texas title and a chance to become Miss America.

Janis Adams, Miss Tyler County, is among the 63 candidates for the crown now held by Susan Kay Logan of Lubbock. She registered at the Western Hills Hotel headquarters Monday, accompanied by Mrs. Thelma Cain and Mrs. Harold Peyer.

A round of rehearsals and special entertainments kept the girls busy until actual competition began Wednesday night. Preliminary performances will also be held Thursday and Friday at Will Rogers Auditorium, with the coronation of the winner Saturday night.

The finale will be televised on a regional hook-up in a one-and-a-half hour colorcast beginning at 10:15 p.m. Saturday.

For the preliminary competitions, the girls were divided into three groups, alternating each of the nights in swimsuit, evening gown and talent categories. Janis is in Group C. The talent presentations are nightly highlights for the audience and important to the candidates because of two \$100 scholarship awards going to the non-finalist talent winners.

Mistress of ceremonies for the pageant will be Sharon Kay Ritchie, Miss America of 1956, now Mrs. Kyle Role, wife of the football great.

Appearing on the nightly shows with Miss Ritchie will be a variety of performers.

U. S. Civil Service Exams Slated For Postal Employment

The United States Civil Service Commission announced examination for postal clerk and city carrier at the starting salary of \$2,647 per year. Grade PFS-4, for postal employment in first and second-class post offices in the following counties consisting of Zone II in Texas:

Angelina, Blaine, Jasper, Jefferson, Newton, Orange, Polk, San Saba, Tarrant and Tyler.

All qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, national origin, sex, political affiliations, or any other nonmerit factor.

Carriers sort and distribute mail, handles heavy sacks weighing up to 80 pounds, and performs related duties. The work involves continuous standing, stretching and reaching. Carriers deliver and collect mail on foot or by vehicle under varying weather conditions. In most offices they must be able to drive a vehicle under all kinds of road conditions. They may be required to carry on their shoulders loads weighing as much as 35 pounds and to load and unload sacks of mail weighing up to 80 pounds.

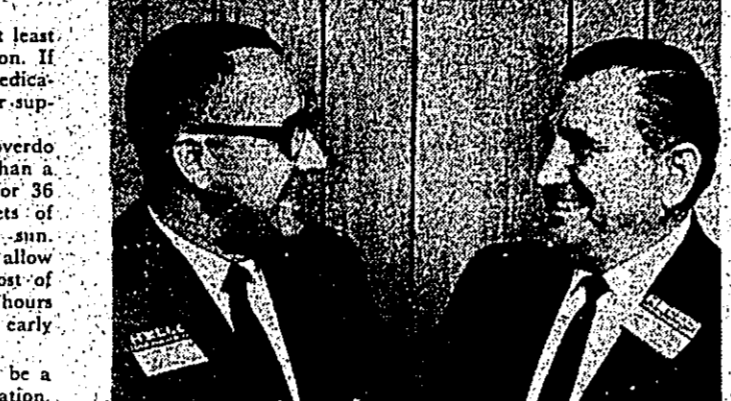

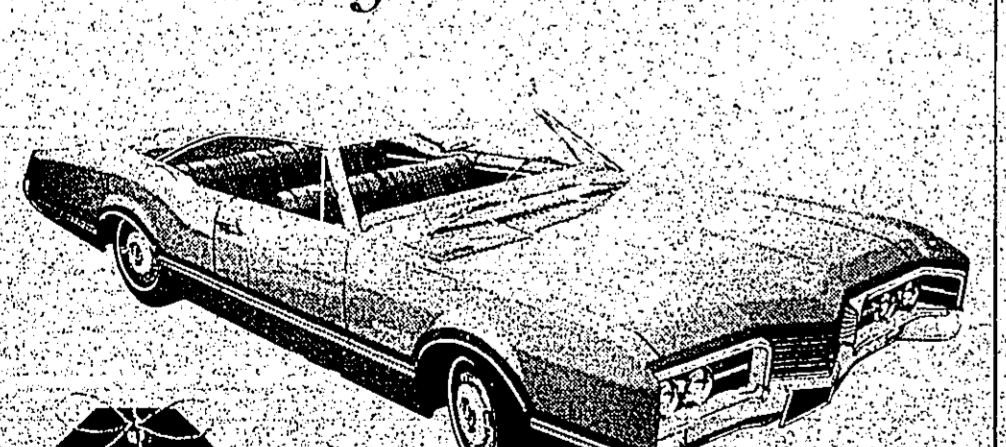

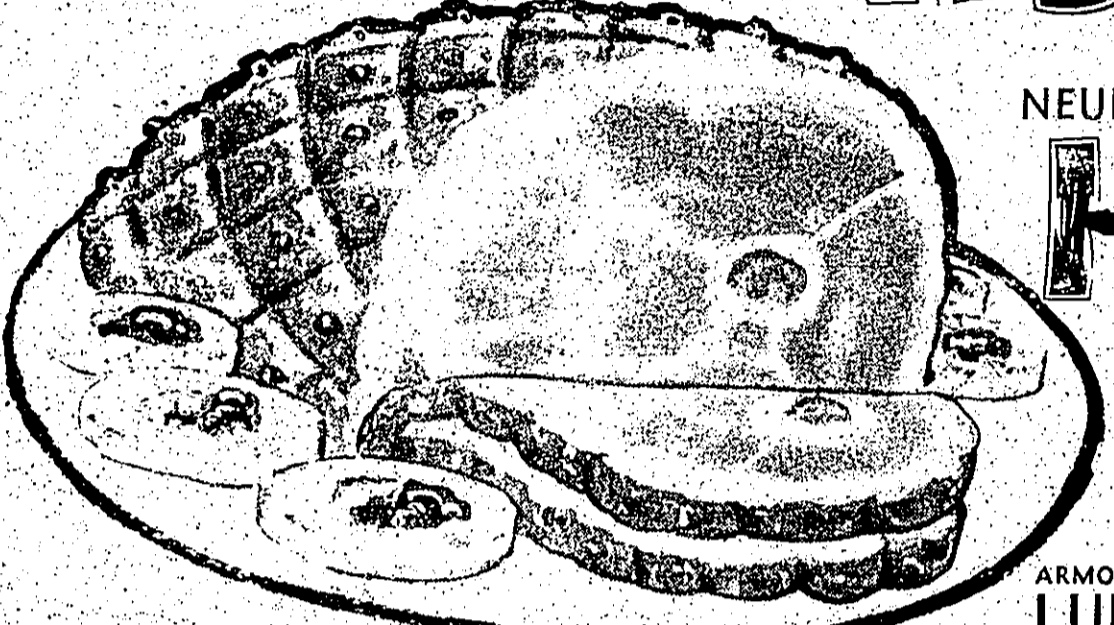
