

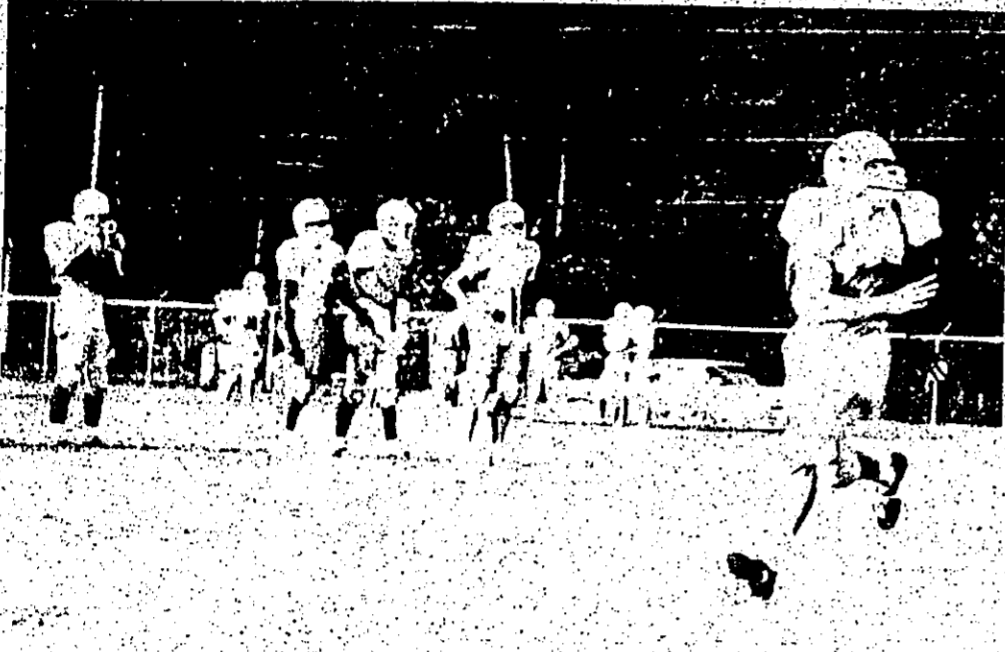

Other highlights of our jamboree were the Venezuelan and German campfires; playing the wide game and juggling and stunts with boys from 89 countries.

Lady Baden Powell, widow of the founder of Boy Scouts and vice-president Humphrey were distinguished guests of our sub-camp—Bad Ischl.

The closing ceremony on August 10 ended with a spectacular candlelighting ceremony where each boy repeated the scout oath in his own language.

New Regulations On Drivers License Effective August 28

The Department of Public Safety announced today that August 28 marks the effective date of new regulations for drivers licenses and motor vehicle titles and registrations.

The new regulations are designed to make the licensing process more efficient and to reduce the number of violations.

Among other provisions, the new regulations require that all drivers licenses be renewed before expiration.

The regulations also provide for the issuance of temporary licenses to drivers who are unable to appear for their regular examination.

These regulations are part of a broader effort to improve the efficiency of the Department of Public Safety.

The new regulations will be in effect from August 28, 1957, through the end of the year.

B. M. Minters Vacation in Oak Ridge, Tennessee

Mr. and Mrs. B. M. Minters and Tommy Minters of Spurper recently visited the American Museum of Atomic Energy (Oak Ridge, Tenn.) which features demonstrations and displays on peaceful uses of the atom.

The museum, operated for the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission by Oak Ridge Associated Universities, is the first such institution in the nation devoted to nuclear science. Especially trained picture-demonstrators show how the power of the atom is utilized in medicine, industry and agriculture.

A lecture in the museum's "medical room" illustrates how radiologists or "tracer atoms" are used in diagnosis and treatment of thyroid disturbances and cancer. Mechanical hands of the upper and lower limbs, operated by the tour guide show visitors how radioactive materials may be handled safely. A huge reactor model is used in still another area to describe the workings and purposes of the various types of nuclear reactors.

HOMEMAKING HINTS

Beware of instant flour. There's more in the cup than meets the eye. When baking with instant flour, take 2 level tablespoons of each cup of flour called for by the recipe.

A full measure of instant flour in a cake or cookie recipe, designed for regular flour, may alter the texture and flavor of the final product.

Instant flour is processed with steam or hot water after regular milling to make tiny granules stick together as larger particles. This takes up less space in a measuring cup. Therefore, instant flour mixes more readily with water without forming lumps and is a handy product for making gravies.
