In an election held Saturday in all three districts, a proposal to consolidate the Chester, Camden and Corrigan school districts was voted down when Chester voters rejected it, 146 to 126.

Chamber to Meet On September 11

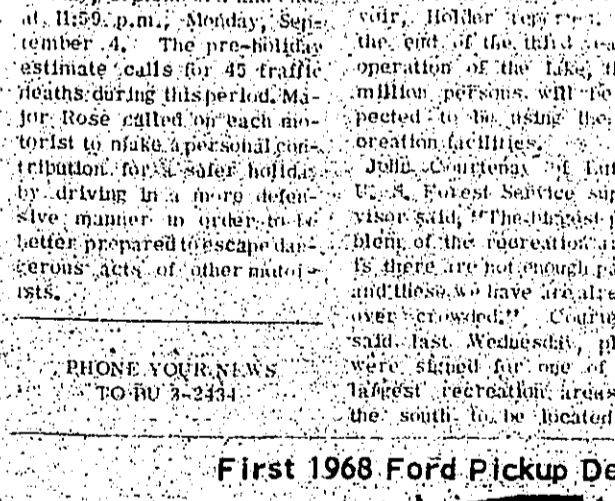

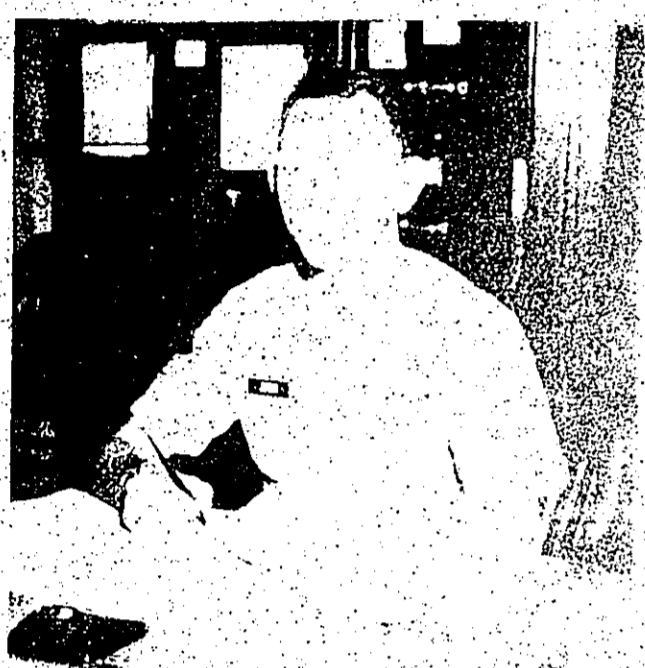
St. Lawrence Altar Society Sets Cake Sale Sunday Morning

All Number Calling To Start Here 1968

All telephone number prefixes in Woodville will change from their present prefixes to all number prefixes with the delivery of the 1968 telephone directories.

This new telephone numbering system is known as All Number Calling (ANC).

Arthur Carruth, manager of Southwestern Bell, said about three-fourths of the telephones in the United States have already been converted to All Number Calling. The change to a new numbering system is necessary because of the tremendous growth in the number of telephones. Telephone companies would average about one telephone for every 200 people in the country, Carruth said.

"This standardization makes it more convenient for the telephone user when he travels on business, makes vacation trips or moves to another city," Carruth said.

Southwestern Bell and other telephone companies would eventually run out of telephone number prefixes if that number will change with the delivery of the 1968 telephone directories.

The changeover to all number numbers in Woodville is part of a Southwestern Bell program to convert all telephones in the states served by the company to All Number Calling gradually over the next few years.

"With All Number Calling, telephone numbers in Woodville will be of the same type as most phone numbers throughout the country," Carruth said.

"This standardization makes it more convenient for the telephone user when he travels on business, makes vacation trips or moves to another city," Carruth said.

"All Number Calling is also a step toward worldwide dialing where the usage of letter prefixes will be eliminated."

He said, too, that the trend in telephone instrument design is toward compactness. A dial with only numbers can be smaller, yet actually more readable and easier to use than a dial with both letters and numbers.

HOMEMAKING HINTS

Summer Turkey Bars
 Because "times" are hard, you'll want to try your culinary arts on turkey. If you don't already have a recipe favorite of your own, you may want to use this one for holiday turkey.

You will need a young 4-lb. turkey, 1 or 2 garlic cubes, 1 teaspoon sugar, 1/2 teaspoon each dry mustard and pepper, 2 teaspoons salt, 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce, 2 cups tomato juice, 1/2 cup lemon juice of vinegar and 1/4 cup butter, melted, or salad oil.

Split turkey in halves and remove skin. Rub with salt and pepper. Place turkey in shallow pan. Add 1/2 cup water. Cook for 1 hour. Turn turkey over. Add 1/2 cup water. Cook in a moderate oven for 1 hour, turning occasionally. The water should be reduced to just enough to cover the bottom of the pan. To prepare the hot-sauce, mix sugar, mustard, salt and pepper in a small pan.

Add Worcestershire sauce, tomato juice, bouillon and butter. Heat the mixture, holding and pour sauce over the turkey. Continue cooking and baste frequently with the sauce from the bottom of the pan, leaving a pool of sauce in the pan to keep when halves are turned up.

Cook until the turkey is tender and tender. Remove turkey from gravy. Cook for 1 1/2 hours longer. If the sauce is thick, add more tomato juice. Let turkey rest for about 3 minutes. Serve the sauce separately.

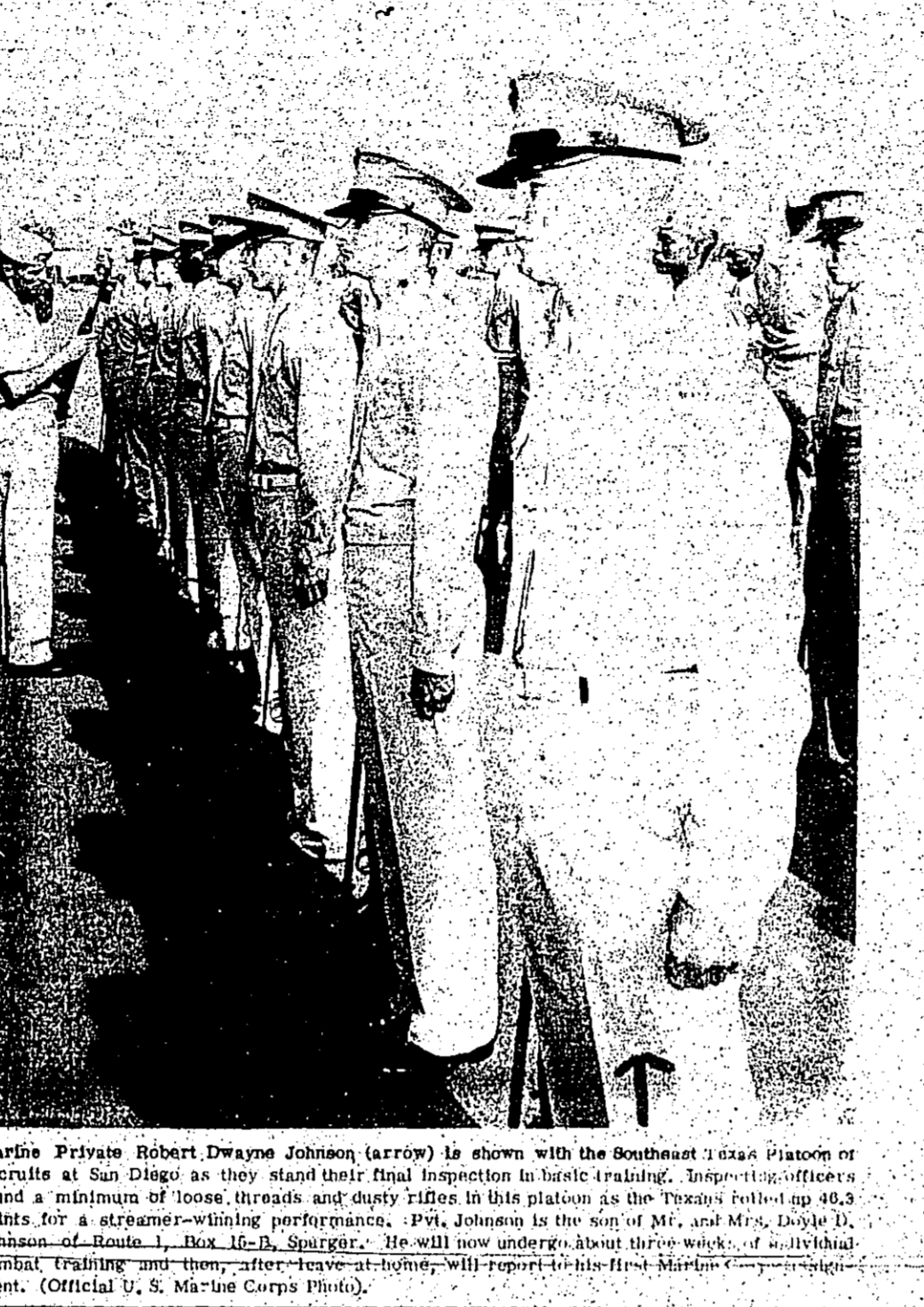

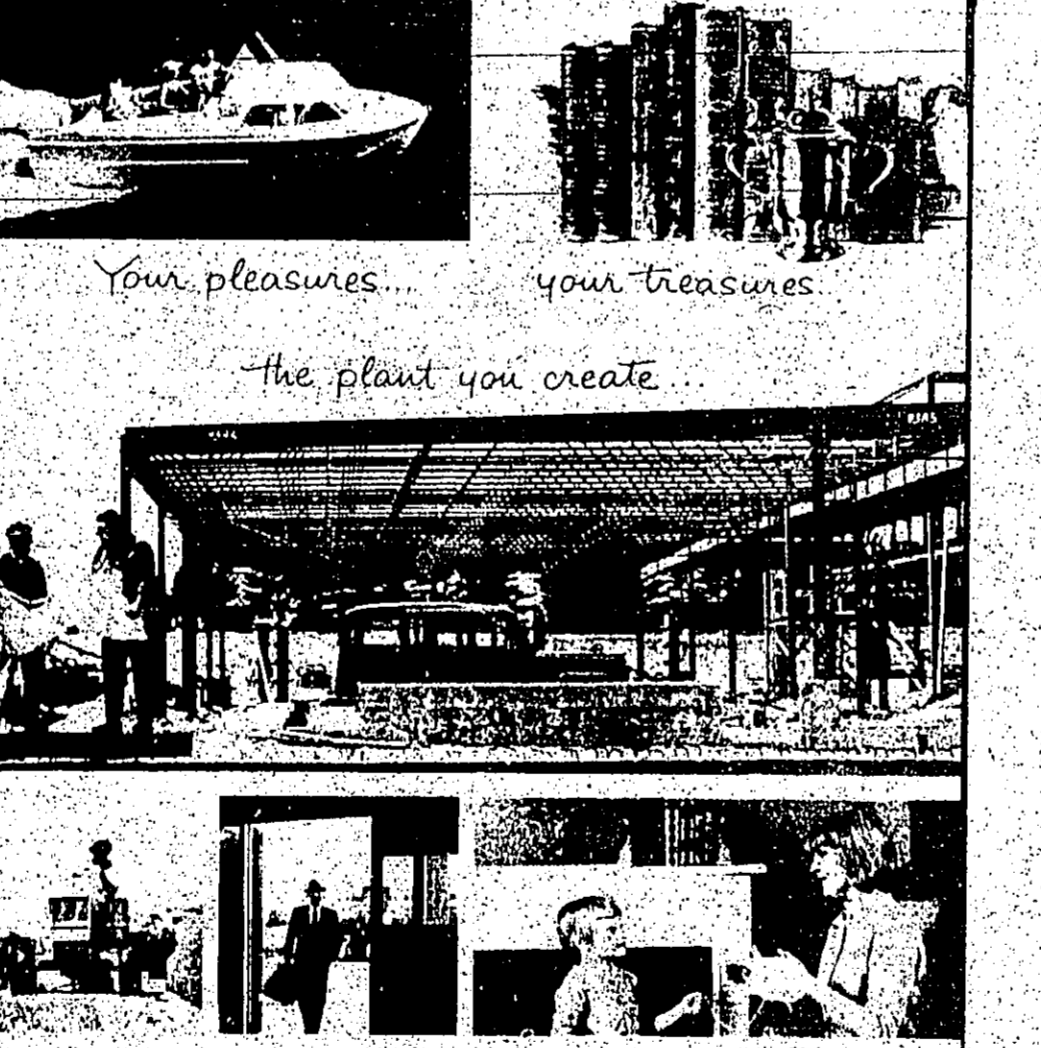
