Football Season Opens Friday



The days of decision are near for football teams.

Football will fill the air and the mud of leather as two lively sports collide with driving music to the ears of avid fans as the 1967 football season gets off to a flying start Friday night.

Tyler County teams will join 1994 other Texas teams this season in high school football to which winners in the various districts and classes in Texas Inter-scholastic League rivalry will vie for state championships.

Opening the season Friday night against non-district foes will be four Tyler County teams.

Kirby High School's Eagles will be hosts to the Newton Eagles, Warren's Warriors will play at Hemphill, Corrigan will play at Chester and Colmesnell will be at Lumberton (formerly Chance-Loeb).

Saturday night the Scott Panthers will open the season on Woodville field against Lovelady.

Fans of the teams have had an opportunity to get a pre-season view of the boys in action in scrimmages, but Friday night will be for real.

Coach Charles McGinty and his KHS staff have had the team looking good in scrimmage sessions, and Kirby High should have no trouble with a rebuilding Newton eleven which didn't win a game last year.

Newton does not expect to be stronger this year. (See separate story).

The Warren Warriors are expected to be contenders for the District 22-A title this year. They have a new coach, R. E. Wortham, who came to Warren from Klein where his team won their AA District last year.

The Warriors have shown up well in scrimmage sessions and will get a chance to show what they can do Friday at Hemphill against the Bulldogs.

At Chester, the Yellow Jackets will enter the Corrigan game as underdogs. At last word, they were being coached by Aubrey Bradley, the Chester superintendent, as the school was unable to hire a coach. Mr. Bradley is a capable coach but his material this year is reported to be a little thin.

However, Chester fans say the Yellow Jackets will fool someone this year—maybe even Corrigan Friday night.

Coach Bill Chism at Colmesnell is eyeing a successful season although the experts haven't picked the Bulldogs to win the district.

However, if the boys come along good without any injuries to key players they will end up in a good position to defeat Shepherd in the last game of the season which will be played at Colmesnell.

Evadale, last year's winners, is weaker and Colmesnell should get by them.

Other games involving District 21-AA teams finds Anahuac at Livingston, Navasota at Crockett, and Van at Rusk. Crockett will be the team Kirby High will have to beat for the HHS from all appearances, although Rusk could be much stronger than expected.

In 25-A, Orangefield plays at St. Mary's, Tarkington at Willis, West Hiddle at Kunitz and Barbers Hill hosts Crosby.

In District 22-B, High Island is host to Van Vleet and Evadale goes to Danbury for opening games Friday night.

Newton Coach Looks For Better Season This Year

The Newton Eagles will be much stronger than they were last year, Coach Bob Garner says he has a fine group of dependable football players. The Eagles will be trying to improve their dismal record of 0-9-1.

The Eagles will basically use the I formation on offense as they will have 12 seniors and 10 juniors on the squad. Coach Garner lost 10 lettermen and will have 10 lettermen returning but only four of those are returning starters.

Donnie Henslin will direct the attack for the Eagles with Charles Clark being at the right halfback position, Clarence Glen will be the left halfback with Bill Martin being the hard running fullback. Joe Caraway and Richard Griffin will be on the receiving end as Danny Sheffer and Frosty Kimes will be at the tackle positions, Charles Martin and Ronnie Henson will be the guards with Raymond Lane being the pivot man.

Raymond Hawthorne, James McLemore and Don Davis will be used mainly on defense. Hawthorne is a top notch safety with Davis being a tough linebacker.

Bill Martin will be a great asset to the Eagles as he is a great football player, in both offense and defense. Martin made all-district on both offense and defense last year.

Other outstanding prospects for the coming year are Donnie Henslin, Clarence Glen, Charles Clark, Danny Sheffer and Frosty Kimes.

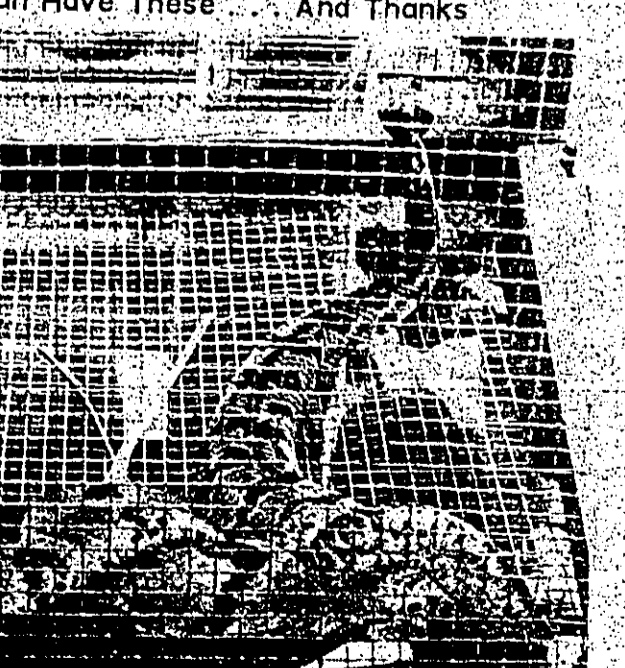

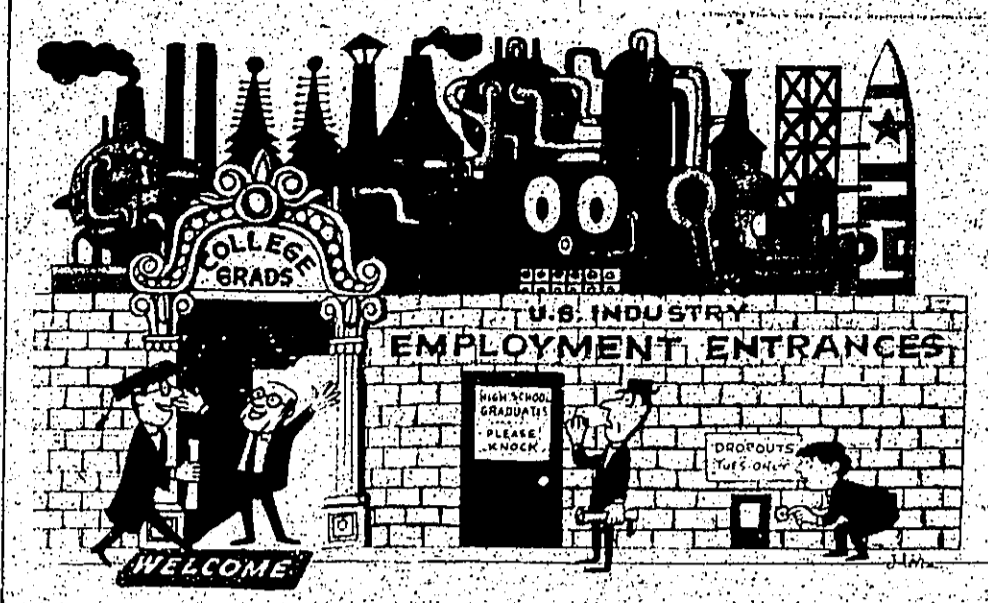

ACP Program Development Meet Set For Sept. 12

The annual county program development meeting of the Agricultural Conservation Program (ACP) will be held September 12, 1967 at the county office, Best Building, Woodville, Texas, John C. Clark, Chairman of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) County Committee, announced Tuesday.

The Soil Conservation District Supervisor, ASC county committee member, the Extension Service County Agent, the Farmers Home Administration County Supervisor, and many other conservation interests have been invited to attend the meeting which will be conducted by the ASC County Committee and representatives of the Soil Conservation Service and the Forest Service in the county.

The group will review county "practices" undertaken during the past year and evaluate their accomplishments. Also it will select practices and determine cost-share percentages and other provisions for the 1968 program in Tyler County.

Chairman Clark said that this year the group is expected to give particular attention to establishing goals for desirable conservation accomplishments on Tyler County farms and ranches, also to be discussed will be how the ACP can be better coordinated with other "practices" in the county.

All individuals and groups who do not attend the program development meeting, are urged by the Chairman to bring

to the attention to their community committee before the meeting any suggestions they may have for a more effective conservation program in the county.

During the past year major conservation emphasis in the county has been on the following practices: (A-2) Permanent Pasture; (A-3) Applying Limestone; (B-1) Pasture Improvement and (B-3) Brush Control.

The ACP cost-share assistance generally amounts to about 50 percent of the cost of a practice. Assistance is limited to those practices which the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) county committee considers to be most needed and for which aid is most essential to their full establishment.

For low-income farmers—Farm families whose gross income from all sources does not exceed \$3,000—the ACP provides cost-share aid of up to 75 percent of the cost. Accomplishments cost shared under the 1966 ACP program include among other measures: 4,800 acres of permanent cover, nearly 50,000 water storage reservoirs and ponds, and 100 establishments of diversion and spreader terraces on 225,000 acres. The 1966 allocations of \$209,700 to ACP funds of which Texas received \$19,788,000 with Tyler County receiving \$27,000.00.

County Agent Reports

WET ROADS TURN CAR INTO BOAT—It takes only one-fifth of an inch of water on the road to turn your car into a boat.

When the front wheels hydroplaning, the driver loses ability to steer, and most important, he loses the use of his front wheel brakes, O'Neal said.

For example, an auto with tires inflated at 24 to 30 pounds will hydroplane at speeds ranging from 50 to 77 miles an hour, according to the National Safety Council.

Major factors in hydroplaning are depth of fluid on the road surface, speed of the vehicle, and tire tread, air pressure in the tires, and speed of the vehicle.

At about 50 miles an hour the front tires are lifted up on a tough film of water with only the touching. At 50 miles an hour the front tires lose all contact, and at 60 the front wheels can come to a complete stop.

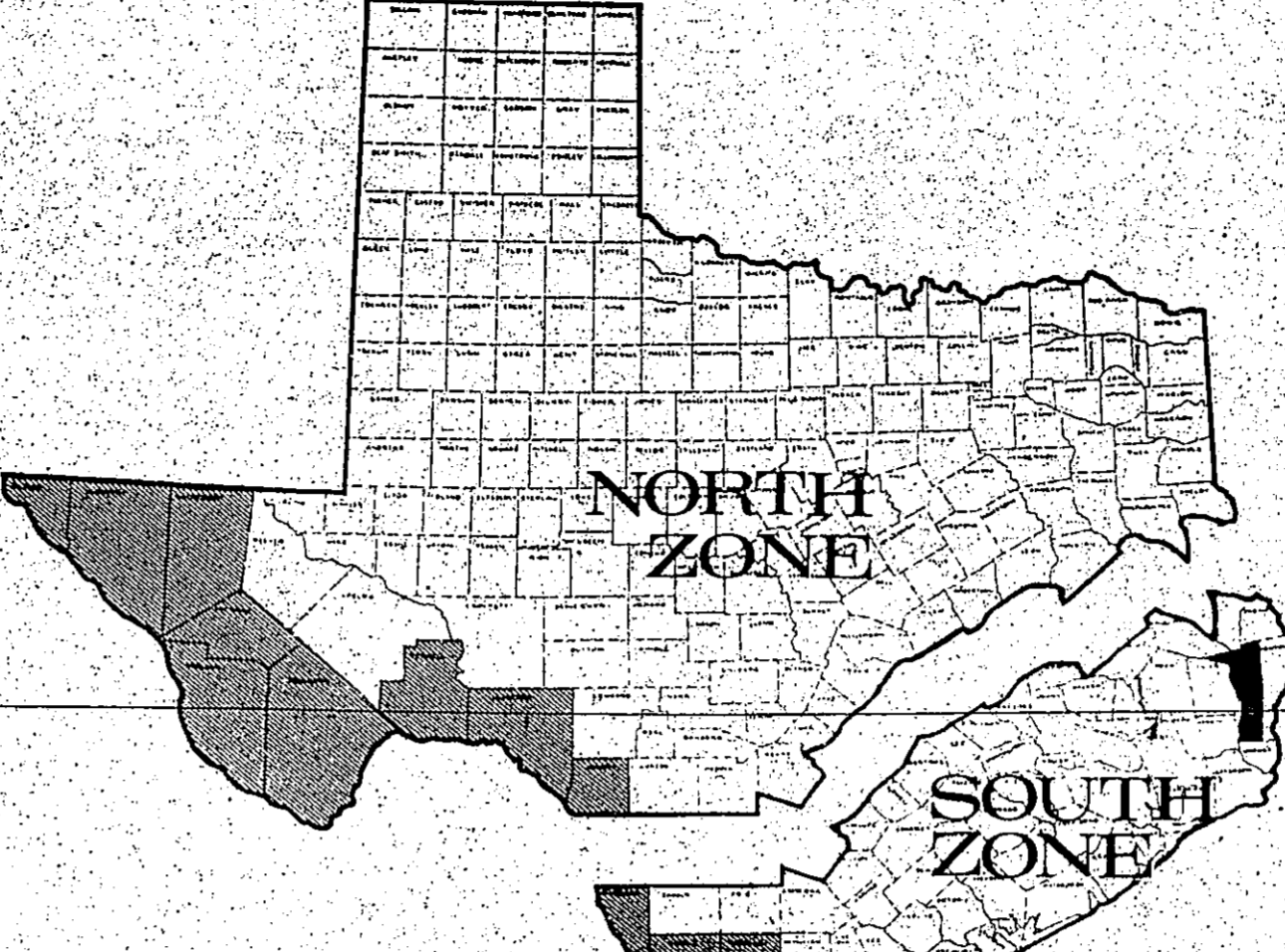

Eliminate "Spearing," Authorities Caution

CHICAGO—Football spearing should be eliminated, sports and medical authorities say. Speaking at the tactic in which a shoulder or tackle uses his head as a battering ram, it's dangerous both for himself and for the person he hits.

A group of coaches, physicians and sports officials, have petitioned the American Medical Association in calling for a ban on the "spearing" tactic, head-first tackling and for strict enforcement by officials of the college football game.

Said Notre Dame football coach Ara Parseghian: "I can't begin to tell you the number of times I have hit my head on the football field."

Dr. James H. Dwyer, M.D., chairman of the AMA Committee on Orthopedic Consultants at the University of Oregon, said: "I have seen a great many cases of skull fractures and other injuries caused by the head-first tackling tactic."

Dr. Dwyer said that the American Medical Association has already passed a resolution opposing the tactic and that it will continue to work for its elimination.

TIPS FOR FISHERMEN

BEST HOOKS ON LURES—A hook with a plain round bend is the best all-around hook for most freshwater fishing.

PROPER BASS HOOK—Every fisherman has his own opinion as to which size bass hook is the best. Each may be correct, for bass hooks vary widely in size, and each is equally successful. Bass are far from choosy and their mouths are big. Try a #0 for an all-round average size.

PLASTIC BAGS FOR FISH—After each catch, clean, wash and slip each fish in a plastic bag before leaving it on the ice in your cooler. Thus the fish will stay fresh, clean and sweet-smelling.

OVERWORKED SPINNING REEL—If your spinning reels suggest and don't work so well, look at the weight of your line. A spinning reel isn't designed to use heavy line and will balk when filled with too heavy stuff.

OVERWEIGHT BASS—When you catch a new fishing war, look for special characteristics of the fish. If the water is over-populated with bass, the fish will be smaller and more numerous. If the water is under-populated, the fish will be larger and fewer in number.

BAIT CASTING vs. SPINNING—There probably always will be arguments as to the relative merits of bait casting and spin casting. Each has its good points. Spinning takes less practice to master and makes for longer casts. But bait casting takes more skill and catches larger fish. This method is used by anglers who like to drag the lunkers out from among the weeds.

POTENT PORK RIND—In Texas, many fishermen find that pork rind makes a better fish killer than the white bait. White bait is easy to lose by soaking in several hours in a good quality fish-bait. Pork rind, on the other hand, is easy to lose by soaking in just a few hours.

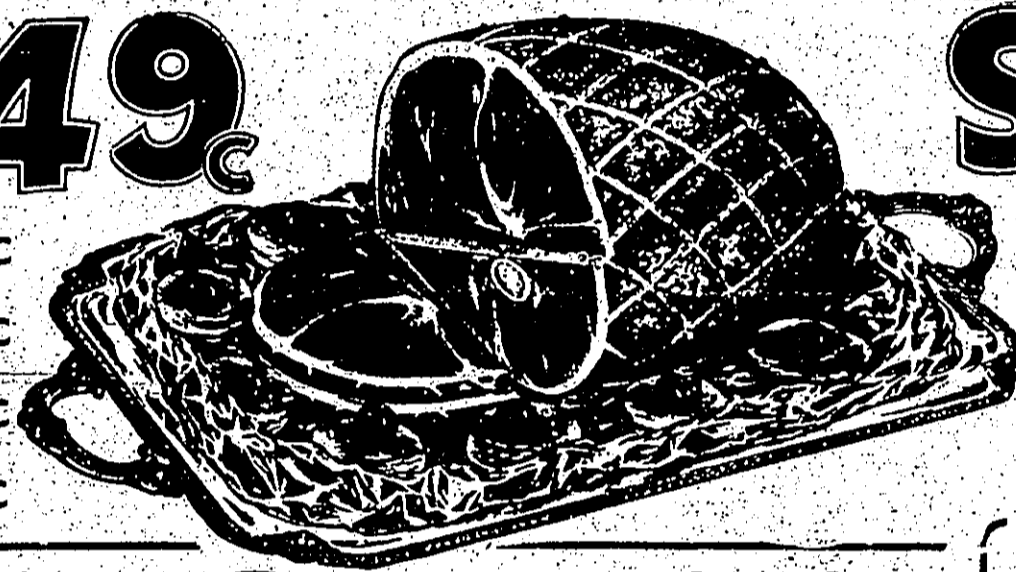
