Rotary District Leadership Forum Slated Here Today

Work Starts On Moving Radio Station KVLL Here

The Texas Highway Commission has approved the expenditure of \$450,950 for highway safety and betterment and improvement of the farm to market road system in Tyler county during 1968.

District Engineer John C. Keller of Beaumont said that a total of 37.1 highway miles in Tyler county will be involved in the annual program. Work will be under supervision of A. J. Cortez, Woodville.

The work is part of the Highway Commission's continued Farm to Market Road Improvement and State Highway Safety and Betterment Program for 1968.

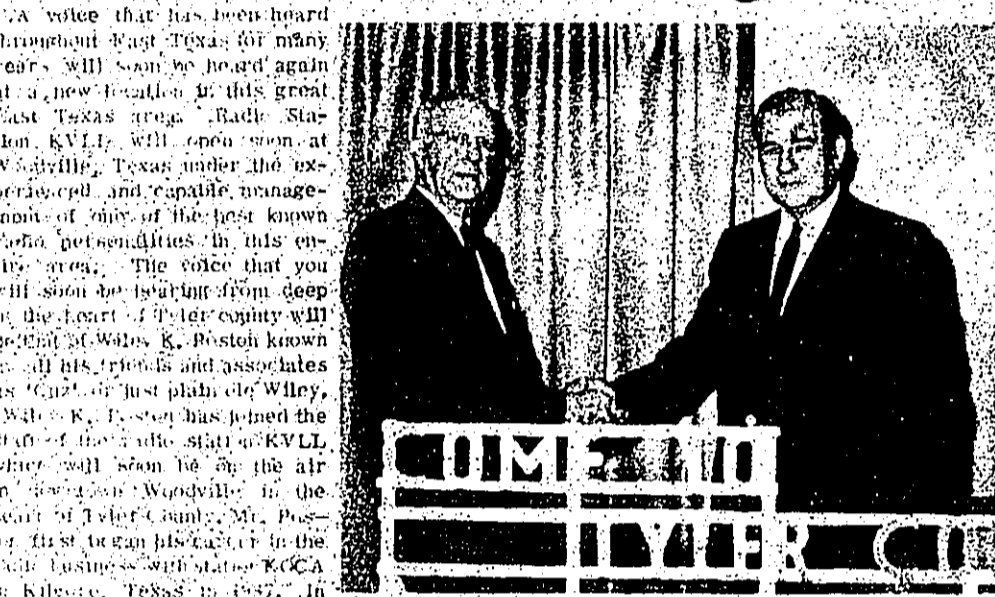
The safety and betterment portion of the program will cover 34.4 highway miles in the county at an estimated cost of \$425,800. The farm to market road improvement program will cost an estimated \$25,150 for 2.7 miles of FM roads.

State-wide the program calls for the improvement of 5,182 miles of an estimated construction cost of \$32.3 million and right of way cost of \$137.5 million. Work will include 879 projects in 212 of Texas' 254 counties. In all, 399 projects are on State and U. S. Numbered highways in 160 counties and 460 projects are on farm to market roads in 170 counties.

Types of work included by the program includes surface widening, bridge widening and replacement, base strengthening, seal coating and resurfacing and rebuilding of shoulders.

- FM 256, from US 190 south, 3.5 miles, level-up, seal, and coat, \$8,900;
- FM 1013, from Spurger east to Neches River Bridge, 5.2 miles, level up and seal coat, \$16,250; US 190, from US 69, in Woodville east to Neches River Bridge, 14.2 miles, additional surf., \$158,500;
- US 69, from Woodville south, 6.4 miles, level up and seal coat on shoulders, \$22,500;
- US 190 from Polk county line east to US 69 in Woodville, 11.2 miles, additional surf., \$111,500;
- US 69 from US 287 north, 3.1 miles, additional surf., \$26,300;
- US 69, from 1 mile south of Neches River Bridge, south, 1.3 miles const. climbing lane, \$39,000;
- US 69 from 1.8 miles south of Neches River Bridge, south, .8 of a mile const. climbing lane, \$23,000;
- US 69, from 3.5 miles south of Neches River Bridge, south, 1.4 miles const. climbing lane, \$45,000.

County Hay Show Set For October 2

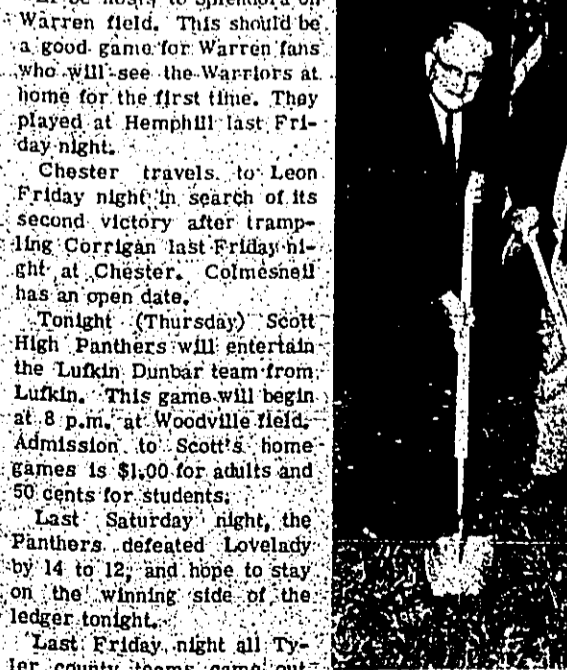
