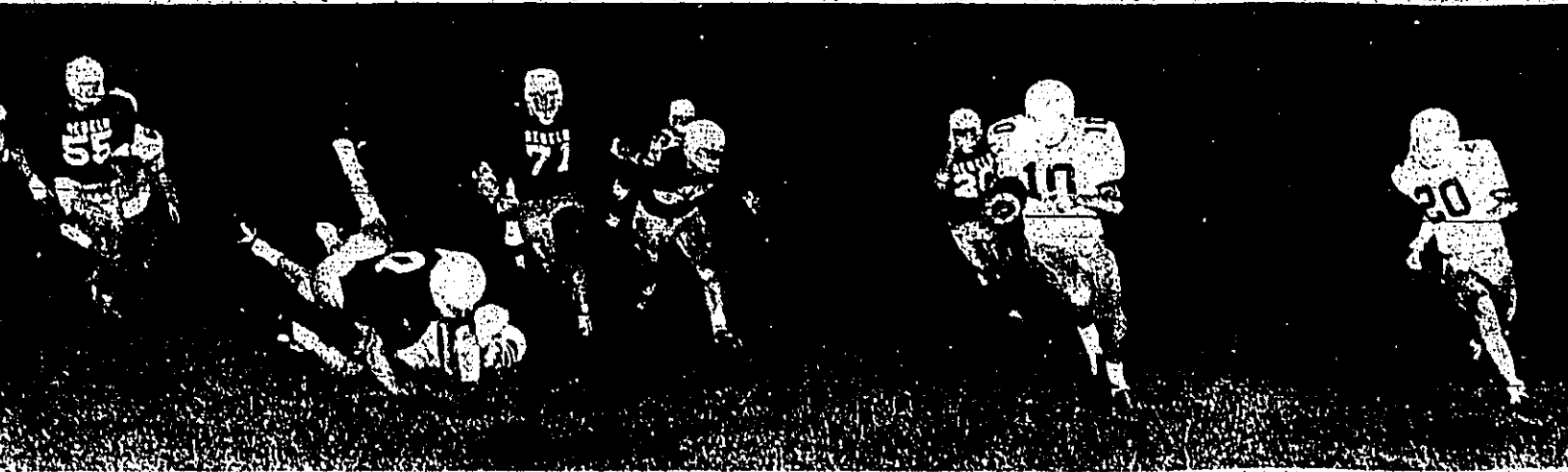

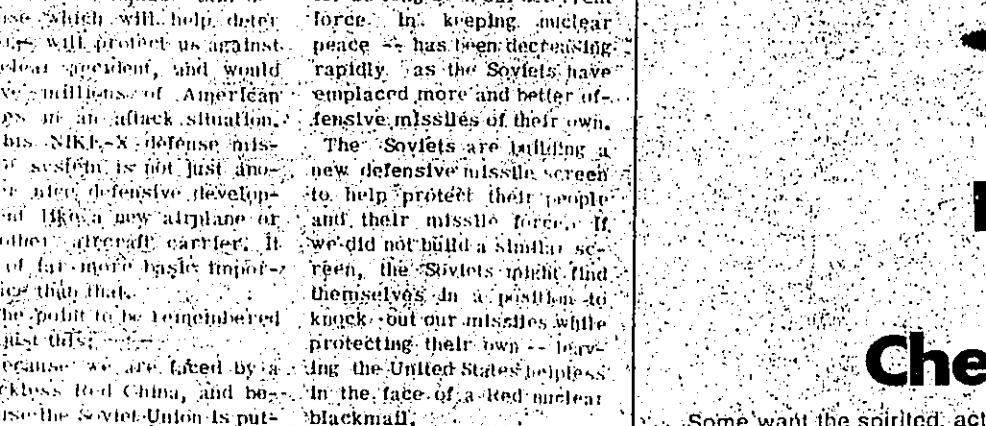

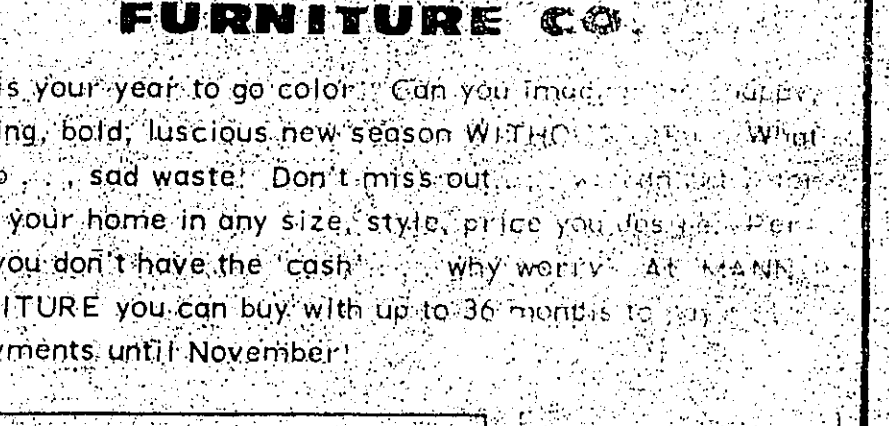

SOCIAL SECURITY QUIZ

Q-I lack two quarters of coverage to be insured for social security benefits. What is the best way to earn the necessary credits? A-You can earn quarters of coverage either as an employee or as a self-employed person. As an employee you must be paid \$50 in a calendar quarter (January-March, April-June, etc.) to earn a quarter of coverage. A self-employed person automatically earns four quarters if his net profit for the year is \$400 or more. A farmer may report self-employment income if his gross is \$600 or more even though he has a net loss.

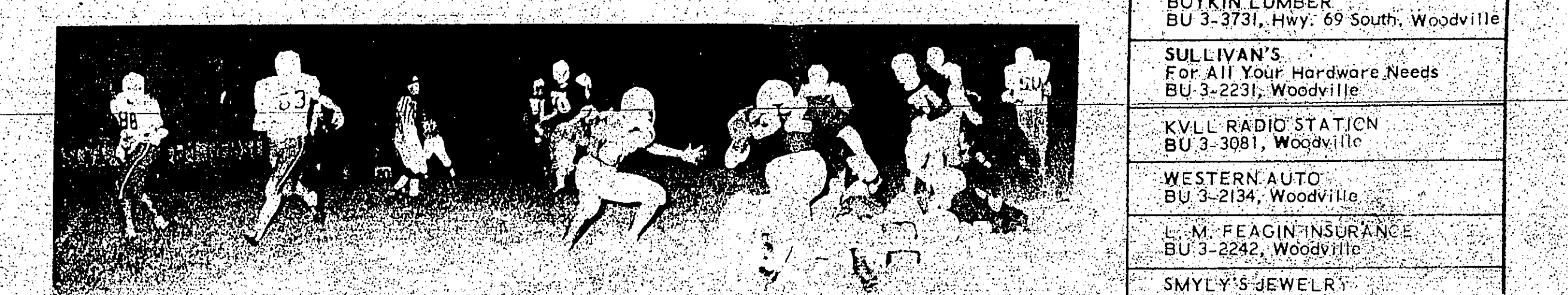
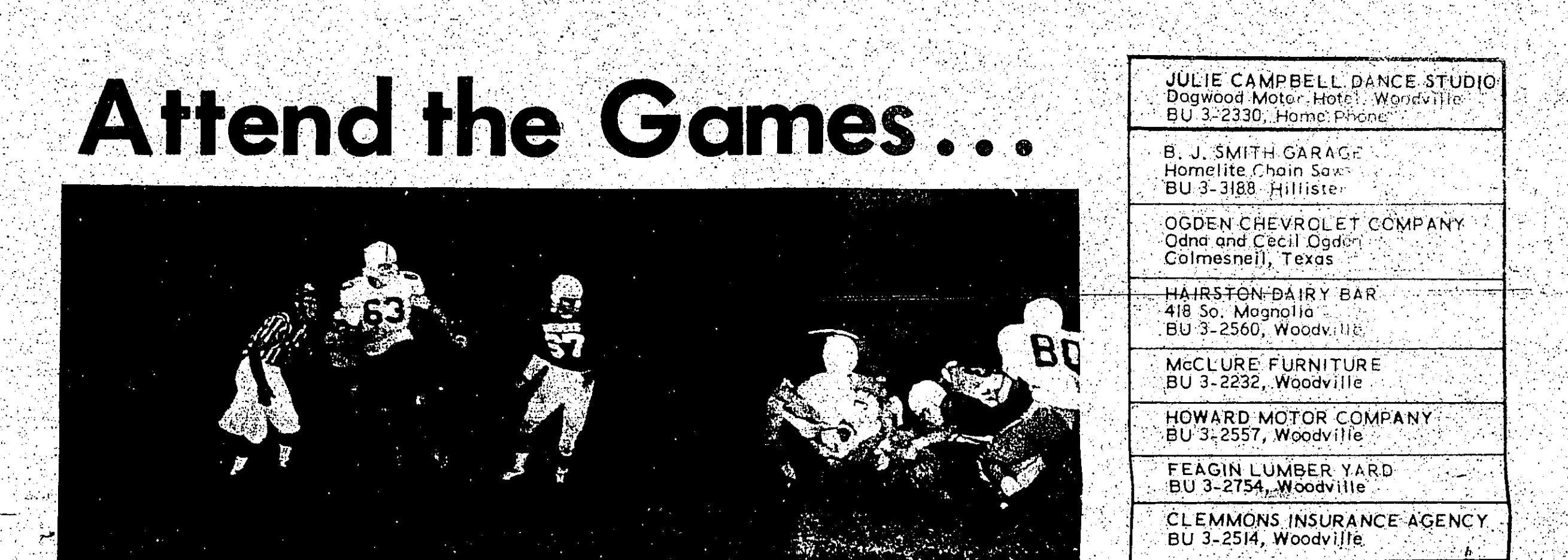
