The Woodville City Council will contract for its actual pickup and bids for this service are now being accepted with a deadline of midnight, October 31. A flat annual bid for a 10-year period is specified with residential pickups twice weekly and business pickups service flow to household for garbage disposal.

This is the same service which has been rendered by Gilbert Wright's Garbage Disposal Service for the past several years except that as a private enterprise Wright picked up his customer's business and filled their direct. Under the new ordinance, each household will be billed \$1.50 monthly for garbage service, and businesses will pay a higher rate for the increased service. The ordinance will pick up the garbage and dispose of it in a flat monthly rate.

City Secretary J. H. Kinnear said that the garbage disposal problem was getting worse and that the new ordinance was passed to give residents a better service and to help the city's financial situation.

The 4-H members have done a good job of feeding and caring of their broilers, according to Clinton Currie, county agricultural agent.

"Black Friday" Hits Football Teams

The Chester Yellow Jacks is the only football team in Tyler County which had the foresight not to have a game scheduled last Friday night. The other teams in the county all played regularly scheduled games, and lost.

Kirby High School went down 19-0 at Kirbyville, Warren lost 6-0 to Hardin at Warren, and Garrison defeated the Bulldogs at Colmesnell, 14-0. Scott High of Woodville went to Livingston Saturday night and continued the county's losing streak, 12-0. However, football fans this Friday night should see an improvement. Chester goes to High Island and should win. The Kirby High Eagles get Cracker at Kountze on the Woodville field, and this should be a humdinger. Colmesnell goes to Goodrich and Warren to West Hardin. Scott High plays Liberty Saturday night at Woodville field.

While Kirby High was having troubles at Kirbyville, other District 21-AA teams were having their own woes in other places. Rusk got a 35 to 12 thumping from Center, Dayton spanked Livingston 34 to 8, and Marlin eked by Crockett, 15 to 13.

Meanwhile, future opponents of the Eagles were mostly winning. Kountze ran up an amazing 66 points to Newton's 6 to 0 in an upset at Atahua; 7 to 0 in an upset at Kirbyville; the Eagles ran into a fired-up Wildcat eleven that held them not only scoreless but almost minus yardage. They ran up about 300 yards total while holding the Eagles to a net gain of 35 and only three first downs. At Colmesnell, the Bulldogs came out ahead in all the statistics except the score, which was 14 to 0. The Bulldogs had 14 first downs to Garrison's 12, outrushed them 220 to 187 yards, and had 42 yards through the air while holding Garrison to none.

Garrison blocked two punts and turned both into touchdowns. Otherwise the Colmesnell defense was superb with Gary Bean, Billy Self, Bobby Wilkerson, Larry Graham and Tommy Cruse all outstanding.

The Warren Warriors came out on the short end of a 6 to 0 score against Hardin, but outplayed the Hornets everywhere except on the TD end. The Hornets scored in the fourth quarter on a 50-yard drive, and the Warriors drove to the two-yard line with

less than a minute left. The game only to lose the ball on a fumble. Warren caught an amazing 205 yards, but Hardin's 81 on the ground, and outpassed them 37 to 19, but Hardin put up a stiff defense to stop the Warriors from coming inside the 10-yard line.

Meanwhile, at Kirbyville, a scabbard named Gordon Collier (No. 22) ran wild, and found the Newton Eagles' five touchdowns, some 300 yards once and 700 yards twice. Ricky Winger and Bob Holmes scored the touchdowns each, and Mike Barnett recovered one of his team's fumbles in the end zone. The other score, they just had some of the extra points, but what did it matter?

A game of great interest to local fans Friday night, in addition to the Kountze game, is the game at Crockett in which they play, coincidentally, Kirbyville. Crockett is rated as the strong team in District 21-AA and will meet Kirby High later in the season. Humble plays at Livingston and Rusk, without success, at Hemphill. Hemphill is in the Woodville schedule, and Rusk is in Woodville's district. These games will also be of interest.
