After the first of the year, there will be no renewals of licenses by mail.

Present holders of drivers' licenses do not need to go by the driver's license office until they receive a renewal card, which will be sent out as usual prior to the expiration date of the license.

## REPORT FROM DOWDY

CONFERENCE AGREES ON SOCIAL SECURITY—The House-Senate conference committee Thursday night reached an agreement on the bill amending the Social Security Act. The agreement provides for a 10 percent increase in Social Security benefits for those now on the rolls, and raises the minimum monthly benefit from \$44 to \$55. It also increases the wage base from the first \$4,000 to \$7,000, but does not change the existing tax rate schedule. It raises the amount of outside earnings that a beneficiary can receive without a reduction in benefits from \$1,500 to \$1,600. The conference report comes before both the House and Senate for vote in a few days.

FOREIGN AID APPROPRIATION BILL—The Senate has passed the appropriation bill for foreign aid, adding \$53.8 million to the amount in the House bill. The two versions will now go to a conference committee to reconcile the differences. Several of the House amendments have indicated they will stoutly insist on the House version. Every dollar the United States gives to foreign nations adds to the deficit in our international payments balance, which has become a major problem.

Getting Out on Bail  
"It's in prison now, being punished," said the Clerk to Alice on Wednesday.

It is to prevent such punishment, before bail has been established, that our system of bail is designed. The accused is given his temporary freedom, after putting up a certain sum of money to guarantee his appearance in court.

In every accused person's mind, to get out on bail is a goal.

Almost traditionally the usual exception has been in the case of a capital case where there is strong evidence of guilt. The theory is that anyone charged with a capital offense would be so frightened of punishment that he would not attempt to flee.
