## FREE BARBECUE SLATED BY DOG, WILDLIFE GROUP

Next Monday, January 1, 1968 on New Year's Day a free barbecue will be given by the Jasper, Newton, Hardin and Tyler County Dog and Wildlife Protective Association. It will be an all day affair starting at 8:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m., and the public is invited. Barbecue venison, pork and beef will be served.

The all day event will take place on the banks of the Neches River in Hardin county to celebrate the recent Tyler County District Court ruling that the roads leading to the Neches River and the banks and sandbars of the river are open to the public for public use and enjoyment. E. E. Spell announced the route to the site of the all day barbecue celebration. The road to the Neches River leads off the Silsbee-Spurger Highway (F. M. Road 92) about 10 miles north of Silsbee and a sign reading "Free Barbecue" will mark the turnout on F. M. Road 92. Other signs along the road leading to the river will mark the route to the banks of the Neches River where the all day barbecue outing will take place.

## City To Collect Garbage Charges

A residential garbage collection fee of \$1.50 will go into effect in Woodville on January 1 in accordance with an ordinance adopted by the City Council on November 27, 1967.

The charge will appear for the first time on the January statements. Garbage and refuse will be collected from all residences and places of business in the City of Woodville beginning January 1. Under the Garbage Collection Ordinance, which has been previously published in the Booster, home owners and businesses are required to place all garbage in garbage containers, having lids. That portion of the Garbage Collection Ordinance reads as follows:

Section 11. Accumulation of Garbage and Rubbish. From time to time it shall be the duty of every person, firm or corporation owning, managing, operating, leasing or renting any premises, to place all garbage, refuse, or other material in suitable receptacles...

Section 12. Maintenance of Receptacles. It shall be the duty of every person, firm or corporation owning, managing, operating, leasing or renting any premises to maintain in good order and repair any receptacles provided for the collection of garbage, refuse, or other material...

## County Has Safe Christmas; New Year Holiday Traffic Expected To Be Heavy

With a near record number of persons killed in the three-day Christmas holiday, the Department of Public Safety and the Texas Safety Association have issued appeals to motorists to drive with extreme caution during the New Year's holiday period which will begin at 6 p.m. Friday.

Motor vehicle fatalities in the period that began at 6 p.m. Friday and ended at midnight Monday, numbered 66. The total compared with 44 for a nonholiday weekend of equal three day length.

As is usual, the highway patrol will have license examiners and weight control personnel assisting the regular highway patrolmen in an effort to enforce safe driving and out the number of deaths.

## EastTex Group Loses Ruling On Trespass

Judge H. A. Coe ruled Wednesday that wardens employed by the EastTex Wildlife Association have no authority to arrest persons on public roads and on the Neches River banks in enforcing trespassing rules in land leased by the association.

The hearing was held on a case filed by the Jasper, Newton, Tyler and Hardin Dog and Wildlife Protective Association asking that the wardens of EastTex be enjoined from arresting or interfering with persons on public roads or public land, such as the river banks, in the area leased by EastTex.

Judge Coe ruled that wardens employed by the EastTex organization should refrain from interfering with persons going through the EastTex game preserve or camping or fishing on the Neches River.

The wardens, the documents revealed, have seized firearms from hunters, arrested people who were fishing or camping on the river bank and filed on persons traveling in boats on the Neches River in the game preserve area.

EastTex witness testified that roads in the game preserve have either been abandoned for public use, built by the association or by its companies and are not public thoroughfares.

Judge Coe ruled that they are not public thoroughfares.

use of roads in the game preserve or prevent persons who own property in the preserve which is not under lease to the game association, from going to their own land.

Those persons are exempt from questioning by the wardens if they are on their own land in the game preserve area and are carrying out the judge's order.

The judge said wardens are not authorized to make any kind of arrest. The others are deputy game wardens.

The land in the EastTex preserve extends through Tyler County from the Sheffield Ferry landing on the Neches River to the Evadale Bridge in Hardin County.

Testimony presented at the hearing revealed the EastTex Assn. has been attempting to keep all but members of the association off the land.

In an interview with the Klan following this presentation, a Booster reporter learned that last year's gift of needed items went to a Tyler county Negro family.

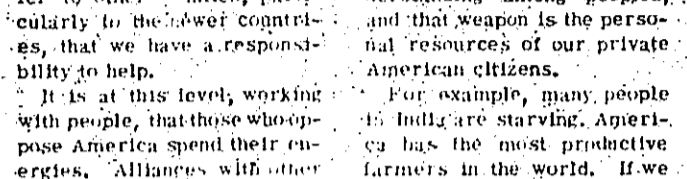
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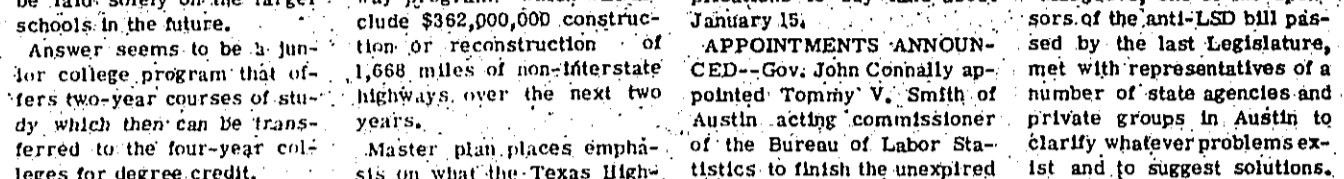
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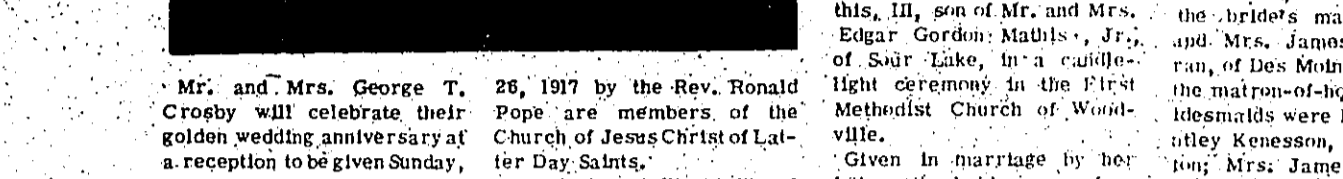
