Why Isn't Tyler County A Bonanza?

Democracy is the form of government which only exists when the governmental power is vested in and exercised by the people as a whole.

Pure democracy can only exist in small communities as it involves the assembling of the people in the whole to make laws.

In larger cities pure democracy is inconvenient and their form of democracy is called representative democracy.

Mr. Webster declines democracy as "government by the people."

Speech is made up of words and is the only way in which we try to reveal the thoughts in our minds. What does democracy mean to you?

Does it mean to you that all truths are self evident; that all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their creator with certain inalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness; that to secure these rights governments are instituted among men deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed?

Power and riches are not in the reach of us all but honesty, truth and straight forwardness are. Do you believe that these doctrines gives us all these rights without any effort on our part? That the only way to preserve democracy is to be a good American citizen. You will also find that this will be one of the hardest tasks you have ever undertaken and requires a lifetime to complete. That all men are created equal.

Do you believe that certain individuals, groups and power trusts are entitled to privileges when their lobbyist obtain gain and material advantages that all citizens and fellow Americans cannot benefit from? That we, every person must bear the burdens of our government and he who does not wish to, or avoids his share and part of these burdens is not worth of the blessings of being an American.

When you say "my life is about over and I do not have more

to contribute to the world and democracy let the younger generation take over", how sad. Life is a journey that never ends and is not satisfactory or rewarding if we have not prepared our younger generation by precept and example that it is they who must keep our city, state and country free in fact as well as in name, and to do all in their power to keep our national life free from political, commercial and social corruption and most of all it is a great honor to serve our country. It is a sacred trust to be an American and to be worthy of that name.

Do you believe that liberty and freedom give you the right to curl up in your shell and snarl at the world, it does give you freedom to get up and do something constructive or do you believe freedom is just a word to make excuses with or place the blame on others.

Only a Christian freedom can survive the ravages of time, that freedom must be led by the spirit of God and never to be used as an opportunity of the flesh. Freedom and liberty always entail grave and great responsibilities.

The principals of Jefferson, Lincoln and Jackson were so similar. They believed that the heart and soul of every government by the people and for the people is the life blood which courses through the arteries of liberty and justice and makes an all powerful agency in the mighty work of lifting mankind to Godward.

We are given the rights to the pursuit of happiness. No democracy can guarantee happiness. To attain happiness and keep it is our problem. Just remember you can not pursue happiness and catch it.

Happiness does not depend on what happens outside of you but what happens inside of you. It is measured by the spirit and how you meet the problems of life. Happiness is Divine. We, the Residents of Tyler County are given a privilege that many do not have. We can have a pure democracy if we act in the best interests of our country, state and county but to attain this pure democ-

cracy every person must participate and make sacrifices. We must think for ourselves. We must not take the opinion of others. We must find the answers ourselves. We must vote for the candidate who is best qualified, not because he is our friend or our kid-dink or that he has given us certain promises. Perhaps we are told he can make our lot in life easier. Hear voters, our government for the people and by the people can not afford to make our life easier when it is in a struggle to preserve democracy. It is time that we the people do some giving instead of receiving, true democracy works both ways.

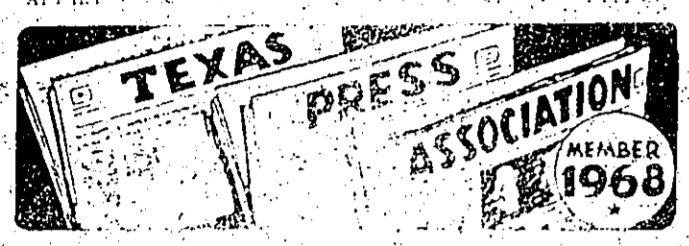

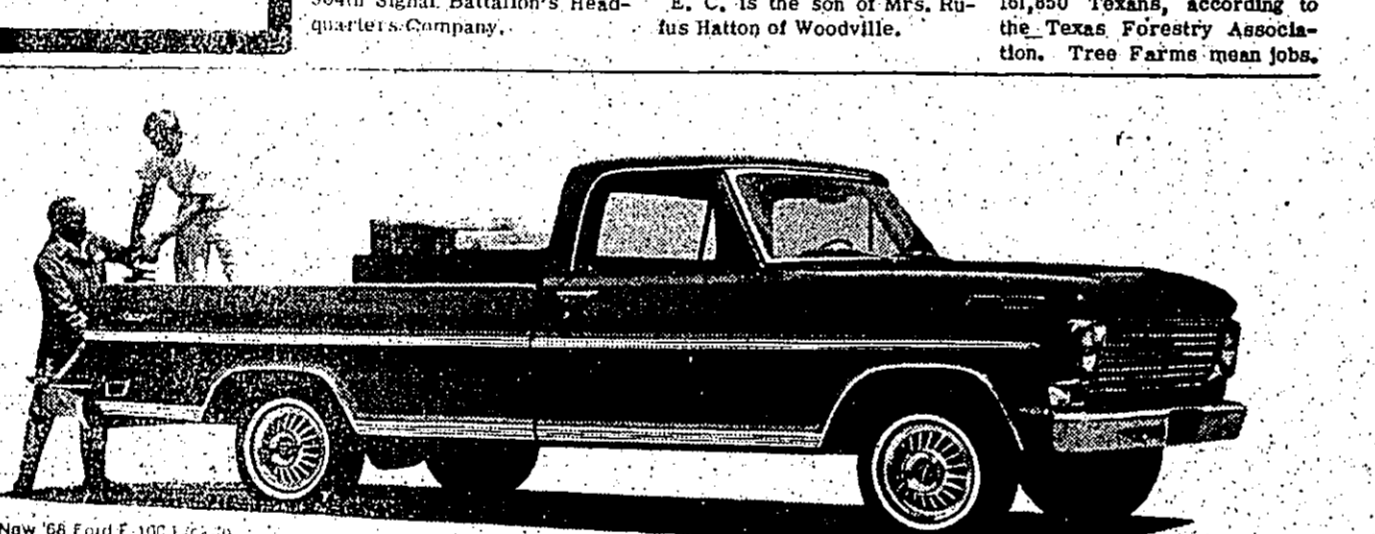

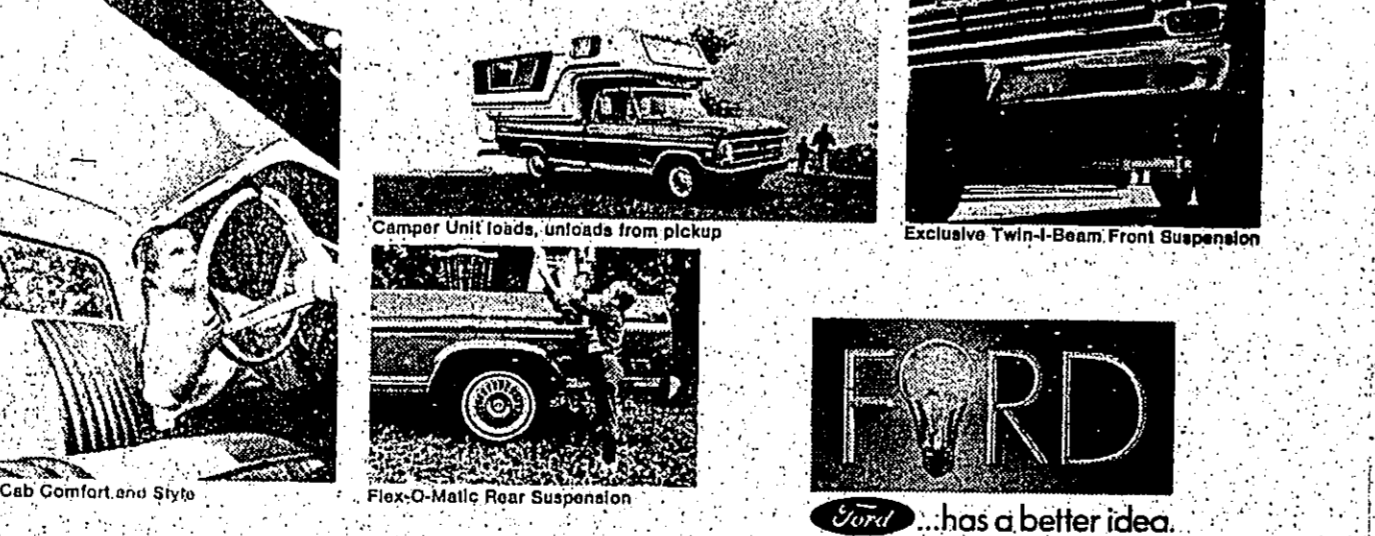
