Miss Dell Jordan, a Spurger High School junior, was crowned queen of the 1968 Tyler County Dogwood Festival Saturday night by Ben Barnes, speaker of the Texas House of Representatives.

Reigning with Miss Jordan is Rusty Roberts, also of Spurger.

Miss Dianna Franks of Chester was named Princess of Tyler County, runner-up to the queen in the judging by the Kings Men. Her escort was John C. Handley of Chester.

Miss Jordan is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. T. A. Jordan. She is active in 4-H club work and is an officer in the Tyler County 4-H Club Council. She is a member of the Future Homemakers of America and is a delegate to the coming state FHA convention. She has lettered in basketball two years and is a class officer.

Miss Franks is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Bryan of Chester. She is president of the Future Homemakers Club, the National Beta Club, is class favorite and head cheerleader. She is editor of the school annual, voted the most likely to succeed, the most beautiful, and is also basket-

ball sweetheart.

Other princesses in the court and their escorts were Miss Sheila Benton of Colmesnell with Elmer Troy Blakeney; Miss Virginia Davis of Warren with Benny Rainier; and Miss Roschelle Durham of Woodville with Jerry Springfield.

THOUSANDS SEE PARADE AND CORONATION

It was Dogwood Time in Tyler County Saturday, and the annual affair was one of the most outstanding in its 25 year history.

The mile long parade of floats, convertibles with the 34 pretty duchesses, the queen's float with reigning queen Jeanette McClure and the five princesses, the bands, the commercial entities, and all the others wound its way through downtown Woodville on a perfect Spring afternoon and was viewed by a crowd estimated at 15,000 persons.

The coronation ceremonies and the pageant Saturday night was seen by a sell-out crowd that jammed the 3500 seat outdoor amphitheatre, again in perfect Spring weather.

The spectacular throne area was centered with a huge golden tiara 5 feet in diameter and studded with larger ruby-like jewels. The throne was 18 feet from the dais with the backdrop draped in red and gold. Flanking the throne area on each side and at graduated heights were three golden urns filled with large red roses.

More than a hundred thousand handmade paper blossoms of dogwoods, azaleas, magnolias and other East Texas flowers were mounted and used in the decorations of the big stage.

Girls of the court, with arm-baskets filled with spring flowers, entered from the handsome two-story, townstone house typical of the 1920s.

Joshua Wheat gave the welcome while speaking for his 81-year-old father, Judge J. E. Wheat, founder and president of the festival, who has always announced "It's Dogwood Time in Tyler County."

The Melody Mads of Beaumont, directed by Mrs. Eloise Milam, and the Bob Smith Orchestra of Houston gave the prelude music. Al Sacker of Beaumont was organist.

Mrs. Melvin D. Houston, Woodville teacher, sang "Trees," a song always used on the festival program.

The 1967 queen, Miss Jeanette McClure, made a brief farewell address. O. R. Crawford of Jasper, Mr. East Texas of 1967, presented Glenn E. Richard of Beaumont, Mr. East Texas of 1968, Charles Beard sang "Beautiful Lady" as a tribute to the queen.

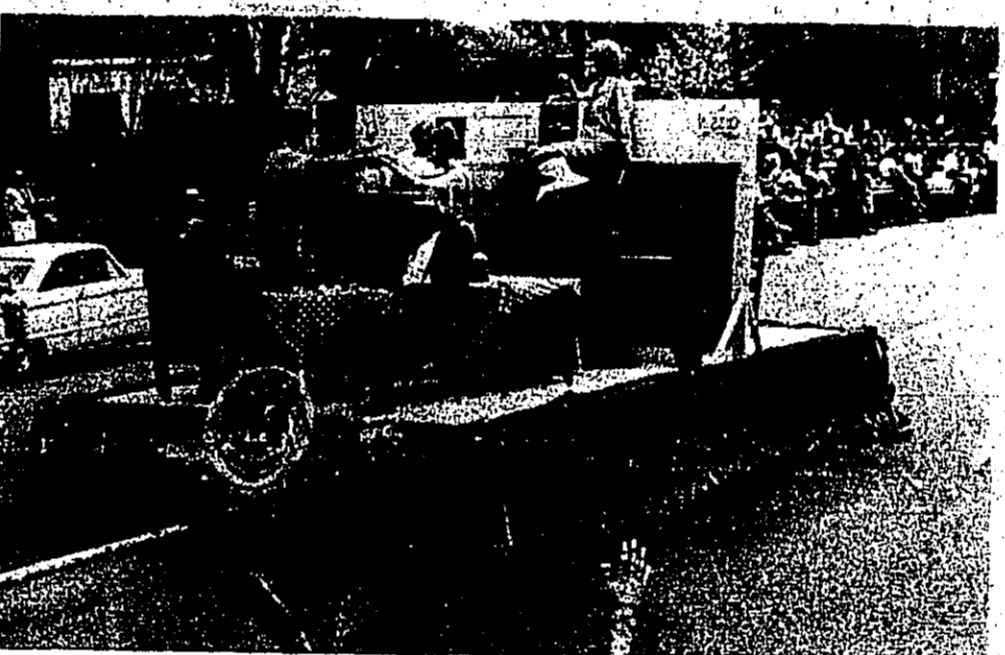
Tickets will be sold by Kirby High Future Homemakers. The tickets will be \$1.00 for adults and 50 cents for students.

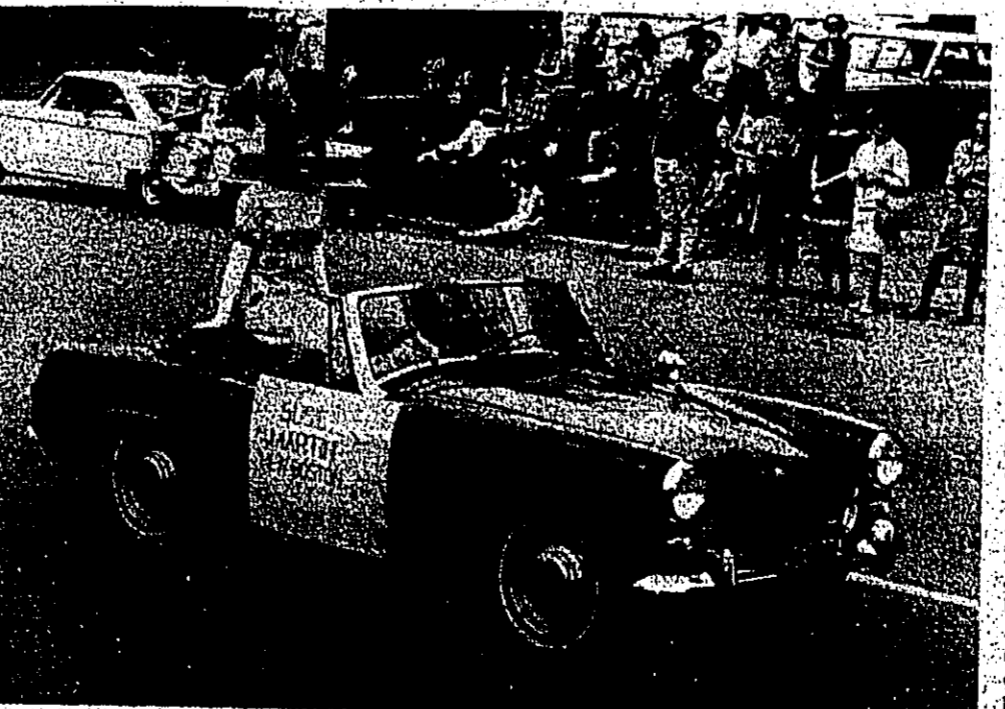


Front view of Lions Club's float which won first prize in parade

Groundbreaking For Nursing Center Saturday

Groundbreaking ceremonies for the Woodville Nursing Center, on which construction has started on North Wood Street, will be held Saturday at 10:00 a.m., according to John Ketcher, secretary-treasurer of the organization.

Principal speaker will be U.S. Rep. John Downer, County Judge Jeff R. Adams will serve as master of ceremonies.

Others on the program include Dr. Raymond Parker, who will give the invocation; Major W. Gassiot, Cecil Smith and hospital board members; M. F. Alford, chamber of commerce president; and the Rev. Ray Bynum, who will give the benediction.

The three extensive care nursing center will be built on ground just west of the Tyler County Hospital. Besides Karcher, other officers of Woodville Nursing Center are Dr. Rider Stockdale, president; Clench McMillan, vice president; and Rev. Clay Bess, staff president.

District One-Act Play Contest Set At KHS Tonight

In the district one-act play contests tonight at 7 p.m. in the Kirby High Auditorium one of the night's competitive events of University Interscholastic League is being entered by Woodville. Crockett, Livingston and Risk. The four plays to be presented in contest are in their order of presentation: "Anastasia - Rehearsal Scene," "Crockett," "Trifling Risk," "Our Hundred Nights of Woodville" and the "Seafarer," Livingston.

Woodville's entry, "Our Hundred Nights," written by Jack Knapp, is the story of a famous actor who, on the fourth night of his appearance as Othello, murders his leaving lady. The main point for the defense is that the actor committed the murder not as himself but as Othello, and thus cannot be charged with murder. The climax of the play is the presentation to the court of the death scene from Othello in order to prove the point the defense is trying to make. The audience has an unusual opportunity for participation in this play in that it serves as the jury.

Starting in the Kirby High School production are Joseph Cordero, playing the dual role of William Moreland and Othello; Cecile Fortensberry, playing the dual role of Dawn Lew Moreland and Desdemona; Mike Parker as the lawyer for the defense; Billy Job as the prosecuting attorney; Mike Surrock as the judge; Butch Hudnall, the court clerk; Cathy Robinson, the court stenographer; Beth McGee and Carmen Cordero, witnesses. Make-up artists are Janelle Maxey and Shawnette Bird, and in charge of lights and sound is Susan McCulley.

The public is urged to attend this contest, for which a small admission price of 25¢ and 50¢ is charged. Those attending are reminded, however, that UIL rules prohibit entry into the auditorium during the actual performance of any of the plays.

SFA Students Teach At KHS

It will be built of stripped brick with an area of 14,000 square feet so planned that additions can be made later when needed. It will have complete medical examination facilities, a chapel, a spacious lobby with television.

The Pine Hills development will have a golf course, recreational building, swimming pool, and other facilities for the family.

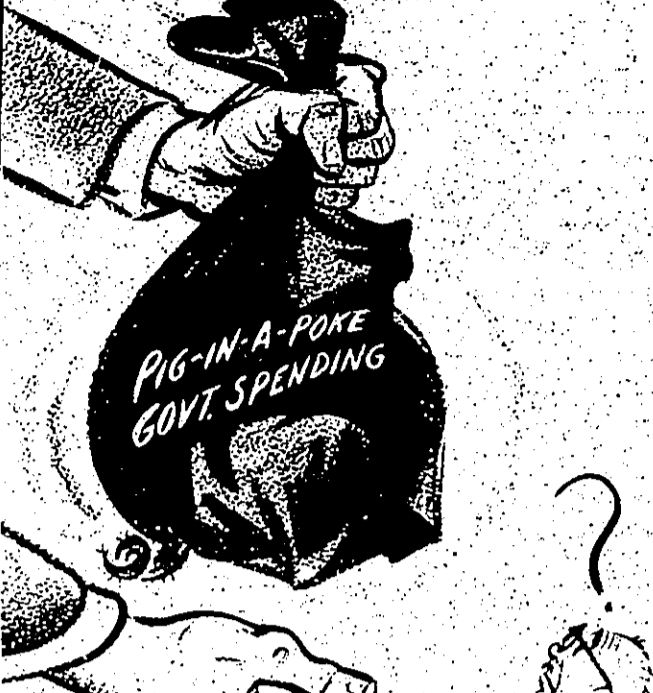
