County Agent Reports

Hay supplies were tight at the end of the current winter season and now is the time to make sure the same situation doesn't happen again.

But, moisture alone will not do the job. For top yields of high quality, adequate fertilization is a must. He suggests a soil test as a guide to proper fertilization. Don't expect high quality forage nor good growth rates from hay crops with lack adequate food.

The timing of harvest is also important in the production of quality forage. Quality goes down rapidly, as hay crops reach the mature stage of growth. Bermudagrass should be harvested after about four weeks of growth.

Research has shown that the performance of animals receiving the hay is directly influenced by its quality. High animal performance comes from feeding high quality hay.

Approximately 162 Texas counties are importers of hay; 15 to 20 counties are exporters and the remaining counties produce about enough hay to take care of the local needs.

Winged termites are a definite sign of an infestation somewhere, but it may not necessarily mean that damage is being done. These wood infesting insects are capable of flying some distances and could be coming from surrounding infested structures, or other wood in the soil.

However, the homeowner should keep a watchful eye for signs of possible termite infestation. Look for detached wings. They break off soon after swarming takes place and are usually present in swarming areas. Another important sign of termite infestation

These are garden termites runways built by termites on foundation walls, and are used as passageways to the wooden floor joists, protection against natural enemies and as a moisture conserving device. Check the foundation walls, both inside and out and particularly in the areas adjacent to bathrooms and kitchens where possible water leaks have occurred. Special attention should also be paid in areas around arborvitae-filled or wooden deck porches.

When fertilizing, only the recommended amount of fertilizer should be applied. The addition of extra amounts of fertilizer can upset the balance of nutrients in the soil and may cause damage to the plants. A good soaking is better than shallow watering.

Don't try to grow too many plants in one area. It is much more attractive and productive to grow only the number of plants you can care for with a minimum of work. And maybe you can be a "green thumb" gardener.

Plants should be checked often for signs of insect damage. Suspecting insects such as aphids, thrips, and other "chaps", will cause yellowing, stunting, wilting, and under severe infestation may cause death. Should the population of sucking insects become too serious either isolation or malathion can be used effectively.

Check the leaves, stems, and fruits indicate that chering insects have been seen. Thistles, grasshoppers, and caterpillars are the most common pests of this type. Carbaryl (sevin), DDT, malathion, methidathion, and cyfluthrin are good controls for chewing insects.

Frank can also be problematic around the home and garden. Anti-dione (PM) and malathion are recommended for control of cockroaches. Neomolins can also cause trouble on ornamental plants. Neomolins, Killy's and Pinesol are good controls for mosquitoes.

When treating for any of the above insects or pests it is important to remember that malathion is not thorough and based on the symptoms could also

On civil rights he insists there is no room in Texas for second class citizens. With equal rights and equal opportunities, he adds, the minorities will realize there must be equal responsibilities.

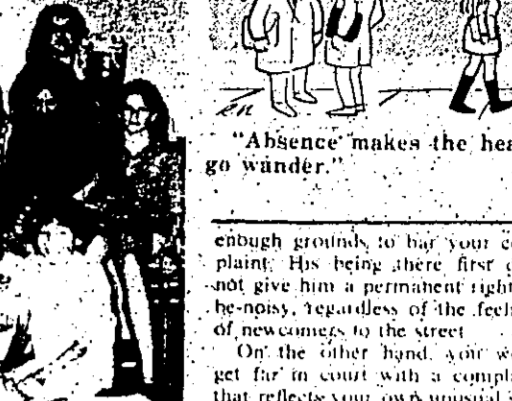
