### City Residents Reminded Of Garbage Rules

Woodville residents are required by the city garbage collection ordinance to have proper and sufficient garbage cans for their service, the city office reminded everyone this week.

Section 2 of the garbage ordinance "requires every person, firm or corporation to maintain in good order and repair a garbage can having a capacity of not less than 20 nor more than 32 gallons which shall have a tight fitting lid," and they must also furnish enough garbage cans to accommodate and securely keep all the garbage and rubbish that may accumulate between collections.

In other words, you must provide enough garbage cans to hold all of your garbage, and each must provide enough garbage cans to hold all of your garbage, and each can must be between 20 and 32 gallons in capacity and have a tight fitting lid with handles on each side.

The ordinance goes on to require that the garbage containers be kept "clean and free from accumulation of any substance remaining attached to the inside of the container which would attract or breed flies, mosquitoes or any other insects."

To be assured of pickup service, business firms should have their garbage out for 6:00 a.m. service, and all residence garbage containers are required to be available for 7:00 a.m. service.

Saturday's Democratic runoff primary will determine two county office, the state representative and the governor nominees.

In the two county races and the state representative contest, the Democratic nomination will be tantamount to election since there is no opposition from the Republican party.

However, in the governor's race the Democratic nominee will have to face a Republican in the General Election in November.

The purely local runoff contests are for sheriff and tax assessor-collector of Tyler County. In the sheriff's race, Grady Ray and Lewis E. Craven were the top men in the first primary. The tax assessor-collector contest is between A. L. Thornton and Tom Sawyer.

State Representative J. E. Miller, Jr. is facing Don Adams in the runoff in the four counties comprising the seventh district, which is made up of Tyler, Jasper, Newton and Hardin counties.

And of course, Tyler County voters will have a small say in the state-wide contest for the Democratic nomination for governor between Preston Smith and Don Yarbrough.

Tyler County, with 5241 registered voters, had a turnout of nearly 3500 in the first primary. How many will vote Saturday is a matter of conjecture, although indications are that the total number may not fall off sharply as it sometimes does in the runoff primary.

The large number of absentee voters may indicate a good turnout, although it may be that persons going on trips following the end of the school term and during the Memorial Day holiday may have been a factor in the absentee balloting being heavier than for the first primary.

In any event, voters are urged to cast a ballot to help decide the various runoff contests. A small turnout could result in the election of one of the candidates not favored by the majority of voters.

In Tyler County, both candidates for sheriff and both candidates for tax assessor have urged a large turnout and have tried to keep the voters interested enough to cast a ballot. The county's turnout May 4 was around 65 percent of those eligible to vote while the state as a whole had less than 50 percent of those registered taking the trouble to go to the polls.

The Booster and Radio Station KVLL will have a post-election party in front of the Booster office again Saturday night. A large crowd attended the May 4 party and another good crowd is expected Saturday night to see and hear the results from the various precincts as they come in and are posted on the big bulletin board.

Statewide results from the Associated Press on the governor's race will also be announced and posted as they come in.

### Recount Completed In D. A. Race

Both the Tyler County and the Hardin County Democratic executive committees completed recounts last week in the race for district attorney of the 88th district between R. A. Richardson and Stanley Coe.

The recount was asked by Richardson, who lost in the two-county race by less than 200 votes. A four-vote error was found in the Tyler County returns and about 30 in Hardin county, but these did not alter the result of the ballot.

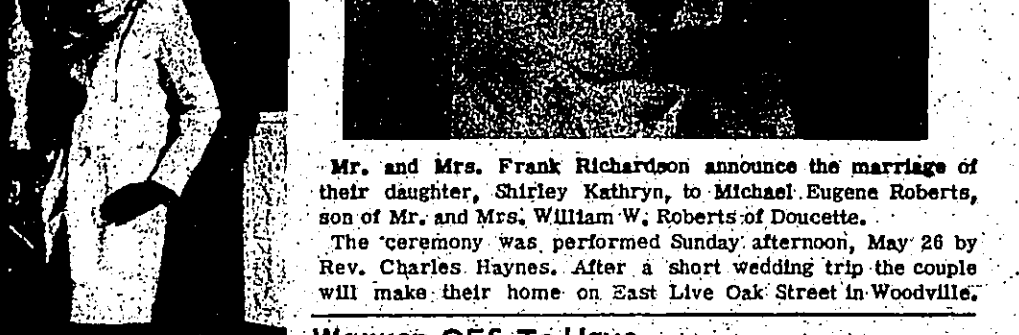

# STATE CAPITOL HIGHLIGHTS & SIDELIGHTS

Your Capitol is bursting with life on the eve of the most important political and governmental event in the June 1 runoff election, the June 4 beginning of a special session of the Legislature, and the June 11 conventions of State Democratic and Republican parties.

Although there are 15 runoff legislative races to be decided Saturday, the main body of course, is that between Lt. Gov. Preston Smith and Governor Attorney Don Yarborough. Probably no more than a million voters will decide whether the Democratic nominee for governor.

Each is reaching for the other's voter potential. Smith boasts of his 18 years' governmental experience. Yarborough, without governmental experience, urges his "fresh approach" and "constructive programs," including lower auto insurance rates and consumer protection.

Even name identification is usually considered the wellspring of political success -- not by the electoral college between the two. Both men have been in statewide races nearly a decade and are well-known names on the ballot.

Incidentally, the winner may find surprisingly tough opposition in November.

And the candidates who will hold their convention in Corpus Christi on June 11, doubtless will pick U.S. Sen. John Tower as their gubernatorial GOP Chairman Peter O'Donnell of Dallas, and other southern GOP chairmen, met in New Orleans with hopes of Gov. Ronald Reagan and Gov. Nelson Rockefeller. But O'Donnell is second-in-line to Governor.

Senator Tower will be conferred with Richard Nixon, and considered a possible opponent in November.

This is because "name" carries a lot of weight differently from these races.

Many eyes will be on the races between Sen. Bruce Reagan and Rep. Ronald Briggance of Corpus Christi, for the State Senate seat for that area. Rep. John F. Blaine versus Ramon Ramos of El Paso; Rep. J. E. Miller of Burlesville versus Ben Adams, Rep. Bob Hendricks versus former Rep. Bill Duncan of McLennan.

Other runoff legislative races are getting in local races where incumbents lost altogether or were not running for re-election.

**LIQUOR LEGISLATION DUE**--Gov. John Connally's June 4 special session of the Legislature almost certainly will come to grips with important liquor legislation, probably including a mixed-drink bill.

A House study committee's report on how to improve present statutes has been presented before the special session begins. Rep. R. H. Cory of Victoria, chairman of the panel, and House Speaker Ben Barnes have indicated the report will contain major, controversial recommendations.

Results of the investigation made by Atty. Gen. Crawford Martin -- and his recommendations also are due by June 4.

## Income Tax Quiz

Q-1 I have an extension until the middle of June to file my return as the result of illness. Is it true I'll have to pay interest on my taxes when I do file?

A--Yes, interest at the rate of six percent a year must be added to taxes that are not paid in full by the filing deadline. This interest must be paid even though a taxpayer has received an extension of time to file his return.

Q-2 I made a mistake on my return which led me to overstate my income by several hundred dollars. Can I file for a refund on this even though I have not received the refund I requested on my original return?

A--Yes, you can correct this filing error now even though the refund on your original return has not arrived. Obtain a copy of Form 1040X from your local IRS office and follow the instructions on this form for correcting your mistake. You will receive a separate refund for the difference between your original refund claim and the corrected claim.

## TOWER REPORTS

BY U. S. SEN. JOHN TOWER

It has been some time since I have discussed the relations of the United States with the Soviet Union. Perhaps that is because we have been preoccupied in the foreign sphere with Vietnam where the influx of Soviet arms and equipment makes it very clear that our two nations are in direct opposition.

Also, it is clear to those of us on the Armed Services Committee that the Soviet Union's continuing buildup of sea and missile strength represents a threat and challenge to the United States' worldwide defensive posture.

There has been some talk around the world in the last year or so to the effect that the policies and aims of the Soviet Union have changed under its new leaders. Some diplomats on both sides of the Atlantic have claimed that they see evidence the Soviets are turning 180 degrees to policy of seeking peace with the United States. But what we must recognize is that the change is one of the head and not of the heart. -- of necessity, not choice.

The Soviet leaders today have three major foreign objectives, as I see it.

They are still Communists, and they are committed to the goal of a Communist world. They are battling the Chinese for leadership of that world. They want to achieve that goal without war. At the same time, they want more economic progress at home. They will work with us only when doing so serves one or more of these three objectives.

In the light of this analysis, the policy America should follow becomes, it seems to me, clear.

Initially, we must recognize that we have not had a world war for twenty years because of America's clear military superiority. That superiority is now threatened, both because of Soviet progress in missile development and because of an attitude in U. S. policy circles that nuclear parity with the Soviet is enough. Because the primary Soviet goal is still victory rather than peace, we must never let the day come in a confrontation like Cuba and the Middle East where they, rather than we, have military superiority. The cost of maintaining that superiority, including the development of an anti-missile capability, is a necessary investment in peace.

## OUTDOORS IN TEXAS

Many people have the misconception that the only way to catch panfish--sunfish (perch), crappies, etc.--is with natural baits, like earthworms and crickets.

Normally bait of this type will catch the most panfish, but usually artificial lures will take larger ones. Lake Marble Falls, located almost downtown in the community of Marble Falls in central Texas, holds an astronomical number of sunfish. But a fisherman using earthworms will more often than not, catch only a batch of little ones. These eager, speedy, small fish beat the bigger ones to the bait.

Next time out, try some of those tiny spinners, bugs and flies. They are more effective in taking the larger fish.

There are two facts to consider when after sunfish with artificials. Use a small bait and fish slowly. The smaller the artificial, the more effective it will be. And whether it is a surface or an underwater lure, retrieve as slowly as possible.

For fun at its best, the sunfish should be taken on light tackle, something like a fly rod or an ultra-light spinning outfit.

Dick Brown, publisher of the Austin American-Statesman, likes to cast for so-called stream on Lake Austin, using a seven-foot fly rod that weighs less than three ounces. He says even a hand-sized fish fights like a big one on this dainty tackle.

Topwater lugs or flies on a fly rod are also effective. Most important, use a small bait. About a No. 10 bug is best. The smaller bug will tempt many more strikes than a large one. Any tiny fly is okay, with standard colors of black, yellow and white producing best.

With a pop, just barely wiggle it on the surface. Don't pull with enough force to bog it. Pull the fly through the water in short, slow pulls. Sometimes a tiny spinner attached to the front of the fly will add the flash that attracts more strikes.

Also very effective is the ultra-light spinning outfit with the miniature lures designed for such tackle. A tiny spinner is best. A typical one will be less than an inch long with about a No. 10 treble hook.

Reel the spinner just fast enough that the blade spins; the slower you retrieve, the more strikes you'll get.

Sunfish seem to prefer bright colors like yellow with black dots, or orange with black dots.

With the fly rod or spinning outfit, the angler can cover much more water than he can while fishing with natural bait, and by exposing his offering to more fish, he naturally stands a better chance of catching more.

While most crappies are taken on live minnows, there actually are times when a tiny white jig will take more and bigger fish. This is particularly true in the springtime, when the fish are in the shoreline shallows to spawn. But sometimes it is also true when the fish are deep, near the bottom. I remember a time on Lake Falcon in southern Texas when the crappies were in the 10 to 15 foot range. A tiny white jig hopped around the base of the submerged brush would prompt a strike.

To be effective, the jig must be small. One weighing about 3 fish, or an ounce is the best size. Probably the best known make is the Flie-Fly, less than two inches long, made in Oklahoma.

Usually the best retrieve is to simply cast the jig and allow it to sink to bottom near submerged brush or trees, then reel in slowly and steadily. There may be times when you have to twitch the rod tip ever so lightly to get the action that brings strikes.

If you can't adequately cast such a small bait, rig a pair up in tandem, one on the end of the line and another on a dropper line about 18 inches above this one. When the crappies are cooperative, it isn't uncommon to catch 'em two at a time.

# Toledo Bend Hits 172 Foot Mark

The Deep East Texas Development Association in a report that the elevation of Toledo Bend Reservoir is now 172.00 feet. 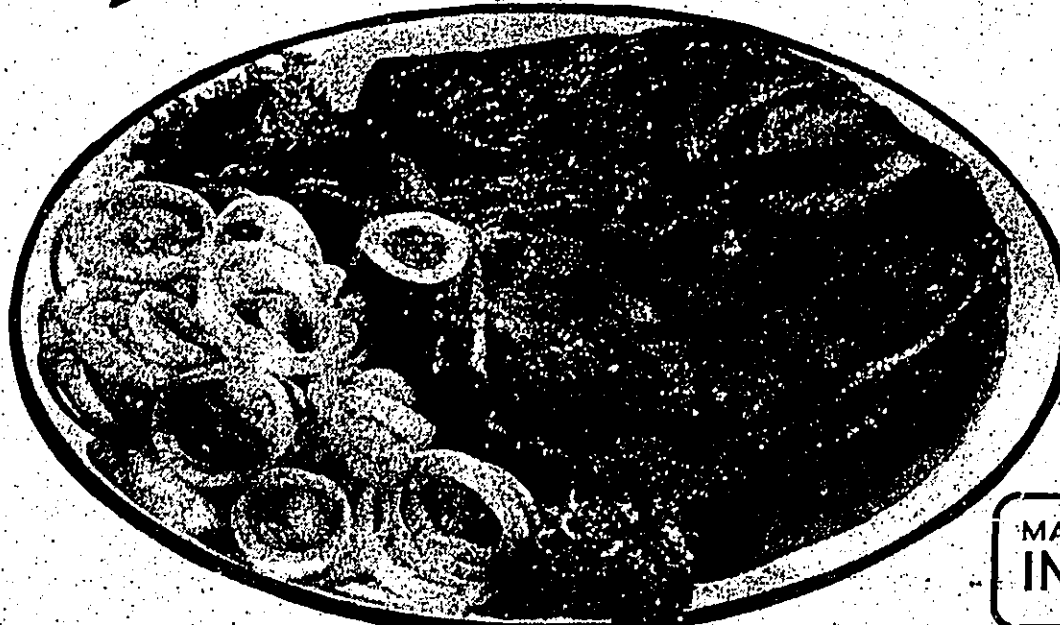
