The four Tyler County football teams and 1,003 others across the state are holding daily practice sessions in preparation for the coming football season. The four Tyler County teams are in Class AA, A and B, and began practice earlier than the Triple and Four A teams, who just got started this week. In Woodville, Coach Charlie McGinty's Eagles are working twice-daily to prepare for their opening game against Center September 13 on the Woodville field.

### Vicious Turtle Snagged On Hook



The driver of a lumber truck was crushed to death Tuesday about 8:00 p.m. when his truck went out of control about 1.5 miles south of Chester on U. S. 287 and flipped over. George Wiley Kessner, 53, of Waco, driver for Aaron and Kimball Lumber Company, also of Waco, was pronounced dead at the scene by Precinct Two Justice of the Peace Clarence Woodrome of Chester. The heavily loaded lumber truck was headed north toward Chester. Highway Patrolman Gary Hennigan, who investigated, said that the driver evidently lost control when the outside wheels left the pavement onto the muddy shoulders. The tractor and trailer cartoned into a slight decline in the road bed and flipped over, coming to a stop upside down. The driver evidently was thrown or tried to jump from the cab. The cab was completely demolished. Lumber was scattered from the scene of the wreck across a fence on the right of way. Hennigan said that evidently there were no witnesses to the accident. The body was brought to Edwards Funeral Home and later transferred to Waco for burial.

As the result of a statute passed by the Texas Legislature in 1967, following voter approval of a constitutional amendment in 1966, voting rules have been changed.

As the state's chief officer, Harris advises that residents of the United States who are 21 years of age or older, who are citizens of Texas, and who have lived in the state for at least one year before the day of the election, now satisfy the constitutional requirement for a qualified voter in any election in the state.

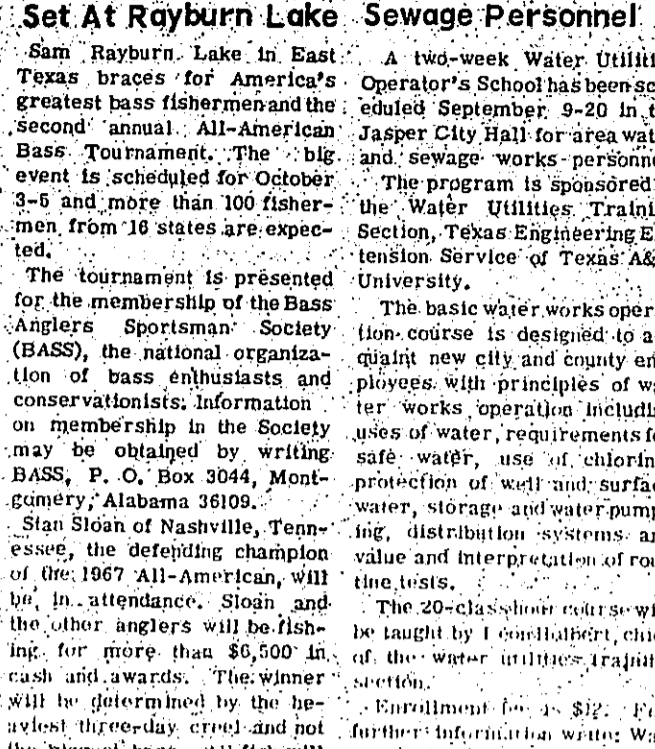

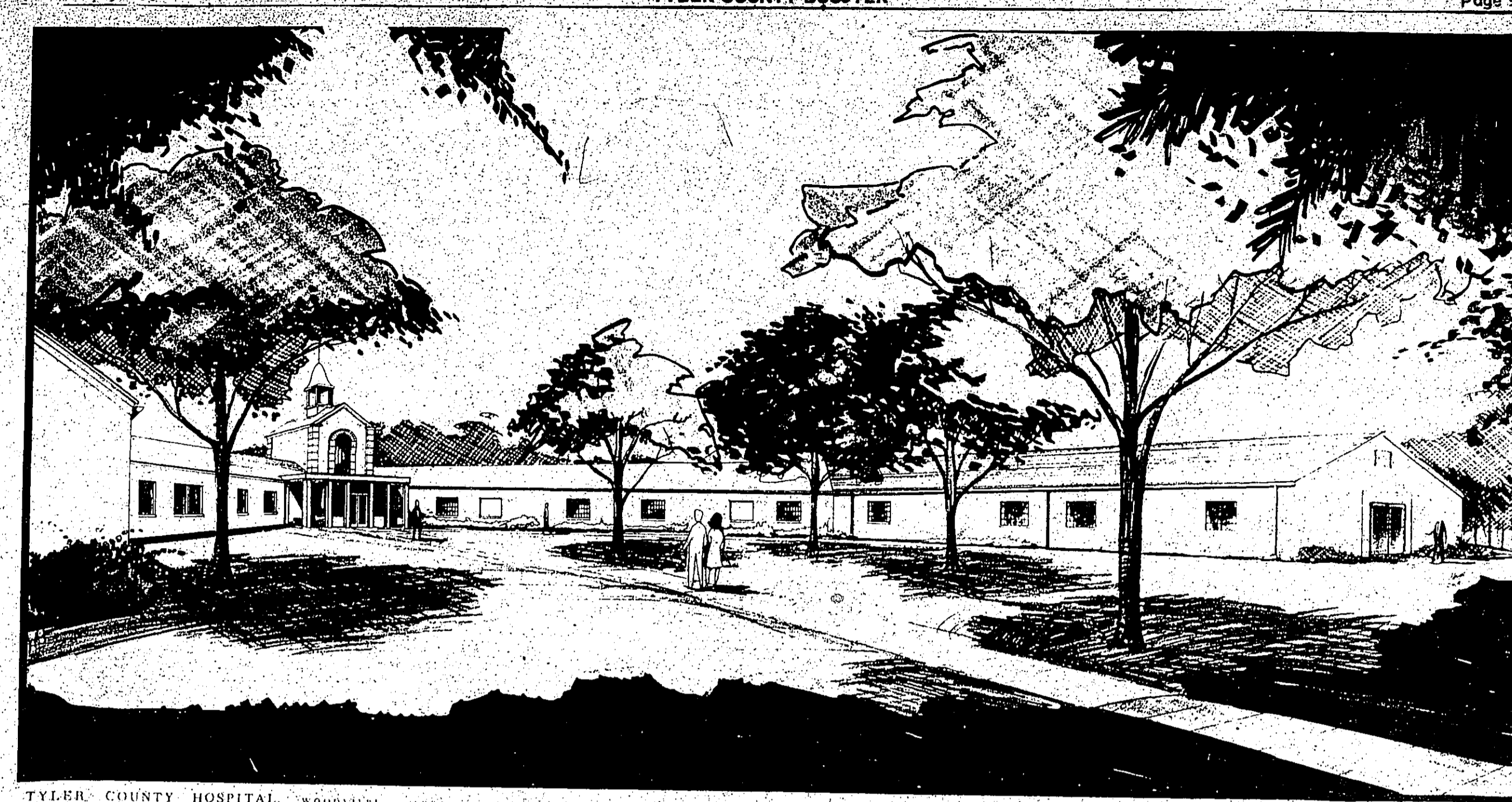

HURRICANE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- FOR THOSE NOT FAMILIAR WITH HURRICANES, THE FOLLOWING SAFETY PRECAUTIONS MAY MEAN THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN LIFE AND DEATH!!
1. Keep your radio or television on and listen for latest Weather Bureau reports.
2. Pay no attention to rumors.
3. Get away from low-lying beaches or other locations which may be swept away.
4. Be alert for high water in areas where streams or rivers may flood after rain.
5. If your house is out of danger from high tides and is well built, then it is safe to stay in it.
6. Board up windows or put storm shutters in place. When you board up, use the correct technique.
7. Get in extra food, especially things which can be eaten without cooking.
8. If emergency cooking facilities are necessary, be sure they are in working condition.
9. Sterilize the bathtub, jugs, bottles, cooking utensils, and fill with drinking water.
10. Have flashlights and/or other emergency lights in working condition and keep them charged.
11. Be sure to have gasoline in your car. If electric power is off, filling stations may not be able to operate pumps for several days.
12. Check on everything that might blow away or be torn loose.
13. Be sure that a window or door can be opened on the lee side of the house.
14. If the center or "eye" of the storm passes directly over, there will be a lull in the wind lasting from a few minutes to half an hour or more.
15. Be calm. Your ability to meet emergencies will inspire and help others.

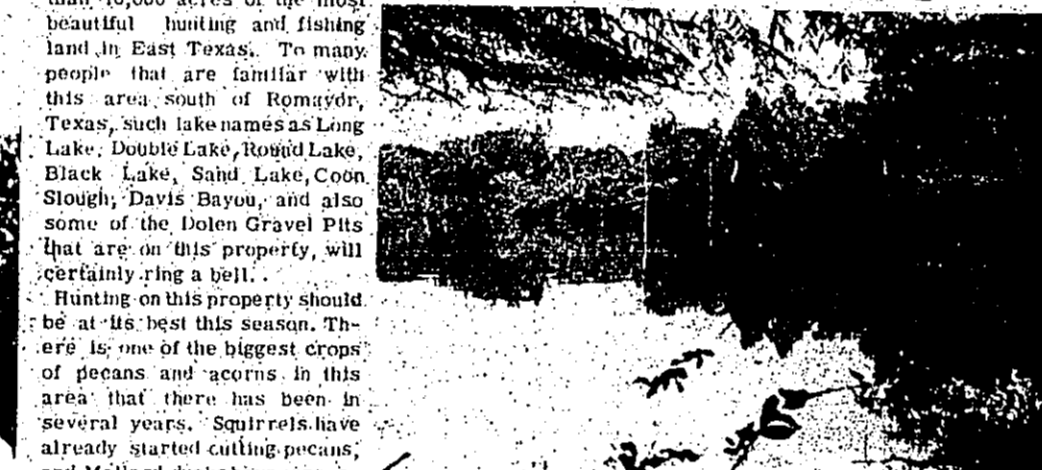
