Absentee voting will end on September 17. Persons living within the city limits who are registered voters may cast a ballot. Those wishing to vote absentee may do so at the city hall.

## Four Sentenced In District Court

Four persons were sentenced by Judge H. A. Cox Monday following their entering pleas of guilty to charges against them in 88th District Court. Henry Mitchell, charged with murder, was given a 10 year probationary sentence after pleading guilty to manslaughter. Barney Lee Almsworth was given a two-year probationary sentence after a plea of guilty to a charge of DWI, and Willie Ray Chance, with two charges of DWI, received a two-year probationary sentence on one charge and was fined \$250 and costs on the other.

David Wilson, charged with forgery and passing, entered a guilty plea and received a two year prison term. Civil cases will be resumed in the third week of district court beginning Tuesday. On the docket are suits by C. T. McCullough vs. Home Insurance Company; General Electric Corporation vs. E. N. Reed; Laredo National Bank vs. Jack Lane Ford, Inc.; and Patricia Ann West vs. Charles Relche. One civil suit was tried during the first week with the verdict returned too late for last week's Booster. It was the suit of L. E. Crocker against Paul Pickard resulting from an accident near Warren, which occurred December 15, 1965. The jury returned a verdict favorable to the defendant, Mr. Pickard. Cleve Bachman of Beaumont represented Mr. Pickard and the plaintiff's lawyers were Clyde E. Smith, Jr. of Woodville and Clark Anderson of Lufkin.

The Lion's Club of Chester, along with many interested citizens from all over Tyler County, have set October 5 as a special day in which Chester hopes to inform the nation that it is a growing community and will prove it by an all day celebration in which present Chester citizens, former Chester citizens, and all East Texans can get together for a full day of entertainment and fellowship.

### Heritage Garden Has No Solicitors For Display Items

Heritage Garden Museum does not have any person authorized to solicit antique or heritage artifacts for display, according to Clyde E. Gray, curator. Mr. Gray said that it had come to light that persons have asked locally and in Beaumont for artifacts to display in the museum, which has attained a national reputation for its unique presentation of the life of pioneers in Texas through a living museum.

Mr. Gray said that the museum welcomes items used by pioneer Texans for display, either on loan or as outright gifts, but that no one is authorized to solicit or pick up such articles for display. He urged any person who has been asked for such articles to please notify him at once and to obtain any such solicitor's name or car license number, if possible.

A stage will be set up for musicians, gospel quartets, and singers who will keep the crowds entertained throughout the day. It is also planned at this time to honor the senior citizens who contributed so much to the great heritage of Chester. Also speakers that will be highly entertaining.

T. T. Thornton, Chester Lion's president, appointed a steering committee composed of Ray Barnes, Orell Seamans, Kelo Seamans, J. O. (Mayor Oscar) Nash, Clarence Woodruff, Bob Bolt, Wiley Poston, and one other who will be named later. This will give Tyler County and the rest of East Texas an opportunity to see progress in action at Chester, October 5.

Ray of Warren, chairman of the eight-county Masonic workshop Area A-4, will present the award and conduct the meeting.

He said the workshop is a part of the semi-annual program held for officers of the 872 Lodges in Texas. The Masonic Lodge is the largest fraternal group in the state, with membership of nearly 250,000.

## Football Season Opens Friday

The Woodville Eagles will open the 1968 football season Friday night against the Center Roughriders of District 7-AAA. Game time is 8:00 p.m. at Woodville Field.

The Eagles have been hitting hard in practice this week in

order to be ready for the season opener against the Triple A team which defeated Jasper in a game-type scrimmage, 8 to 6. Center Quarterback John Pigg is a threat as a runner and passer as well as an adept ball handler.

The Center quarterback missed most of the last half of the 1967 season due to a broken ankle suffered in the fourth game, but already had gained 600 yards. As a sophomore he had over 1,000 yards total offense, and the coach says he

should be better than ever this year.

Another back to watch is Rob Clifford, and the line mainstays include tackles Fred McLeroy and Jesse Wilburn and guard Merle Pfaff. The coach also expects end Keith Koonce to be an ace receiver this year.

Center is in District 7-AAA, a 13-member district which has a north and south zone with Henderson expected to win the seven-team south zone title and Longview Pine Tree to be north zone winner. One of these should advance into the state playoffs if the seers are correct.

However, other teams are not conceding. They include Naacogoches, Kilgore, Carthage, Longview, Womack, Jacksonville, Tarkana Dunbar, Sulphur Springs, Liberty-Elysian, Gilmer, and Mount Pleasant. Experts predict Henderson to be in the top 10 teams in the state.

While Center only had a 4-6 season last year due to Pigg's broken ankle, they are expected to be stronger this year. The Eagles, however, feel they have the manpower to win this one even though the Roughriders came from a Triple A district.

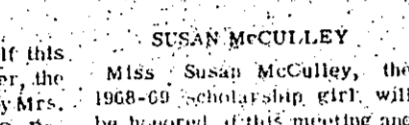

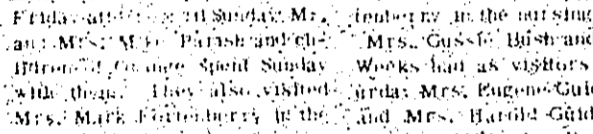


Lesley Flowers holds two apples from a tree when produced about a month and a half this year.

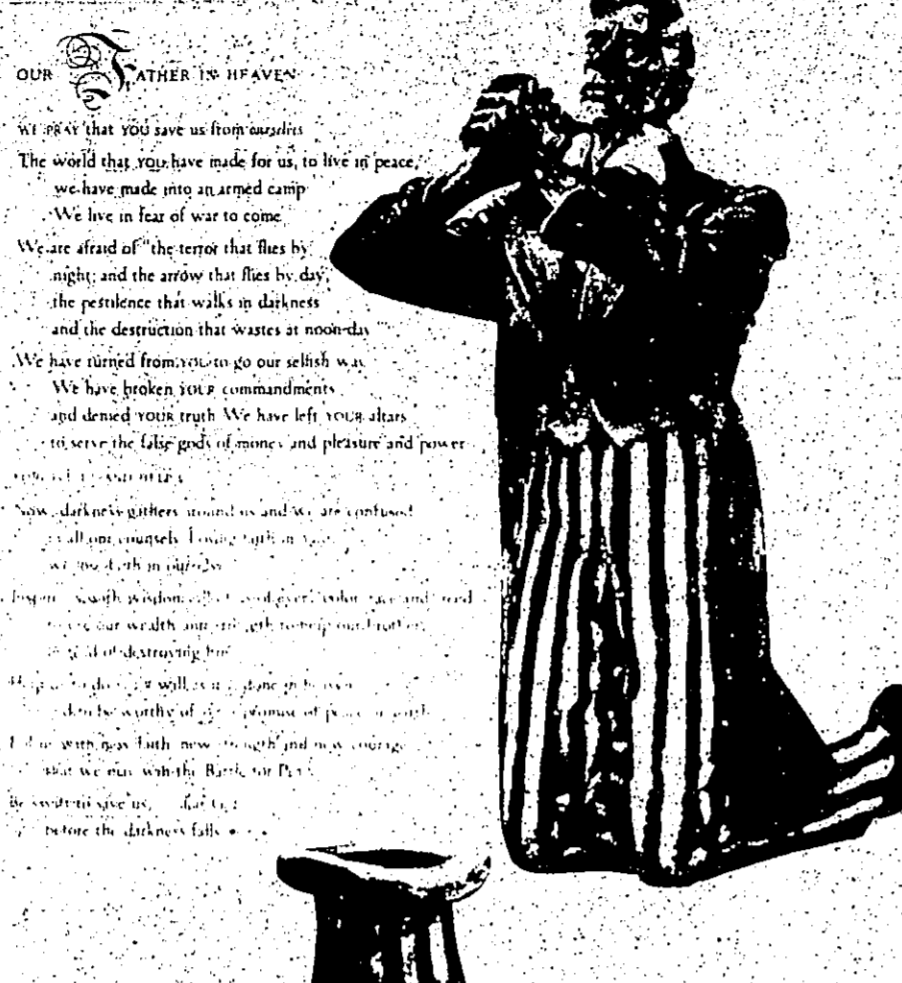

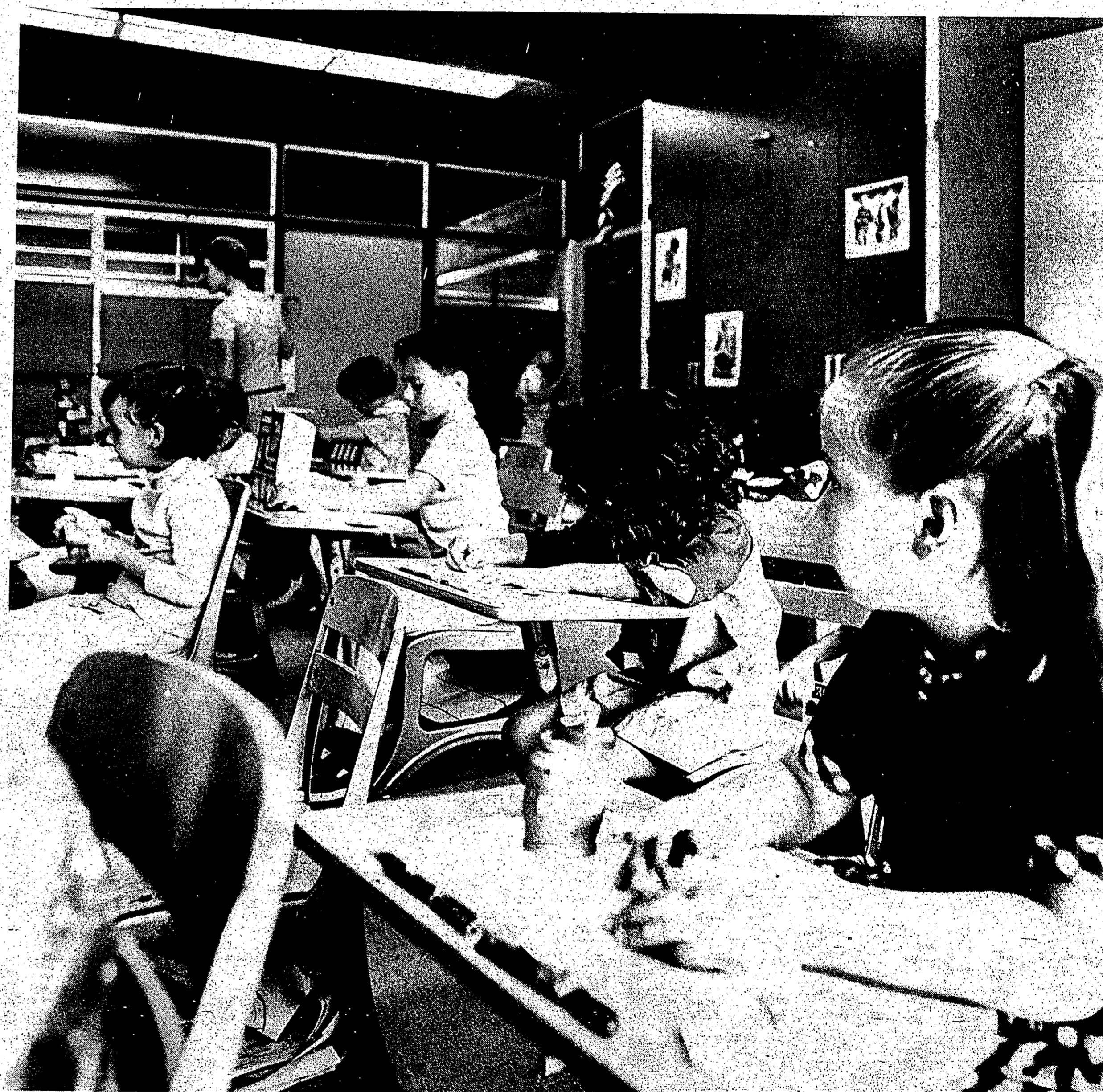

# HOMEMAKING HINTS

By Mrs. Maurine J. Mooney, HD Agent

September, a welcomed change of the season and a happy month to accomplish timely gardening chores. Since former editors remember the shoveling, weeding and many summer maintenance chores still ahead, a great deal of planning is necessary to insure proper care of the garden and lawn.

September is the best time to make plans for fall and winter planting and to prepare for the coming year.

**SEPTEMBER, DIVIDE** the garden into two sections. One for the fall and winter planting and one for the spring and summer planting. This will allow you to plan for the coming year and to make adjustments as needed.

**PLANTING** - Many gardeners fall into the habit of planting in the fall. This is a good time to plant many types of plants, including trees, shrubs, and perennials. The soil is still warm, and the plants have time to establish themselves before the winter.

**TRANSPLANTING** - If you have plants that are overcrowded or that are not doing well, it is a good time to transplant them. This will give them more space and a better chance of survival.

**WEEDING** - Weeding is still an important part of the garden maintenance. Remove any weeds that are starting to grow, and keep the garden beds clean.

**WATERING** - Watering is still important, especially for newly planted plants. Make sure they get enough water to establish themselves.

**PRUNING** - Pruning is still an important part of the garden maintenance. Remove any dead or damaged branches, and shape the plants as needed.

**SOIL CARE** - Soil care is still an important part of the garden maintenance. Add fertilizer as needed, and keep the soil moist.

**PLANTING SCHEDULE** - Here are some suggestions for what to plant in September:

- Flowers:** Dahlias, chrysanthemums, and other fall-blooming flowers.
- Vegetables:** Squash, pumpkins, and other fall vegetables.
- Trees and Shrubs:** Many types of trees and shrubs, including evergreens and deciduous trees.
- Perennials:** Many types of perennials, including hostas, daylilies, and others.

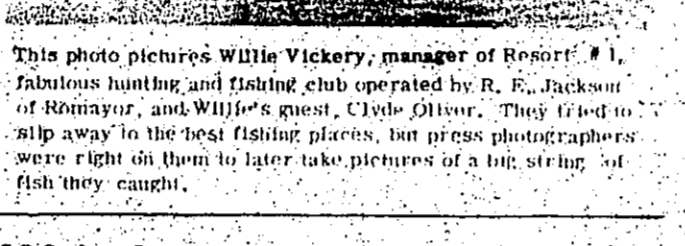

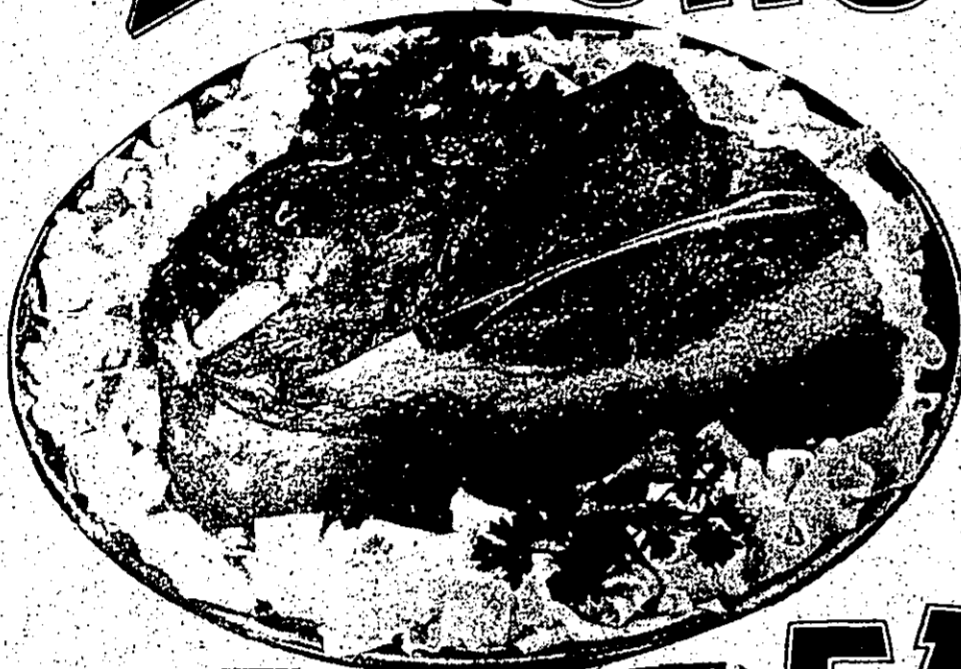
