

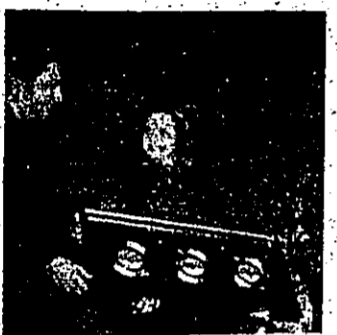

## Speaker At Republican Rally

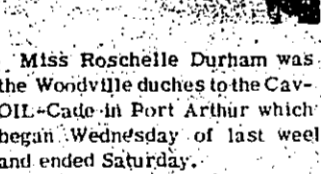

## Burglars Break Into Mann Furniture

An estimated \$4,000 worth of color television sets and radios were taken in a burglary of the Mann Furniture Company store here Tuesday night of last week. The burglar or burglars gained entrance through the back door. The store's safe was also moved outside the building, but evidently was too heavy to be loaded into a vehicle, and it was left setting in the alley. This is the second burglary in the same block within the past month. Birdwell's Department Store was burglarized with entrance gained through the back door about four weeks ago, also on a Tuesday night. The burglars also tried to gain entrance to Birdwell's again last Tuesday night. A third burglary occurred about six weeks ago when Brookshire Brothers store was broken into. Local officers are investigating the burglaries, but no arrests have been made so far.

## Four Officers Face Charges In Federal Court In Beaumont

Four law enforcement officers have been charged in federal court in Beaumont with beating a Negro motorist in Tyler County on January 20, according to an announcement by Attorney General Ramsey Clark in Washington. The four are Highway Patrolmen Joe Willmon and Joseph G. Hennigan, stationed in Woodville; Edward Phillips, now stationed in Dallas; and Ed Sumrall, assistant Police Chief in Woodville. The four are charged with "inflicting summary punishment" on Leroy Barlow after stopping him on a traffic charge. The federal offense carries a maximum penalty of one year in prison and \$1,000 fine upon conviction. The cases will be placed on the federal district court docket and trial date set later.

Again it will have to be fullback James Wolf coming through for big gains if they are to contain the tough Barbers Hill eleven. The latter are the district leaders at this point. Chester and Colmesneil are both coming off big wins last week. This bitter rivalry will be played Saturday at Colmesneil. Last week Colmesneil shellacked West Sabine 33-0 and Chester stomped Oakwood 58-0.

Nearly 100 persons had voted or applied for absentee ballots in the office of County Clerk Otha Miles by Monday of this week. This indicates strong interest in the general election. Absentee voting began Wednesday of last week and will continue until November 1. Most interest here is elsewhere in the state centers of the presidential candidates. So far supporters of both George C. Wallace and Richard Nixon have been active in the county. There has been considerable activity on behalf of the Democratic candidate, Hubert H. Humphrey. Since the supporters of George C. Wallace have been candidates for the American Party, other than for president and vice president there is speculation as to how they will vote in state races. Some Wallace supporters, like S. E. Shuman, the vice chairman of the American Party, have the distinct chance of making an X in the name of Wallace on the ballot and cast a vote for the Republican candidate. The split ticket voters will make an X in the name of each candidate, as well as their wish to vote for the split ticket. Each person will be the District Attorney for president. Voters casting a straight party ballot, making an X in the name of the party at the top of the ballot will automatically vote for all county and precinct nominees. However, those casting a split ticket will have to make an X in the square before each candidate's name beginning with the nominees for president, in a lower through county and precinct nominees if they wish to vote for them. In those cases, if a voter wishes to cast a ballot for county and precinct nominees, he will have to make a split ticket, unless he is a straight Republican. Republican voters can cast a straight Republican ballot, but if they do they will not cast a vote for county and precinct officials. And those who cast a split ticket will have to vote in a candidate except their party's presidential and vice presidential candidates.

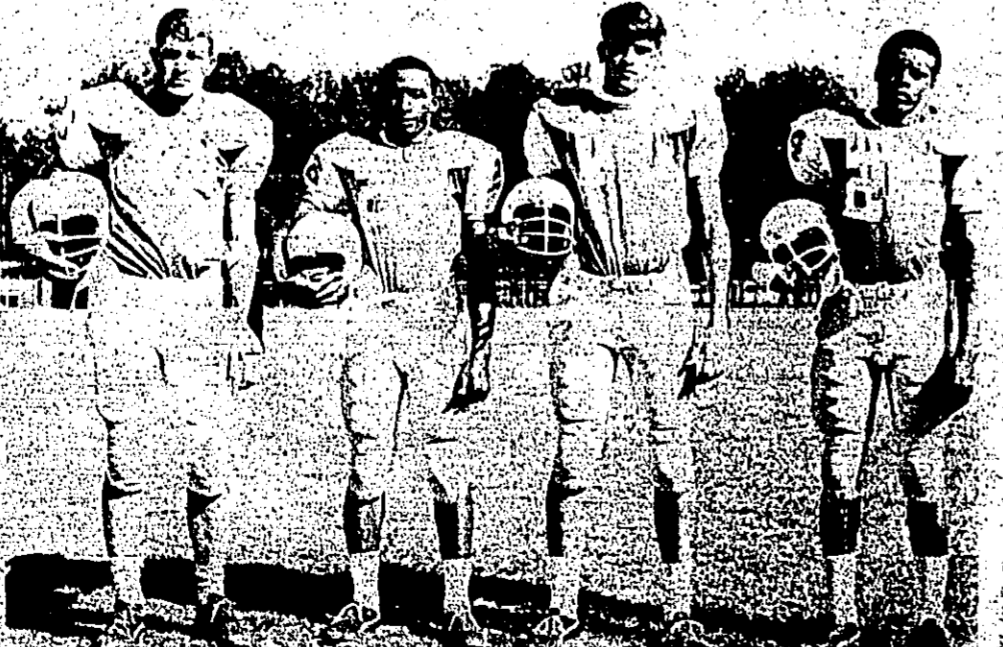
So there will be many a split ballot cast, and voters are urged to be sure they know how to mark a split ticket before they go to the polls. An X marked in the squares before two candidates, for the same office, can nullify a ballot, and it will not be counted. The correct way is to start at the top where each party's presidential candidate is listed and start from there. Do not mark an X in the square before the names of Hubert H. Humphrey and Edmund S. Muskie, Richard M. Nixon and Spiro Agnew, or George C. Wallace and Curtis LeMay. Make an X before the names of whichever of these presidential candidates you wish to vote for, and then continue to make an X before the name of each other candidate in either column for whom you wish to vote. There is also a write-in column for those who wish to write in the name of a person for any particular office. If it sounds like it's going to be a hard chore to cast a ballot, remember the poor counties who will have to enumerate the ballots on election night. That will be a job for Job.
