





The Fort Teran marker will. be dedicated at noon by Don eaker at the meeting of the Adams of Jasper, state representative-elect from Jasper and (Thursday) at 7 p.m. in Dog-Tyler counties. Following the Enloe Mill dedication, the caravan will go on to Fort Teran for the dedication and a basket lunch. Those attending from the county are urged to bring. their own lunch, to be served following the dedication.

The road to Fort Teran park is, in good condition, and signs along the way at cross roads. will direct drivers to the park. Incidentally, each sign gives some historical information as well as the distance to Fort

Teran. The centennial marker erected in 1936 for Fort Teran, which was placed some distance from Fort Teran because the inaccessibility of its site, has been moved to Fort Teran Park since roads to the site have since been construc-
