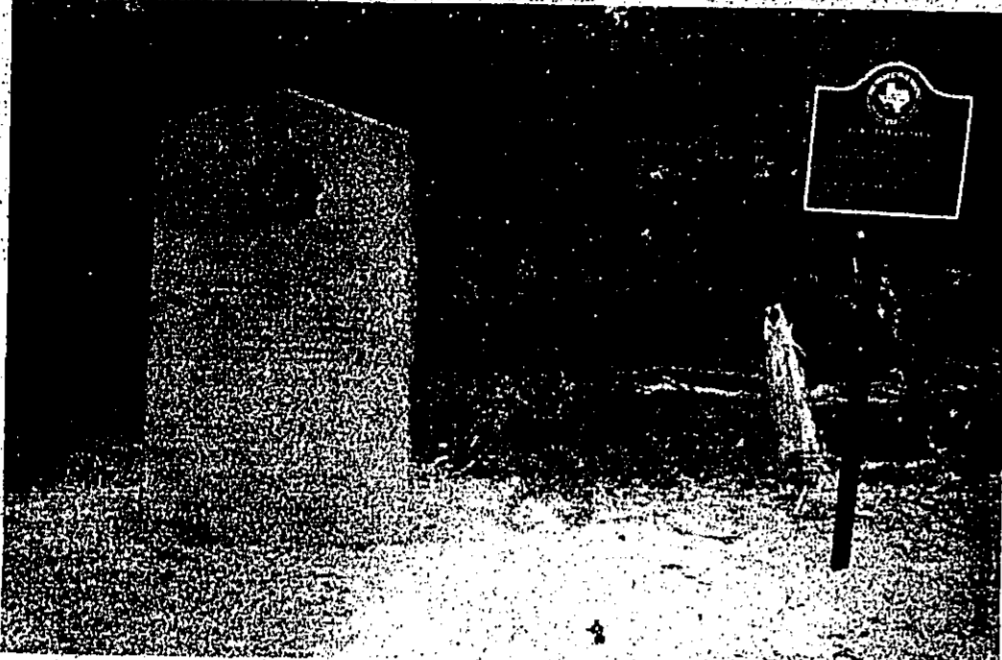

Fort Teran Marker To Be Dedicated

Historical markers for the first Baptist church in Tyler County, the old Enloe Mill, and historic Fort Teran on the Neches River will be dedicated Saturday under the sponsorship of the Tyler County Historical Association and the Texas Historical Survey Committee.

The marker for Bethel Baptist Church will be dedicated at 10 a.m. at the present First Baptist Church in Woodville, according to Mrs. Alynne Schorlemmer, president of the local association. J. C. Clark, Jr. will make the dedicatory remarks.

The Enloe Mill dedication will be at 11 a.m. at its site between Colmesnell and Chester. A friend of the Moseley and Enloe families will make the address here. Those attending the dedication may follow the caravan to the site following the church dedication.

The Fort Teran marker will be dedicated at noon by Don Adams of Jasper, state representative-elect from Jasper and Tyler counties. Following the Enloe Mill dedication, the caravan will go on to Fort Teran for the dedication and a basket lunch. Those attending from the county are urged to bring their own lunch to be served following the dedication.

The road to Fort Teran park is in good condition, and signs along the way at cross roads will direct drivers to the park. Incidentally, each sign gives some historical information as well as the distance to Fort Teran.

The centennial marker erected in 1936 for Fort Teran, which was placed some distance from Fort Teran because of the inaccessibility of its site, has been moved to Fort Teran Park since roads to the site have since been constructed.

These three new markers in Tyler County will appear in the next edition of the "Guide to Official Historical Markers", in tourist guides and on maps to stimulate tourist interest in the area, and to acquaint the people of Tyler County with their own unique historical past.

J. B. Coffman, who has devoted considerable time to research of Fort Teran, has found the following information concerning old Fort Teran:

In volume A, page 1, of the deed records of Tyler County, dated July 5, 1845, is a deed from S. T. Bell to Frost Thorn conveying 2705 acres of land on the bank of the Neches river, including the old camp station or fort known as and called by the name of Teran.

In the Southwestern Historical Quarterly, Volume 36, January 1933, is published the autobiography of George W. Smythe, dated Jasper, Texas, September 18, 1857, in which he states "early in 1852 I went to Fort Teran, situated on the Neches river in what is now Tyler County. Here Colonel Peter Elias Bean was stationed with a few Mexican soldiers. I remained a few weeks under the hospitable roof of the colonel."

The location of this fort was named an historical site by the Texas Centennial Committee in 1936, 101 years after closing of the fort.

The site was donated to the Tyler County Historical Survey Committee in 1966 by Mrs. Winnie Wilson in memory of her husband who preserved the fort site.

The Historical Site Monument was originally erected more than a mile south of the fort as that was the nearest point that could be reached by road. Now, however, the county has graded the road to the top of the high bluff above the river and the monument has been moved to its proper location. The road has been graded and gravelled and is an all weather road. After some parking space is cleared, picnic tables and benches built and a few trees and underbrush cleared, this is going to be the most beautiful scenic site to be found anywhere in this area.

Today I give heartfelt thanks to my Heavenly Father for the countless blessings accorded me throughout my life. "Mucup-runneth over."

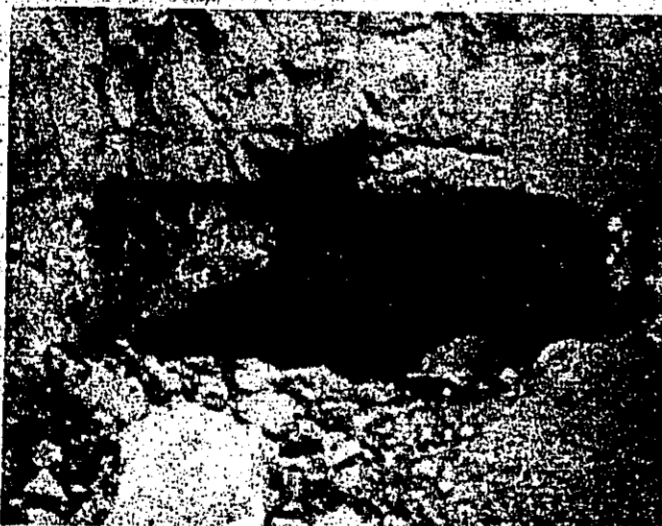

STATE CAPITOL HIGHLIGHTS & SIDELIGHTS

Texas' first bilingual education plan designed to curb the school dropout rate and provide better teaching for 500,000 children has been approved by the Texas Education Agency today.

Fifteen-member advisory committee approved a plan drawn by the Texas Education Agency last week.

Dr. Severo Gomez, director of TEA, International and Bilingual Programs, said the high dropout rate among Spanish-speaking pupils is largely due to traditional instructional methods.

New state-wide plan would provide bilingual instruction for those students in Spanish who get through elementary in the high school.

At the same time, it seeks to teach English-speaking children to be fluent in Spanish as well.

Federal government has allocated \$7.5 million for bilingual education programs, and Texas is due to get a substantial amount early next year.

REGIONAL PLANNING—U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development has announced a \$10 million grant to the State of Texas for a study of regional planning.

Unfortunately, Congress adjourned without acting on another important national park bill, the Great Big Thicket National Park bill, to save the Great Big Thicket region of Southeast Texas.

However, I plan to reintroduce the bill early next year, and I hope that we will get action on it in the next Congress.

Congress also passed this year creating a system of National Wild and Scenic Rivers, preserving many of the more picturesque streams and free-flowing rivers in America for future generations.

Eight rivers are included with another 27 rivers listed as potential additions. A portion of the Red River, between Redwood and Langtry in the Big Bend country of West Texas, is included among those 27 scenic rivers.

We also created for the first time a national trail system to preserve two great historic trails that included the famous old cattle trail from Texas to Kansas, the Chisum Trail.

It has been a good year for conservation. I'm hopeful that next year will continue in the same direction by creating a Big Thicket National Park in Texas.

A number of Tyler County farmers and ranchers, along with about 40,000 other Texas livestock producers, will receive a most important questionaire during the last half of November.

It will come from the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service, Austin, and that it should be filled out and returned as soon as possible.

Here's why. The information obtained from the questionnaires will be the basis for the official estimates of livestock, cattle, horses and poultry for the state of Texas and for each county.

The survey on sheep and goats will be made in late December.

Accurate estimates are of great importance to stockman in planning production and marketing and for providing accurate picture of Texas agriculture.

The Texas Legislature has provided for the program of estimates for each county by state totals along 40 not only supply information on our most basic industry. The program of estimates is a cooperative effort of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, State Reporting Service and the Texas Department of Agriculture.

Each producer who receives a questionnaire from the reporting service is urged to fill it out completely for his farm or ranch, and return it in the enclosed postage-free envelope.

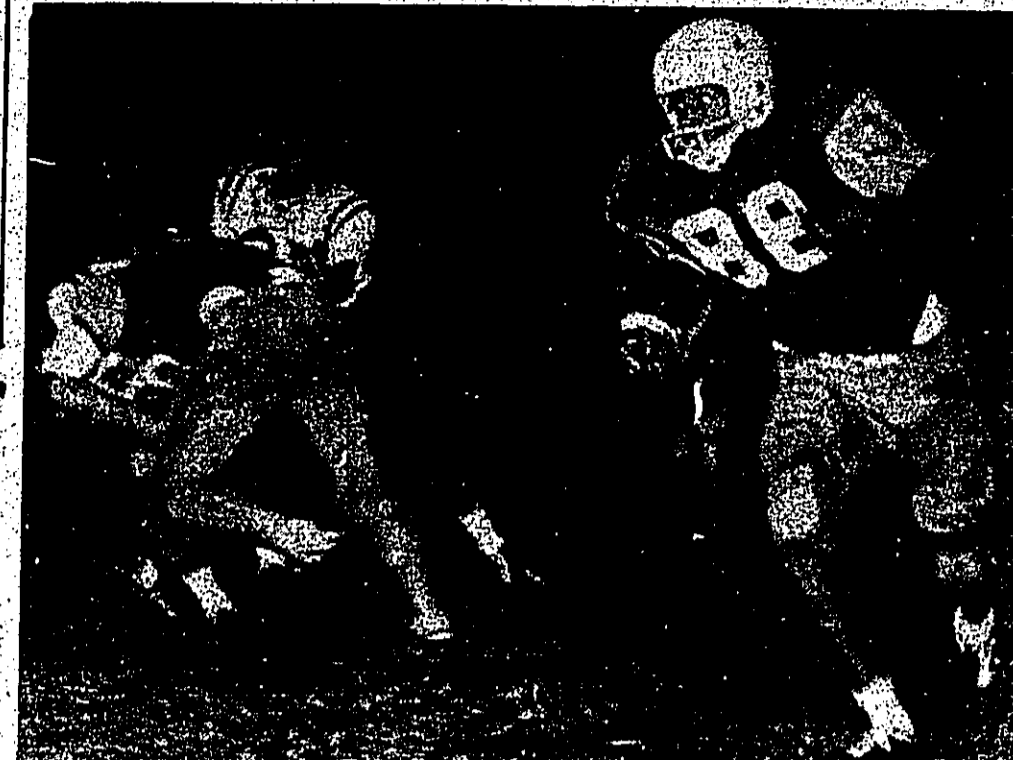

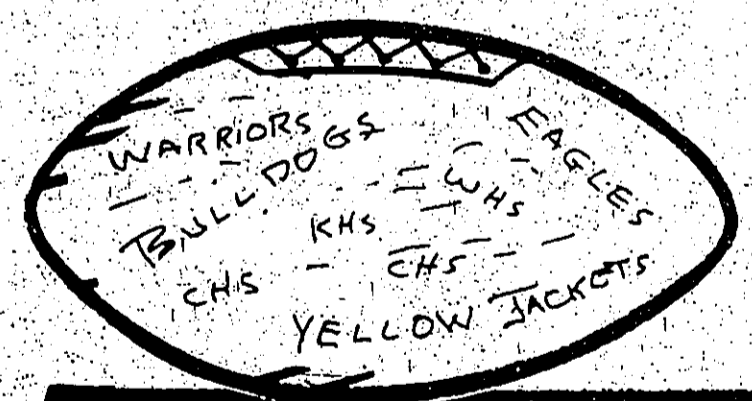

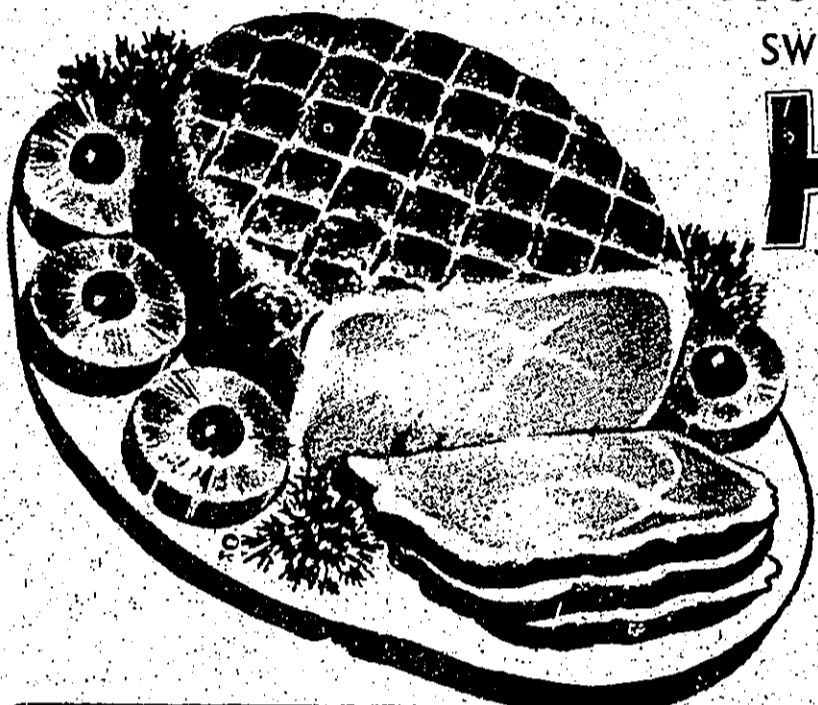
