

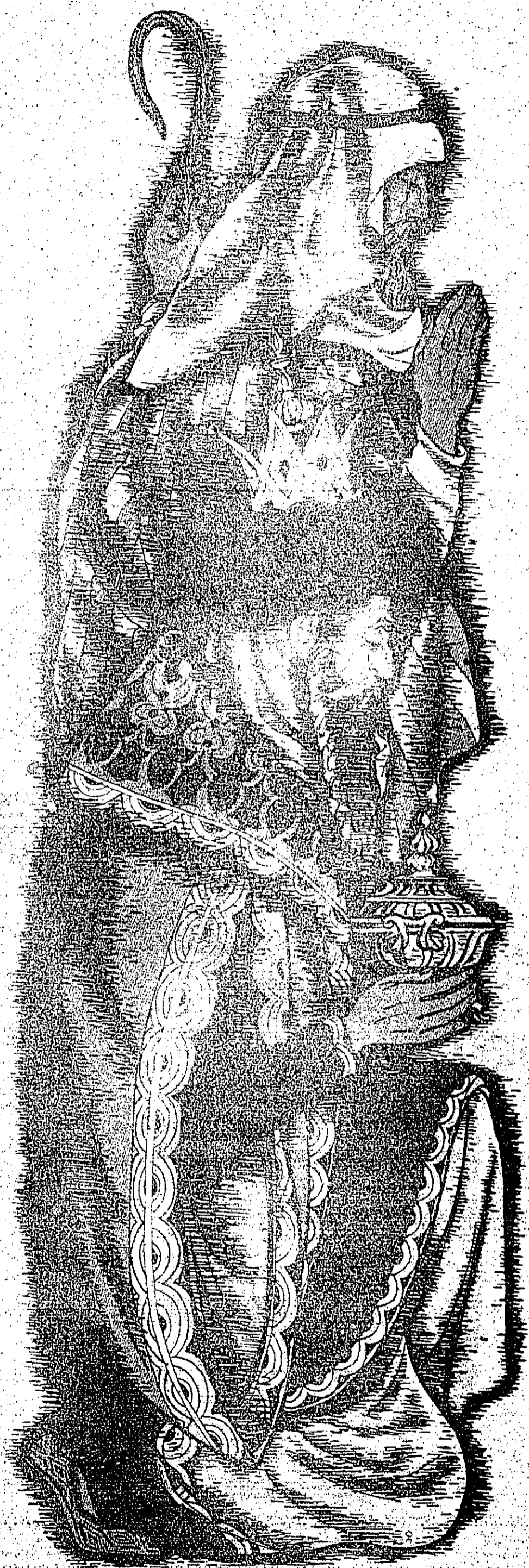

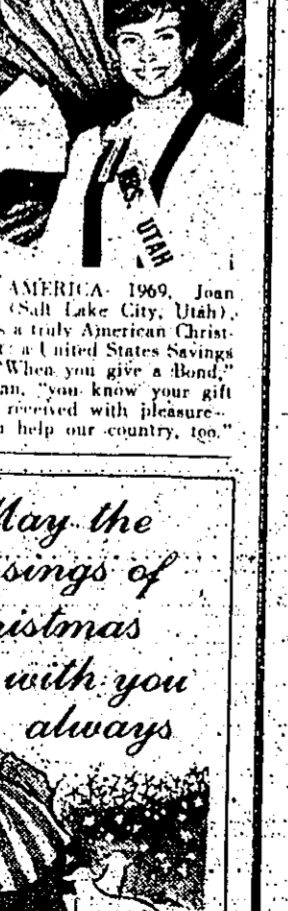

Gov. John Connally got far behind with filling vacancies to state agencies. His office once estimated he had nearly 200 to catch up on. At least one major post-chairmanship of the Texas Employment Commission is four years overdue.

It's traditional that governors fill vacancies occurring during their administrations, though appointees actually serve the terms of the present governor's successor.

Such was the case when Connally re-appointed Joe D. Carter to the key post of Texas Water Rights Commission Chairman. Pledge Daniel originally named Carter in 1961, and served throughout Connally's administration. Carter's initial term actually expired in August, 1967, but Connally delayed re-appointment until last week. New term extends to February 1, 1971.

A different kind of appointment was Connally's choice of Amalthea Eubank as Texas P. Gilvin to succeed Will Odum as Austin chairman of the Park and Wildlife Commission. Odum resigned unexpectedly. Gilvin will serve until February 1, 1971 when Odum's term expires.

Connally re-appointed H. Stafford Jr. of Austin, Grady Clark Jr. of Corpus Christi and Garwood Goffes of Odessa to the State Seed and Plant Board to serve until October 6, 1970.

Re-appointed to the Sabine River Authority are J. L. Packer of Hempstead, F. A. M. of Newburg, D. N. Headlock of San Augustine and Gus Majors of Groesbeck. Dudley Davis of Center and O. N. Pook of Kilgore are new appointees to SHA.

City of San Antonio's City of Brownwood will succeed Jimmie J. Morrison of Mesquite who resigned, on the board of trustees of Texas Municipal Retirement System. The period term runs until December 31, 1970.

Dr. James E. Peavy was named to a new term as Texas Health Commissioner. He has held this position since 1959.

ATTOENEY GENERAL RULES: Texas Highway Department can contract with Arkansas (subject to governor's approval) to participate in the cost of a joint right-of-way construction project. Atty. Gen. Clifford C. Martin has held.

COURTS SPEAK: State Supreme Court found no reversible error in Court of Civil Appeals decision upholding a proposed City of Houston annexation of 220 acres owned by Houston Employment Land Federal Court heard local clash of financial interests. Gulf and Western Industries, Inc. and Sinclair Oil Corporation, over G.W.'s move to get all Sinclair stock.

Federal Court also will hear the case in which Kentucky wardens contest the right of the U.S. to activate state militia for overseas combat duty in peacetime.

Supreme Court reversed and sent back for new trial a Colorado River Municipal Water District suit involving \$545,500 condemnation award for 3,094 acres of Wilcockson Ranch in Coke county condemned in acquiring of dam and reservoir site.

A Hereford man, sentenced to seven years for arson in the burning of his grocery store, won a new trial because the only testimony against him was that of his alleged accomplice. Court of Criminal Appeals reversed the case.

Supreme Court will review a case challenging constitutionality of the law regulating the detector machine operators.

LCB REVENUE UP: During the last fiscal year the Texas Liquor Control Board brought into state coffers a net profit of \$51,088, 018, which is a record, the agency says in its annual report to the governor.

LCB listed its gross receipt for the year at \$55,061,583, which comes from permits and licenses granted package stores, private clubs and other establishments selling beer and wine and from taxes on alcoholic be-

NATIONALS CHRISTMAS TREE
The country has its Christmas tree. The first national Christmas tree from the state of Utah will take the place of honor on the ellipse between the White House and the Washington Monument in the nation's capital.

This tree is a 15-year-old Engelmann spruce from the Utah National Forest. The 74-foot tree was trucked to Heber City, Utah, wrapped in a protective coating of 300 feet of tarp and loaded aboard a flatcar for its 2,250 mile railway journey to Washington, according to the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

The tree is 24 inches in diameter at the stump and branches out to a diameter of 20 feet at the top. It has been growing since an annual back to back 1942-1943 when it was planted in the State Park in Heber City, Utah.

A back yard tree was 2 1/2 feet high from the Green Mountain National Forest in Utah.

The Christmas tree will be something less than 12 feet tall, when it is decorated with lights, ornaments and tinsel. Consider some of the suggestions of the U.S.A.'s Consumer and Marketing Service.
