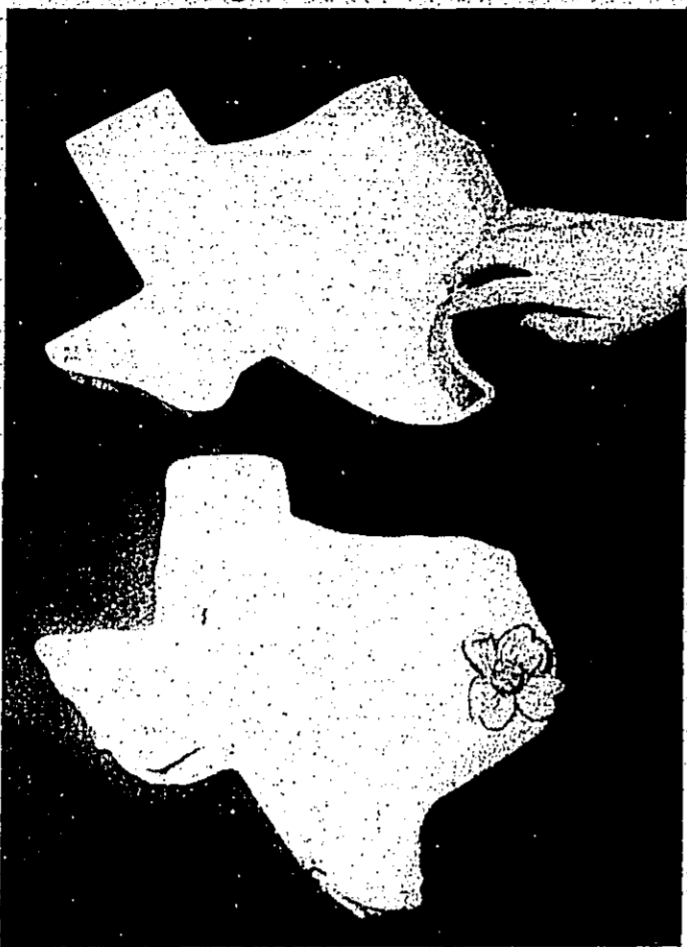

Miss Owens was selected by the King's Men from the four finalists. Miss Debbie Davis of Woodville was first runner-up and is Princess of Tyler County. Stella Owens is Princess of Colmesnell and Debra Hooks is princess of Spurger.

Swearingen And Archer Win Races For School Trustees

Dr. R. E. Swearingen was elected to place 1 on the board of trustees of Woodville Independent School District in the election Saturday with a six-vote margin over Bob R. Bell. Swearingen polled 289 to Bell's 283 votes.

For Place 2, F. M. Archer, incumbent, received 324 votes to 253 cast for Charles W. Smith.

In the club division, the Retirees Club was first with a replica of Kirby Chapel complete with preacher and congregation. Woodville Lions Club was second with an old-time medicine show entry.

Miss Owens succeeded Dell Jordan of Spurger, who made her farewell appearance before the capacity audience prior to the coronation ceremonies.

Jesse Ray, also of Warren, was Miss Owens' escort and was crowned king of the festival by M. Dwyer.

Miss Celeste Birdwell of K. K. unit was selected by the judges as lady-in-waiting to the queen, an honor presented each year to an out of county duchess. Her escort was Wesley Dinn.

Escorting Miss Davis was Dan Utley, while Miss Hook's escort was James Odum, also of Spurger. Miss Allen's escort was Ben Stewart, Jr.

The new queen is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Uel Owens of Fred. She was recently elected by the student body as Miss Warren High School and also was named most beautiful. She won the DAR citizenship medal this year. She has been drum major of the Warren High School band for four years. She was named best actress in the district one-act play contest and was selected on the regional all-star cast. She also was winner in the prose reading contest.

Miss Davis is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Richard F. Davis, Jr. For four years she has been very active in the Kirby High School band and she is a member of the National Honor Society. She will be the Woodville duchess to the Neches River Festival this month and she has served on the Youth Council of the First Baptist Church.

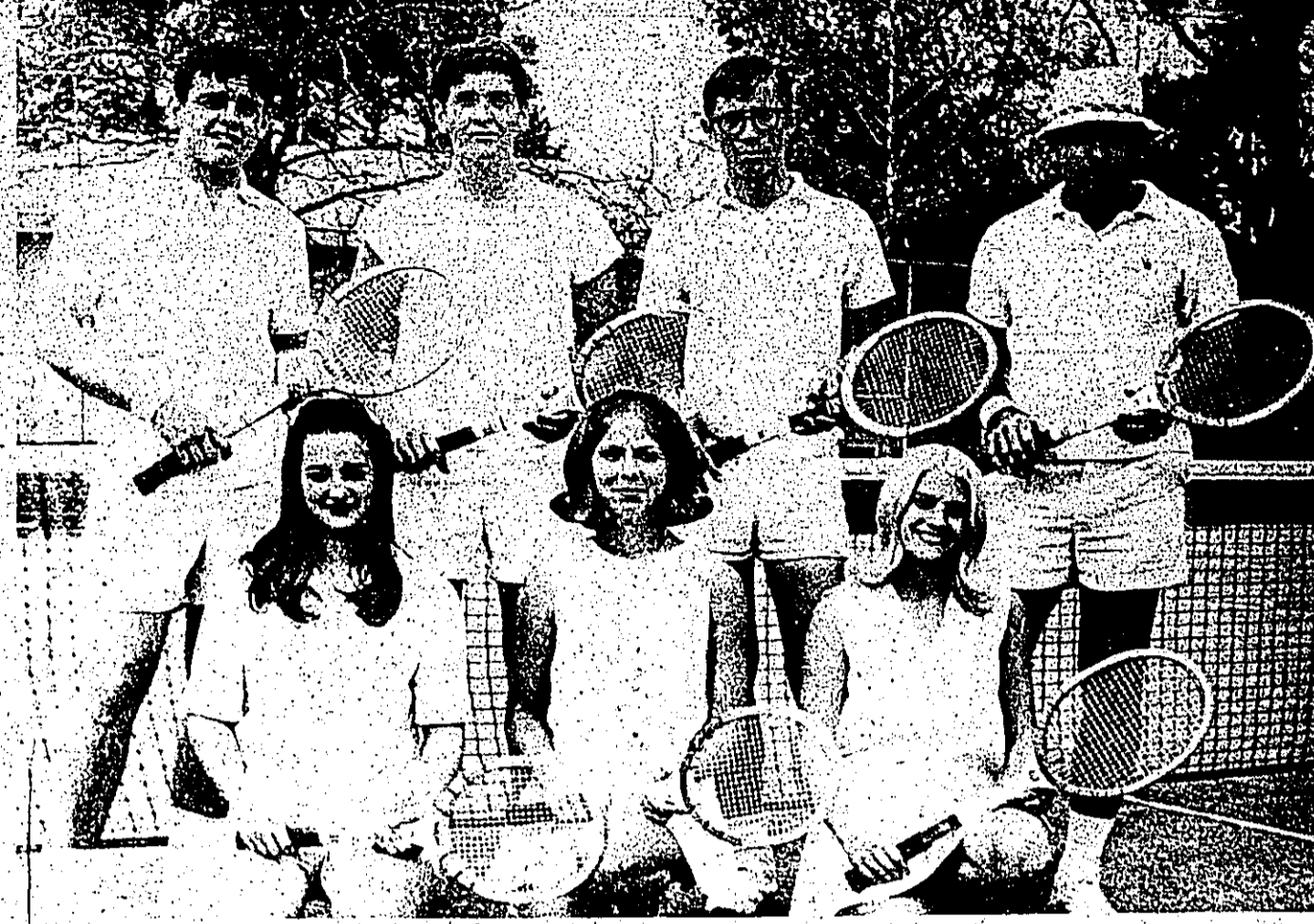

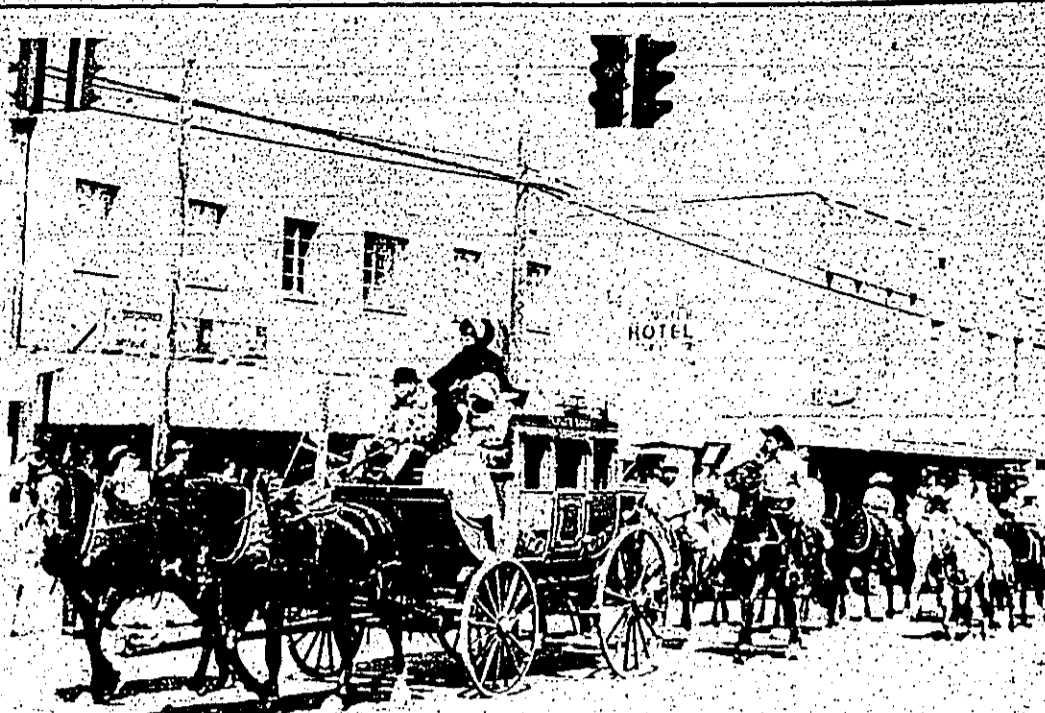

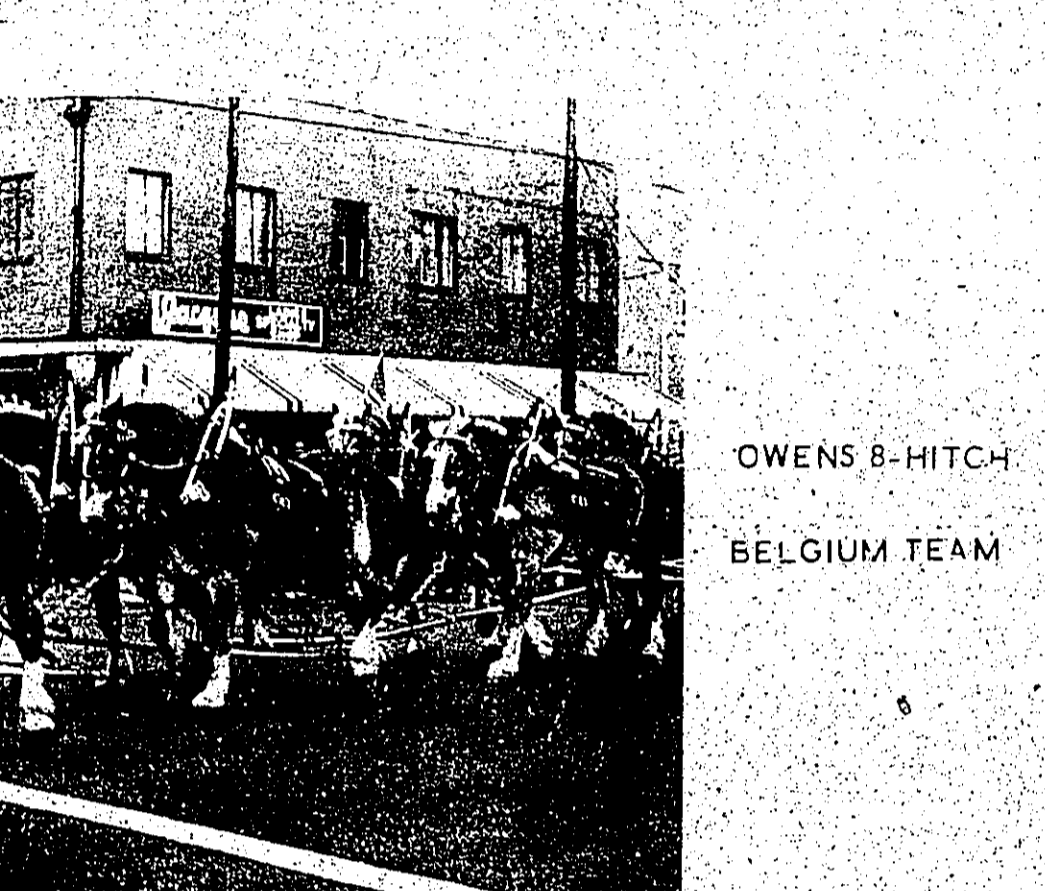
