## Teenage Nutrition Emphasis Week To Be Observed

Tyler County Commissioner's Court this week proclaimed April 28 - May 2, as Teenage Nutrition Emphasis Week in Tyler County in cooperation with County Extension Service. The proclamation reads as follows:

WHEREAS, all junior high schools in Tyler County are engaged in a four-month Teenage Nutrition Emphasis, and

WHEREAS, the objectives are to explain the nutritional situation with teenagers; to identify wants of importance of nutrition to health; to help teenagers to recognize the need for and plan ways of improving nutrition; and

WHEREAS, boys as well as girls need to improve their diet. As shown by research of every 10 girls, 6 have poor diets, and of every 10 boys, 4 have poor diets, and

WHEREAS, from childhood to teenage the percentage of young people with poor diets increased sharply, and

WHEREAS, girls are more poorly fed than boys. Girls are often short on calcium, iron, and Vitamin C. Boys lack calcium, thiamin, and Vitamin C. More girls are overweight than boys; and

WHEREAS, nutrition surveys have been made in each school, and

WHEREAS, nutrition exhibits are set up in all schools, and

WHEREAS, nutrition experiments with white rats are being conducted in each school, and

WHEREAS, assembly programs to reach all teenagers

in the five schools in the county are planned for April 28 through May 2, as a climax to these activities.

WHEREAS, We, the Commissioner's Court of Tyler County, do hereby designate the week of April 28 through May 2, as Teen-Age Nutrition Week in Tyler County and urge all parents to cooperate with teenagers by learning and using the facts about nutrition that are vital to good health and well-being.

In official recognition whereof, we hereby affix our signatures this 14th day of April, 1969, Jeff R. M.oney, County Judge, J. Carl Sheppard, Commissioner Precinct I, Herman H. Powell, Commissioner Precinct II, Leon Fowler, Commissioner Precinct III, and James R. Jordan, Commissioner Precinct IV.
