TEXAS REPORT

BY SENATOR CHARLES WILSON

The Senate passed the last of the Trinity River legislative package this week. When these bills are passed by the House of Representatives there will be no obstacle left on the state level to the creation of navigation on the Trinity. Also included in the package was a very important provision providing for revenue bonds to be sold (at no cost to the taxpayers) for the creation of reservoirs on the Trinity River Authority reservoirs. This is particularly important for Lake Livingston. Unless these bills become law the TRA will not be able to follow through with parks already planned, or any new parks in the future. This would be a very bad situation. We are all expecting Parks County and other counties in Central East Texas to prosper greatly from recreational trails coming from the Trinity River Authority. It is also important for the sportsmen of our area to have adequate Park Camps and other facilities available. The bill has some provisions, saying that no fees will be charged for the use of boat ramps, and thereby giving our sportsmen the absolute right of free access to Lake Livingston.

PARKS AND WILDS—Last week the House passed a separate measure, necessary to separate the Parks and Wildlife Department into two different agencies. I have introduced this measure in the Senate because separation is so important to
