### Area Citizens Invited To Open Mansion Monday

Gov. Preston Smith has announced that every resident of the 3rd and 4th Senatorial districts, represented by Senators Charles Wilson and Roy D. Harrington, will be invited to a reception in the Governor's Mansion on Monday, May 19. The governor is holding a series of "Open-Mansion" get-togethers which will eventually include open invitations to every Texan.

"We have opened the door of the Governor's Office in the Capitol Building for any and all who want to visit with us," said Gov. Smith. "We now want to open the doors of the Governor's Mansion and give every Texan an opportunity to come visit with us there."

Citizens of the 3rd and 4th Senatorial Districts, will be hosted on Monday, May 19 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m.

Apollo 10 will be launched Sunday for a 74-hour trip to the moon, a 61.5-hour moon orbit, and a 53-hour return journey and splashdown in the Pacific.

Watching the eight-day mission with special attention to the splashdown will be two Tyler County families—Mr. and Mrs. Lou Cruse and Mr. and Mrs. John Smitley. Commander of the prime recovery ship, the USS Princeton LPJ-12, is Captain Carl M. Cruse; son of Mr. and Mrs. Lou Cruse and brother of Mrs. Smitley.

The crew of the USS Princeton began training exercises May 5, principally recovering dummy space modules and practicing other phases of the recovery so that by the date of the splashdown the procedures will be familiar and troublefree.

The ship was scheduled to leave Pearl Harbor last Sunday for the Apollo 10 recovery area and by today (Thursday) should be within 50 miles of American Samoa where the ship was to receive medical personnel arriving by helicopter, and from there will proceed to its first position, the launch area where it will remain while Apollo 10 is in trans-lunar orbit. The ship expects to pick up the three astronauts on or about May 26. After recovery, the Princeton will approach American Samoa again where the astronauts will be flown ashore to begin their return trip to Houston. The Princeton will continue on to Pearl Harbor to let off the rest of the civilian personnel who are on board for the recovery mission.

Captain Cruse was born July 10, 1923, in the Dies community near Woodville where his parents still reside. He attended Sam Houston State Teachers College prior to entering the Navy, and later graduated from George Washington University. He entered the Navy through the Aviation Cadet Program and after completing flight training at Pensacola, Florida, he was commissioned an ensign in June 1943.

A graduate of the Naval Test Pilot School, Captain Cruse assumed command in January 1968 of Fighter Squadron 22 and later Fighter Squadron 82, both in the Atlantic Fleet. From March 1962 to March 1963 he was commander of Air Wing 19 operating in the Western Pacific from the USS Bonhomme Richard. Captain Cruse was commanding officer of the USS Princeton from December 1966 to December 1967, guiding the ship through four amphibious assaults against North Vietnamese forces.

On May 1, 1968 the USS Princeton with Captain Cruse in command departed for the Western Pacific where it was deployed off the coast of Vietnam, operating in the combat zone through November 1968. He returned to his home port of Long Beach, California, last December in time for Christmas.

On March 7, 1969 at a special hangar-deck ceremony attended by the entire Princeton crew Captain Cruse was presented the Legion of Merit with Combat "V." Captain Boykin R. Dodson, commander Amphibious Squadron Seven, read the citation from Admiral John J. Hyland, commander in chief of the Pacific Fleet. The citation reads in part, "The President takes great pleasure in presenting the Legion of Merit to Captain Carl M. Cruse for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service as commanding officer USS Princeton, LPJ-12."

Captain Cruse received the decoration for his services during Princeton's recent deployment off the coast of Vietnam. The citation continues, "Captain Cruse was personally responsible for the sustained superior performance of his command in amphibious combat operations for the skillful execution of the vertical envelopment phase of these assaults and support operations, and for superior command and control services provided to Commander Amphibious Ready Group Albatross and Commander Special Landing Force, for sustained periods of continuous day and night underway operations."

Captain Cruse and his wife, the former Miss Laverne Burns of Bakersfield, California, and daughters Deborah and Janet now make their home in Los Alamitos, California.

Captain Cruse has another sister, Mrs. Groer Hubbard, and two brothers, Rex and Bob Frank Cruse, all of Houston.

read each morning about 8 a.m. for the preceding 24 hours. Starting Sunday, May 4, readings for each day were: May 4 -- 3.57; May 5 -- 2.45; May 6 -- 0.15; May 7 -- 5.10; May 8 -- 3.92.

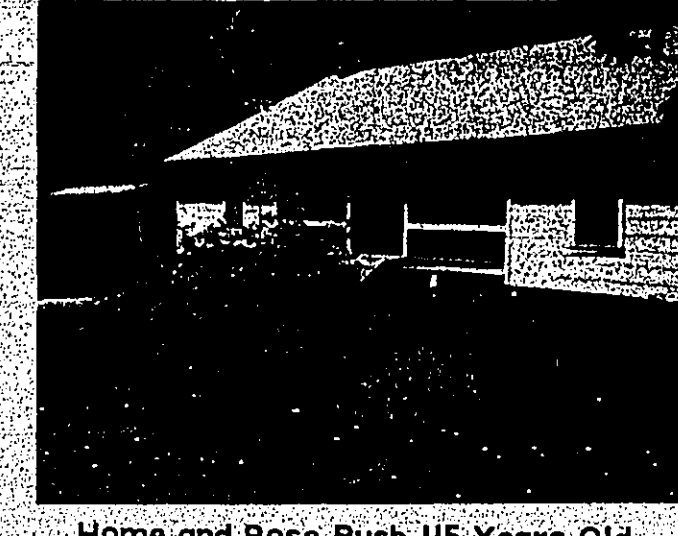

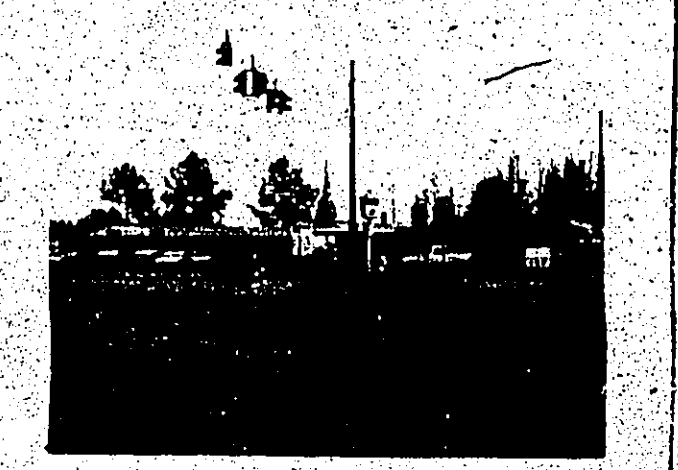

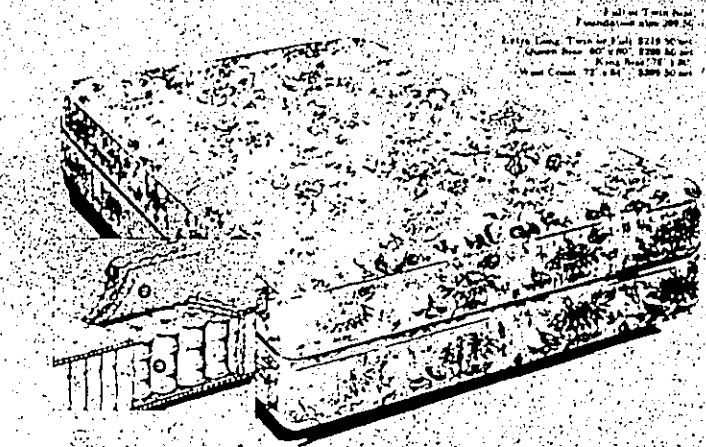
