## Amendments To Be Decided By Voters August 5

Texas voters will decide on nine amendments to the state constitution in a special election to be held August 5. The Booster will carry resumes of the nine amendments and the pros and cons of each during the next two weeks in order to inform voters about them prior to the absentee voting period which will be held from July 16 through August 1. New residents of the county who are qualified voters of Texas but who have lived in the county less than six months are eligible to vote during the absentee period.

## Water Rights Claims Must Be Filed By September 1

The Texas Water Rights Commission has announced that final notice of the recording deadline under the Water Rights Adjudication Act of 1967 has been given. Everyone who is using water from a public stream who does not claim under a certified filing or a permit from the State must record his claim by September 1, 1969. Users of water for domestic and livestock watering purposes are exempt from this requirement.

Failure to timely record the claim will "extinguish and bar" the claim of water right according to Section 4 of the Adjudication Act. All affected water users who have not already filed their claim are urged by the Commission to do so as soon as possible.

Further information and forms for recording claims under the Water Rights Adjudication Act may be obtained from the Texas Water Rights Commission, P. O. Box 12396, Capitol Station, Austin, Texas 78711.

## County Farmers Win Ribbons At Beaumont

Tyler County farmers won 11 ribbons, including six blue ones, at the 15th annual Neeches Valley Producers Show held at the Farmers Market in Beaumont.

R. A. Hatton won the reserve champion award at the show with a basket of tomatoes which sold for \$90 at the auction following the show. The grand champion award was taken by B. J. Richardson of Polk county with speckled purple hull peas which sold for \$230 at the auction.

Other blue ribbon winners from Tyler County, the vegetable show, and the amount received at the auction, were: Marvin Ivy, potatoes, \$35; Jim Morris, green beans, \$40; R. A. Hatton, butterbeans, \$40; R. A. Hatton, eggplant, \$30; and Jim Morris, pumpkin, \$27.50.

Red ribbon winners, vegetable show, and auction price, were: R. A. Hatton, squash, \$27.50; and J. W. Stone, eggplant, \$32.50.

White ribbon winners were Jim Morris, squash, \$30; Marvin Ivy, eggplant, \$35; and R. A. Hatton, purple hull peas, \$42.50.

Three Tyler County business institutions were high bidders at the auction. Citizens State Bank bought R. A. Hatton's butterbeans which won a blue ribbon, paying \$40. Jack Lane Ford paid \$32.50 for the red ribbon winning eggplant shown by J. W. Stone, and J. B. List purchased the squash shown by Jim Morris for \$30.

The producers show and auction this year turned out to be one of the best in the 15 year history of the farmers market. The 42 exhibits, which won ribbons sold for a total of \$1672.50 in the auction with only nine of them selling for less than \$30.

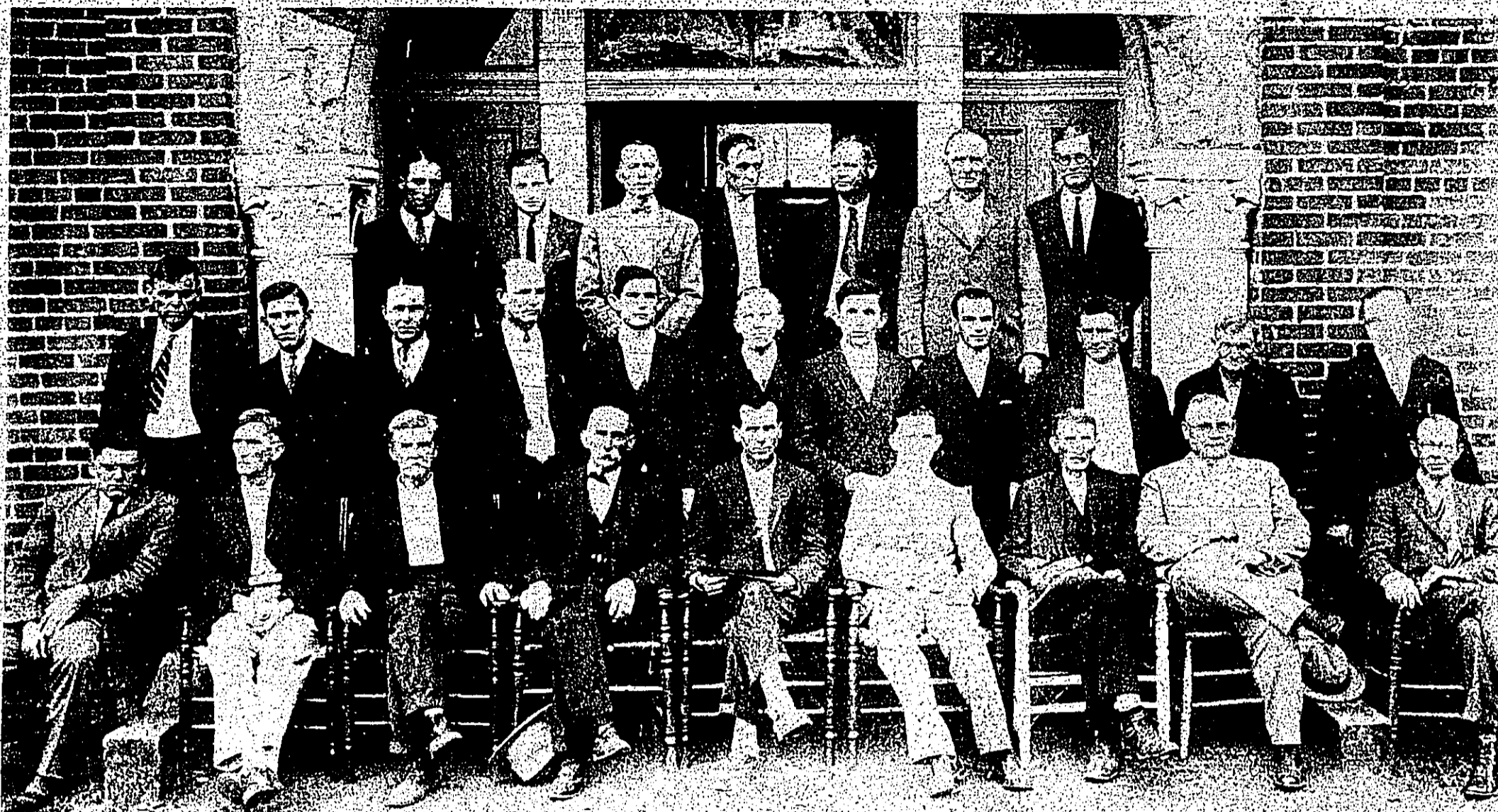

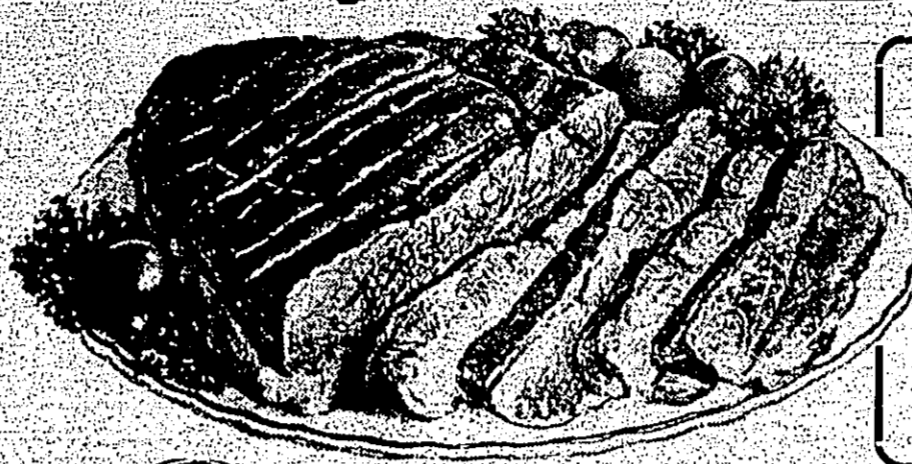
