INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION CONSULTANT TO SPEAK AT LIONS, ROTARY CLUBS

Ed Latta, Industrial Development consultant, Texas Industrial Commission, will be guest speaker at the Lions Club meeting at noon Thursday, August 7, and at the Rotary Club at 7:00 p.m. on the same date.

Mr. Latta's visit to Woodville for these two meetings was arranged by the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Latta is a native of Beaumont where he graduated from Beaumont High School with scholastic honors in 1958. He has earned B. S. degrees in agriculture, journalism and wildlife science simultaneously from Texas A & M University, graduating in 1963.

COURSE IN FOREST PRODUCTS HARVEST TO BE TAUGHT IN WARREN SCHOOL

A new course in harvesting forest products will be added to the curriculum at 12 Texas high schools beginning this fall. This will be a course in forestry for interested students.

The primary objective will be to acquaint and train boys in all phases of harvesting forest products and to qualify them to become wood producers. The training received will qualify them for employment in the woodlands division of paper mills, sawmills and related industries.

The 12 teachers and schools scheduled for the new timber harvesting instruction are Edwin Smith, Cleveland; Larry Shupak, Crockett; Robert Glozier, Houston; Joe Love, Jasper; Giles Horn, Kirbyville; Walton Saucier, Livingston; George Cook, Newton; Billie Wiggins, Warren; Jimmy Kelley, Saratoga; Robert Haywood, Pinebluff; Joe Hewitt, Deweyville; and Nolan Aiders, Nacogdoches.

The teachers attended a two-day intensive workshop at the headquarters of the Texas Forestry Association, Lufkin.

Tyler County voters will join those of the other 253 counties Tuesday in deciding the fate of nine proposed amendments to the constitution of the State of Texas.

Polling places in the county will be open from 8:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. Those voting will be required to have registration slips making them eligible to vote in 1969.

While there are nine amendments to be voted on, one has raised considerable controversy. This amendment, No. 2 on the ballot, will authorize the increase of 3.5 billion in Texas Water Development bonds with which to put in operation the so-called Texas Water Plan. This plan envisions the building of canals through the north and the Gulf coast section of the state to carry water from the Mississippi River to the high plains and to South Texas.

The amendment broadens the powers of the Water Development Board and permits it to participate in the development of all types of water resources and increases, as stated above, the authorized amount of Water Development Bonds by an additional \$3.5 billion, subject to two-thirds approval of the legislature.

Arguments for the amendment state that the future economic growth of the state is dependent on adequate water resources and that studies by the Texas Water Development Board and the United States Bureau of Reclamation show that Texas present growth is limited by its available water resources. The Texas Water Plan will permit in the short period of adequate water resources to be an orderly, off-budget investment period of 20 years.

Arguments against the Texas Water Plan include the tremendous cost and the charge that the plan has been hastily drawn. Although the bonds are revenue bonds there will be costs prior to the time water becomes available that will be added to a statewide tax.

Beard's other proposed amendments are:

Number One: A department clearing agenda in to commission absolute and superfluous sections of the constitution.

Number Three: Authorizing the legislature to set the salary of the lieutenant governor and speaker of the house of representatives at no more than one-half the salary paid the governor. The governor is now paid \$40,000.

Number Four: This would exempt non-profit water supply corporation from all ad valorem taxes.

Number Five: Increases the maximum amount which the state may expend in any year from \$100,000,000 to \$100,000,000.

Number Six: This would remove the constitutional barrier to the legislative establishment of a public agencies subject to limitations set by the constitution.

Number Seven: This would amend the constitution to allow the legislature to create a public utility.

Number Eight: Authorizes the legislature to provide an additional \$200 in bonds to finance the student loan program at institutions of higher education.

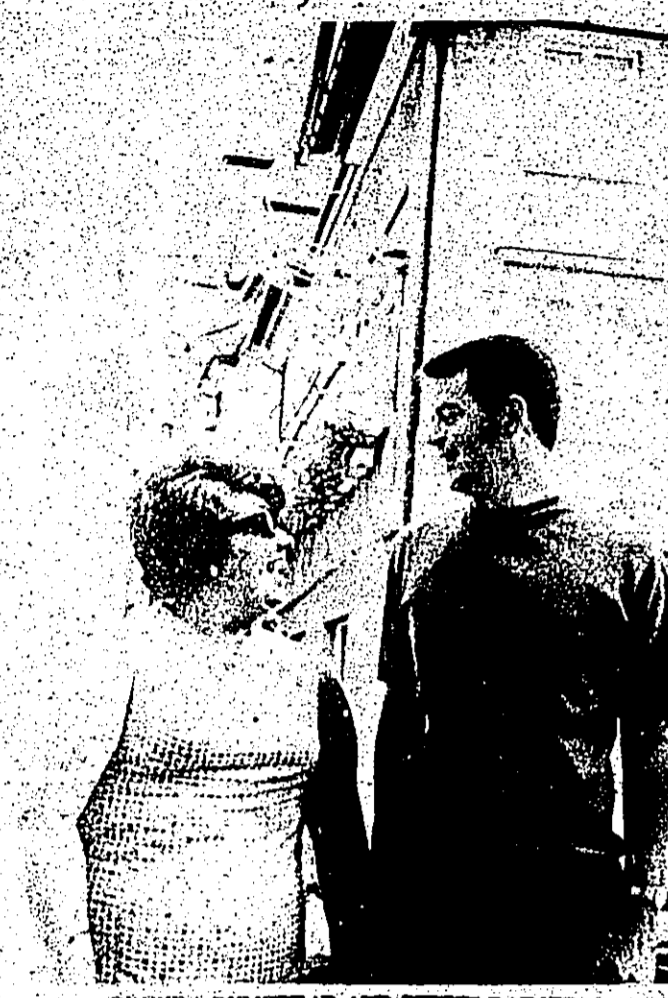
Number Nine: Provides for annual sessions of the legislature.

Local Homemaking Teachers Participate In State Conference

Mrs. Pamela Ralinger, Mrs. Arlene Canada and Mrs. Marjorie Tidwell, homemaking teachers in the Kirby High School, will participate in the State In-Service Conference for Homemaking Teachers to be held at the Staller Hilton Hotel, Dallas, July 28-August 1. The theme of the meeting will be "Homemaking Education—Declaration of Purpose and Action."

Guest speaker for the opening session on Monday night will be Ruth Stovall, State Supervisor of Home Economics Education, Montgomery, Alabama. The week-long meeting will be devoted to an in-depth study of consumer education. Mrs. Flossie M. Byrd, Director, School of Home Economics, Prairie View A. & M. College, will speak at the general session on Tuesday on "Homemaking Education for Low-Income Families."

Discussions throughout the week will be led by Mary Dickerson, assistant professor, Department of Home Economics, San Diego, California. In recognition of dedicated service in the teaching profession, the association will also honor ten school administrators from over the state, a Teacher Trainer from a college or university, and a member of the State Homemaking Staff for the leadership in vocational education. Speaker for the banquet will be newsmen Wick Fowler, president of the Child Appreciation Society, International, and Catherine Chitt Co. in Austin. Fowler was the first Texas newsmen to cover the Vietnam war. He recently returned from his second trip to Vietnam. The association's annual meeting will climax with a talk by Mrs. Virginia H. 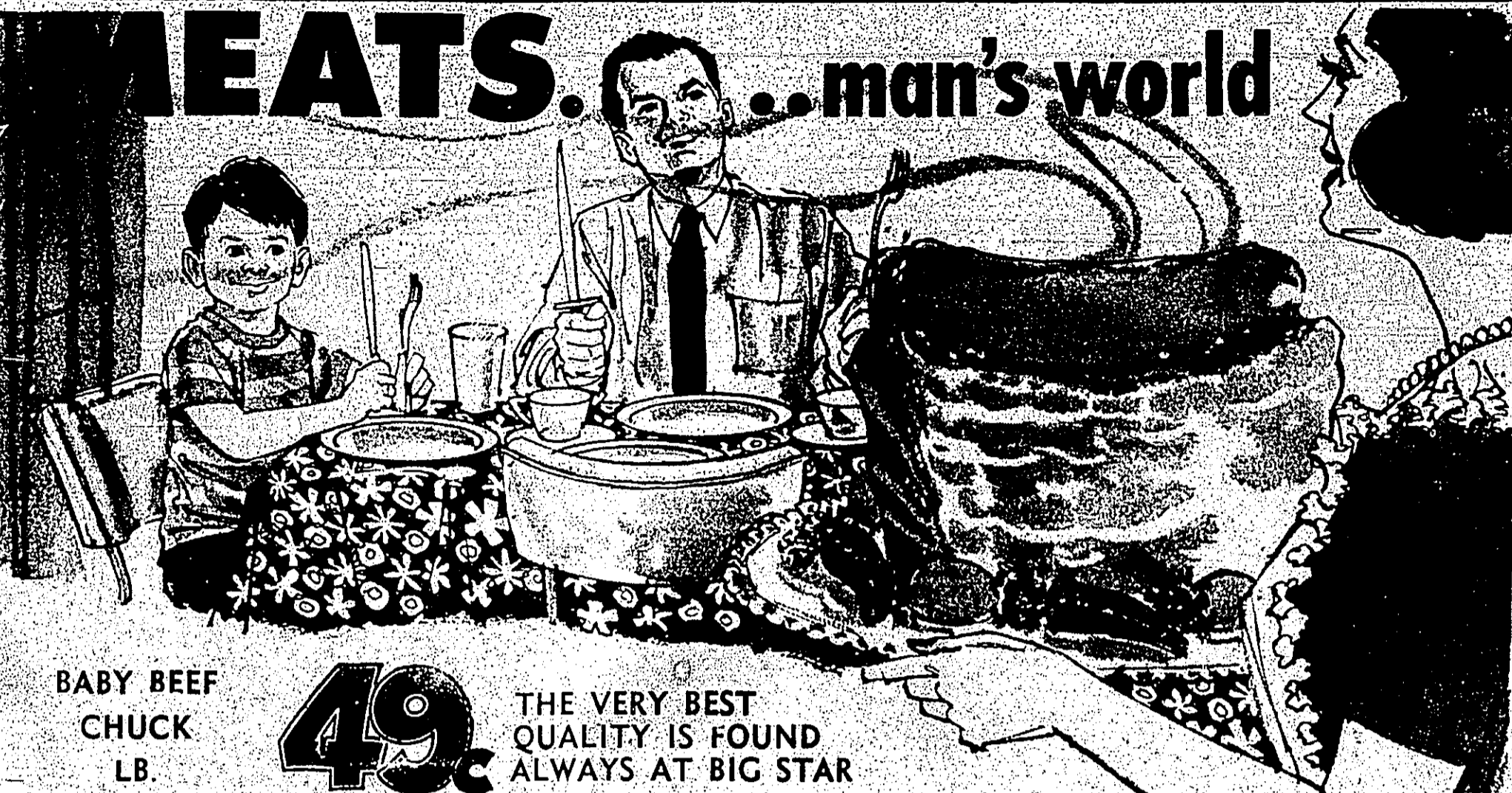
