## County Schools To Register Students Five Boys And Girls Earn Bikes

The Booster's Earn A Bike campaign is going at full speed with four more bicycles earned since the first one which was reported last week. That was Cathy Faircloth of Colmesneil, who took the honor of being the first to earn a bike.

Friday Steven Crowell of Spurger became the second bike earner and was followed closely by Sandra Fondren of Route 1, Woodville.

Saturday Steven Ray Ogden of Colmesneil came in with 35 subscribers and rode off on a super-duper' buzz rig.

Monday Paul Swearingen picked up his regular buzz bike. He was aided in selling subscriptions by his brother Bill, who already has a bicycle.

That's a total of five bicycles which have been earned by Tyler County boys and girls with the Earn A Bike campaign only in its second week. The campaign will run through September.

Another Colmesneil boy almost had a bicycle earned when he came down with the mumps. He is Clarence Davis who has sold 28 subscriptions and hopes to sell seven more as soon as

he is over his current illness. A total of 54 boys and girls picked up supplies to sell subscriptions to the Booster and earn bicycles. Eight have withdrawn and five have won bicycles, which leaves 41 still trying to earn bicycles.

Those who do not sell enough subscriptions to earn one of the bicycles from which they may choose are paid \$1.00 for each subscription sold. In that way, if a boy or girl does not get enough subscriptions to earn a bike they do earn some spending money.

# Homemaking Hints

**Impromptu parties call for careful planning.** Everyone knows it takes weeks of careful planning to have a successful dinner party. Therefore, a hostess who can entertain guests for dinner with just an hour's notice is hailed as a genius. It can be done, but it takes advanced planning. A survival kit and a small bag of tricks. 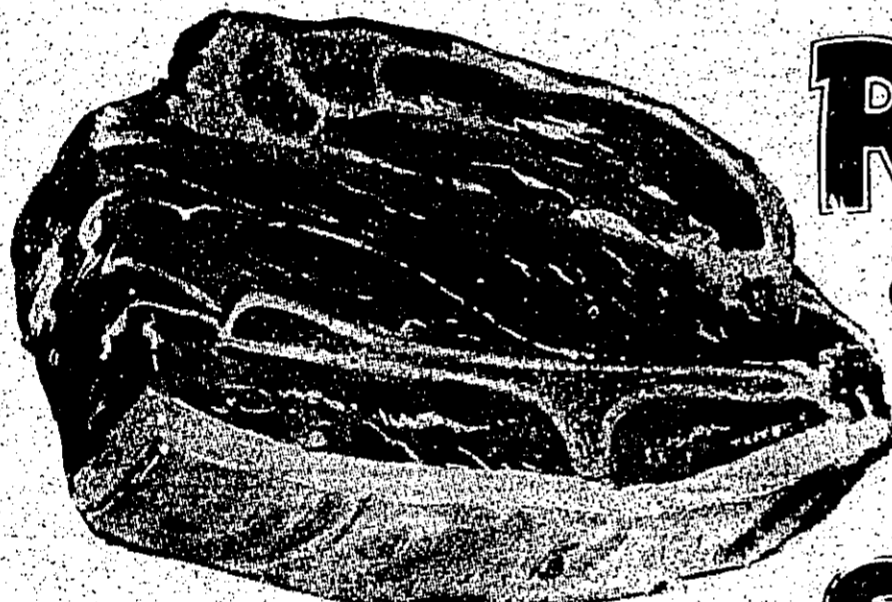

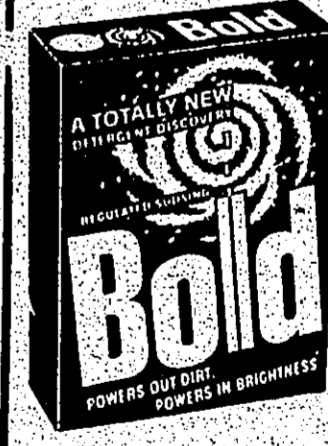
