The Peckinpaan rabblement with which the sophists and sectionists are attempting to force the immediate American withdrawal from Vietnam will be ignored in this column while we consider the course of action the average patriotic citizen can take to show his confidence in the United States.

In the muddled thinking of the moratorium supporters Nathan Hale would be defiled, and Aaron Burr immortalized. We need to take a stand for America. Veterans Day on November 11 is a fine time to consider the transvaluation of the vacuuous.

We do not feel for a moment that President Nixon had any hope that his speech Monday night would quieten to any degree the ululant voices raised by the leaders of the demonstrations, planned later this month. What he did do, and we believe this was the object of his talk, was to give the great silent majority some quiet confidence that a way will be found to end the war short of surrender.

Veterans Day will give this great majority of Americans an opportunity to demonstrate, in dignity, their support of America. They can do this by flying the flag, by burning their car headlights, or perhaps by holding a Freedom Rally in their community to coincide with the one planned by the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars in Washington.

The following concerning a letter written by a hero who gave his life in Vietnam will explain, in graphic words, what we have been trying to write. Read it—then get out Old Glory and fly it!

Army Sgt. Jeffrey A. Davis, who was killed in Vietnam on September 4, 1968, left a legacy for "the guys with the long hair and protest signs."

Mrs. Janet Davis, his bride of four months, said he wrote the letter last November 1, 1967, before he entered the service.

It was marked, "To be opened only in the event of my death."

He wrote, "It is too bad I had to die in another country. The United States is so wonderful, but at least I died for a reason—and a good one."

"I died for the guys with the long hair and the protest signs. The draft card burners, the hippies, the anti-everything people who have nothing better to do. The college kids who think they shouldn't have to serve because they are too good. I died so these people could have a little longer time to try to get straightened out in life. God knows they need it."

"I died so these members of the 'young generation' could have the right to do what they do. To protest, have long hair, go to the college of their choice, wear weird clothes, and run around mixed up with no direction at all. I died so they could protest the war I fought and died in."

"I died for the United States."

Tyler County Chamber of Commerce at the regular monthly meeting Monday night at Woodville Inn had a light agenda of business.

Malcolm Culler, chairman of arrangements for the annual Christmas party, was voted up to \$100 with which to buy candy and other items for the children. Jerry Thornton reported that he has secured several contributions for street lighting and expects to complete the fund drive soon.

Mrs. Florence Humphreys told the members that the Arts and Crafts Festival had visitors from places far and near that didn't see many of you there. She said the affair was very successful.

M. L. Alford, chamber president, who presided at the meeting, said that the Chamber of Commerce had 28 members of 3-11 and FF A who showed and played at the South Texas State Fair in Beaumont—significant accomplishment although they didn't win as blue citizens as usual.

Has Tyler County Increased In Size By 384,322 Acres?

Volume "M" of the Commissioners Court Minutes reveals that the farcical attempt to revalue and equalize the county tax base began in 1968.

Pages 358, 360 and 361 of that Volume set out three proposals or bids on the work that were evidently made in response to various and varying requests made by phone and otherwise for bids or rough estimates. The three proposals or bids were for \$65,000, \$85,000 and \$250,000. Page 385 of Volume "M" reflects that on September 30th the county Judge and the Commissioners of Precincts 1, 2 and 4 signed an appraisal contract with the low bidder, Davis and Wilson, Commissioner Fowler of Precinct 3 did not sign the contract and says he felt at the time it needed more study because of the wide spread bids.

In this contract, Paragraph 1, Davis and Wilson agree to inspect and carefully appraise, using accepted mass appraisal techniques—all real estate, land, houses—situated in Tyler County, Texas. As was stated last week they have finished and tax roll statements, based on 15% of appraised value, have been turned over to the County and approved by a majority of the Court.

Now in the past few years courts have held that almost any method of appraisal of any method of appraisal is acceptable so long as it reaches an approximately correct answer. It is abundantly unclear what the measure for correctness is. In their appraisal of Tyler County Davis and Wilson "inspected and carefully appraised" 976,872 acres of land in the County and, based on 15% of true value, came up with an assessment total of \$18,485,630. The major flaw is that the General Land Office of Texas says that there are only 592,740 acres of land in Tyler County. This is an error of 384,322 acres or about 65% in acreage assessed, and will probably result in a drop of from \$70,000 to \$100,000

in taxes, collected or collectible.

I believe that the total assessments last year were on about \$18,600,000, and that the Commissioners had to borrow money to get by. What they will be able to do or plan to do in the forthcoming year, with a \$6,000,000 to \$7,000,000 error, is assessable based is a matter of wonderment.

It should in fairness be remembered that the contract fixing the rise to this confusion was made in 1968 before the present Tax Assessor-Collector took office, so he cannot be properly charged with any of the existing problems.

Fee Abolished For Use of Boat Ramp At Cherokee Park

The boat ramp at Cherokee Park at Dam B, now can be used without paying the park entry fee, according to a letter from J. E. Singleton, executive director of the Parks and Wildlife Department.

In a letter to J. P. Miller, president of the Woodville Boating Club, Singleton said the collection point at the park has been moved back slightly so that boat club members and the public may use the boat ramp without paying the fee for entry to the park.

The Woodville Boat Club built the ramp in 1965. Cherokee Park came under state control in 1964 and an entry fee to Cherokee Park has forced boat club members and the general public to pay the fee in order to use the ramp.

Don't Wait Until Winter For Heating Equipment Check-up

Homemaking Hints

New air-conditioned tennis shoes and sneakers fit comfortably into the warm Texas fall picture. Women from Coruhra enjoy the shoe up to the top of their feet and are happy to wear them.

Coruhra is an abrasion-resistant textile, its more than twice as strong as cotton cloth of comparable thickness but weighs only half as much.

The fabric is soft to wear because it breathes through hundreds of tiny openings which let air into the feet. Shoes are machine washable in medium water temperature, non-shrinking and quick drying.

The canvas, called Jeppers, are available in sizes for women, misses, children, men and boys in several colors.

A number of fall fabrics woven with heavy rayon ravel easily. The sewing machine can help prevent raveling in several ways:

Some machines have special patterns for overcasting or edging. Use a blind hemming pattern to let the fifth overcast seam edges.

For this, reverse the usual procedure for finishing fabric under the machine. Put the edge to be finished to the left of the needle and pressure foot. Instead of to the right side, stitch one fourth inch from the edge of seam.

Adjust the machine for easy tension so the edge of the fabric is not carried from too tight tension.

For a straight stitching machine, shorten stitch to 15 stitches per inch and sew a fourth inch from the seam edge. To slow the raveling process have the needle on the seam, not over it. Whenever the finish, remember that seams should be flexible and not bulky.
