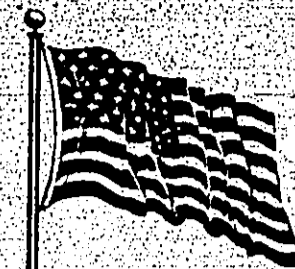

Way back in 1965, an editorial was printed in the Rock County Herald in Luverne, Minnesota, which was written by Alan McIntosh and entitled "The Tired American". We printed it here January 6, 1968, and it seems to be so appropriate today that we are reprinting it with one or two slight changes to bring it up to date.

I am a tired American. I am tired of being called the ugly American. I'm tired of having the world panhandlers use my country as a whipping boy 365 days a year.

I am a tired American, weary of having American embassies and information centers stoned, burned and sacked by mobs operating under orders from dictators who preach peace and breed conflict.

I am a tired American-weary of the beatniks who say they should have the right to determine what laws of the land they are willing to obey.

I am a tired American-fed up with the mobs of scabby-faced, long-haired youths and short-haired girls who claim they represent the "new wave" of America and who sneer at the old-fashioned virtues of honesty, integrity and morality on which America grew to greatness.

I am a tired American-weary unto death of having my tax dollars go to dictators who play both sides against the middle with threats of what will happen if we cut off the golden stream of dollars.

I am a tired American—who is tired of supporting families who haven't known any other source of income other than government relief checks for three generations.

I am a tired American—who is getting madder by the minute at the fifth spidders who have launched Americans in an obscenity race who try to foist on us the belief that fifth is an integral part of culture—in the arts, the movies, literature, the stage.

I am a tired American-weary of the bearded bums who tramp the picket lines and the sit-ins who prefer Chinese communism to capitalism who see no evil in Castro, but sneer at President Nixon as a threat to peace.

I am a tired American—who has lost all patience with that civil-rights group which is showing propaganda movies on college campuses from coast to coast. Movies denouncing the United States. Movies made in Communist China.

I am a tired American—who is angered by the self-righteous breast-beater critics of America, at home and abroad, who set impossible yardsticks for the United States, but never apply the same standards to the French, the British, the Russians, the Chinese.

I am a tired American who dislikes clergymen who have made a career out of integration causes, yet send their children to private schools.

I am a tired American who resents those who try to peddle the belief to schools and colleges that capitalism is a dirty word and that free enterprise and private initiative are only synonyms for greed. They say they hate capitalism, but they are always right at the head of the line demanding their share of the American way of life.

I am a tired American—real tired of those who are trying to sell me the belief that America is not the greatest nation in all the world—a generous-hearted nation—a nation dedicated to the policy of trying to help the "have-nots" achieve some of the good things that our system of free enterprise brought about.

I am an American who gets a lump in his throat when he hears the "Star-Spangled Banner" and who holds back tears when he hears those chilling high notes of the brass trumpets when Old Glory reaches the top of the flagpole.

I am a tired American who thanks a merciful Lord that he was so lucky to be both an American citizen—a nation under God, truly with mercy and justice for all.

Deer hunters opened the season this past weekend with a number of nice bucks to show for their efforts but generally the number reported killed was below average.

The season opened at sunrise Saturday and hunters were out early in large numbers.

Wayne Smith, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Smith of Woodville, got his first deer Saturday morning, a 10-pointer, at the family's camp out of Colmesnell. Later in the day Wayne also downed a wolf. His grandfather, Lawrence Smith, took a picture of Wayne's kills and if the pictures turn out he says we can print them.

J. D. Spurlock, the Star Route mail carrier, out of Woodville, downed a nice 9-pointer on the Jimmy David Spurlock lease off the Chester highway. It field dressed 102 pounds.

Steve Evans, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lindsey Evans of Warren, got a five point deer while hunting near Warren.

Coed Stewart, hunting on the L.L. Ranch in Polk County, brought in a 9-point buck Saturday.

Billy Ray Phillips, hunting west of Woodville with D. B. Dean, Jack Arrant and Ralph Winter, came in before noon Saturday with an eight point buck.

Dan Kent, hunting east of Woodville, brought in the largest deer so far. It had eight points but field dressed 128 pounds.

Marvin Ray Godeaux, age 12, brought in a buck with ten points and which field dressed 122 pounds Saturday morning. He killed it in the Dies community in Tyler County.

Also in the Dies community, Clyde Frazier killed a six-pointer and Raymond Lee Davis a four-pointer. They were hunting with Thomas Lee McCullough.

In the Shady Grove community pasture in Tyler County Jerry McKee downed a nine-point buck which field dressed 105 pounds. He was hunting with Bobby Lilley. Jerry was using a 30-30 Marlin and shot the deer at 150 yards. It ran 85 yards after being shot.

Tuesday we heard of a 16-point buck killed in Polk County.

In addition to deer, hunters have reported killing three wolves and one bobcat.

Gene Bevin shot a large male wolf in his pasture in the Dies community and Robert Borell killed a younger male wolf in the same area. Another wolf was reported shot in the area but the name of the hunter was not learned.

The bobcat was shot by Jeff Griffin while on a deer stand in the Dies community. He and others were hunting with dogs when they jumped the bobcat and evidently had quit running it. Jeff heard something walking in the leaves and thought it was his dog returning to him. He looked around in a few minutes and saw that it was the wildcat.

## Nine Charged In Game Law Violations

Two men charged with hunting wild deer at night entered pleas of guilty before Justice of the Peace Joe Loggins Saturday and were fined \$117.50. One was from the Colmesnell area and the other from Port Neches.

Seven men who were camped near Bush Lake in the Fred area entered not guilty pleas to charges of possession of an illegal deer in Judge Loggins court Saturday. The men had an animal carcass covered with ice and water when arrested by Game Officer R. B. Reynolds.

When arraigned before Judge Loggins, each of the men contended the animal was a goat and not a deer. The carcass has been sent to a laboratory for testing.

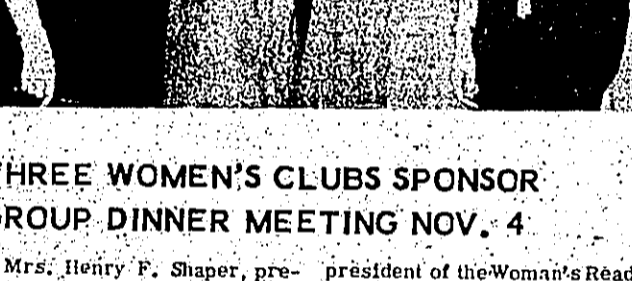

### Homemaking Hints

Thinking, Mrs. Moore, late November through February is the best time to plant trees, shrubs, vines, and perennials. The soil is still warm, and the plants have time to establish roots before winter sets in.

When planting trees, dig a hole two to three times as wide as the root ball. The hole should be deep enough to allow the top of the root ball to be at the same level as the ground surface.

Plant trees in the shade of a building or a fence to protect them from the wind. Water trees regularly during the first year.

For indoor plants, place them in a sunny window. Water them when the soil is dry to the touch. Prune them regularly to keep them bushy.

For house cleaning, use a mixture of vinegar and water to clean windows and mirrors. Use a solution of baking soda and water for scrubbing.

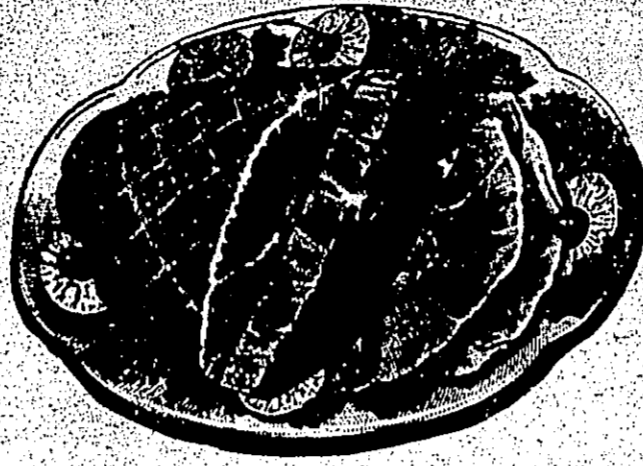

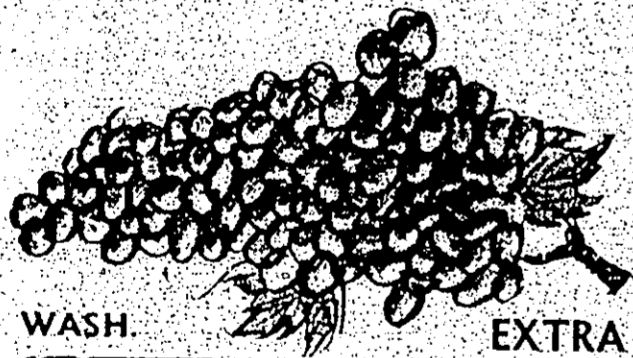

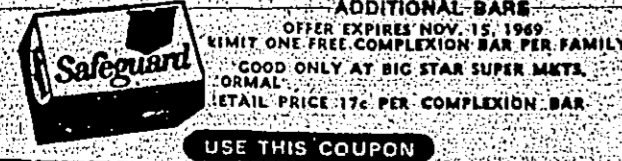
