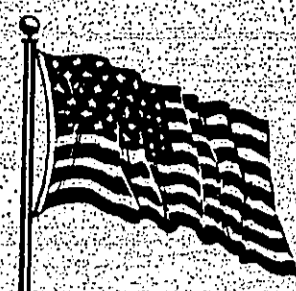

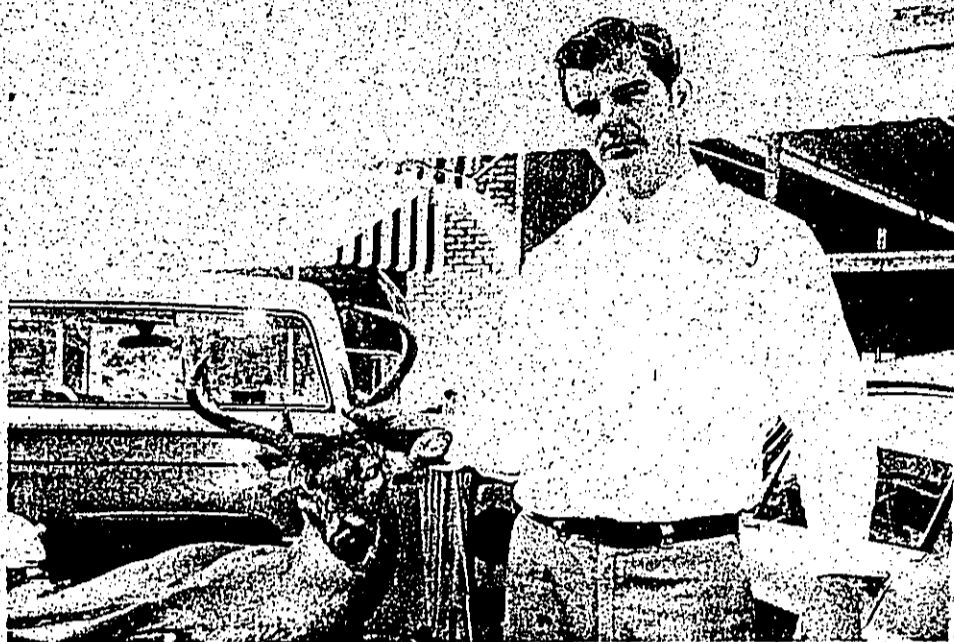
The more sales volume we have here, the better selection of merchandise local stores can offer. The better the merchants can afford to support civic projects, schools, churches.

Two Enter Wide Rack Contest

Two hunters have brought bucks which were killed in Tyler County to the Booster office this week to officially enter them in the contest for the widest spread of antlers which was announced by last week's Booster.

The Booster and business firms listed below are sponsoring the contest which will run through the deer season in Tyler County which ends January 1.

To enter the contest, a hunter must have killed the deer in Tyler County and must bring it by the Booster office at 104 South Charlton to have its antlers measured at their widest place.

A total of \$100 in prizes is offered. The hunter with the buck with the widest rack will receive a \$50 cash prize, second widest \$25, third widest \$15 and fourth widest \$10.

In case two or more sets of antlers measure the same width to result in a tie, either for first place or in any of the others, the prize money will be equally divided among those tying.

Merchants and business firms participating with the Booster:

The two sets of antlers entered in the contest were brought by the Booster office by Nolan Conner, whose set measured 14 inches, and J. W. Cammack of Nederland, who had a 13-1/2 inch set of antlers on his buck.

Grand Jury Critical

What may be a record number of divorces at one session of 88th District Court here were granted Monday by Judge H. A. Coe.

Eleven divorce suits were heard and granted, most of them uncontested.

Judge Coe also heard several motions for summary judgments and accepted the plea of guilty of one defendant in a criminal case.

The defendant, George Rupert Crosby, charged with cow theft, received a two year probationary sentence.

The June-November term grand jury also made its report to Judge Coe in which it was critical of the county's judicial processes. The report follows:

We recommend that succeeding grand juries continue to examine these matters from regular docket audits prepared by the County Auditor.

We recommend that our Sheriff's Department and Commissioners' Court give consideration to the placing of at least one Negro man on our County Law Enforcement Staff.

We appreciate the cooperation of all County Officials during our deliberations.

Two Attend Crime Prevention Clinic In Crockett

City councilman Gardner F. Parks and assistant police chief Ed Sumerall attended a Crime Prevention Clinic held in Crockett Wednesday, November 19.

This clinic was sponsored by the Houston County Development Foundation and the Deep East Texas Development Council and was conducted in the Crockett community center.

Among the problems studied were check fraud, shoplifting, pilferage and burglary, crimes especially prevalent during the holiday season. Four films were shown depicting these subjects and a panel discussion followed, led by Ned Patton, Jr. Houston County attorney.



ATOMIC WORLD

Billy Charles Mikeska performs a more sophisticated version of the bean trick in a "This Atomic World" demonstration to be given December 3 at Kirby High School.

The Atomic Energy Commission designed the program. It is presented in Texas schools by Texas A&M University and Oak Ridge Associated Universities. Billy Charles Mikeska conducts the 40-minute program.

Using student terms, Mikeska will describe structure of atoms, nuclear reactor operation, radiation, fission and fusion.

He will use special electronic equipment in demonstrating sources of radiation, how nuclear energy is harnessed to generate electricity and use of radiotopes for study of life processes, diagnosis and treatment of diseases.

A blackboard talk to Kirby High science classes will furnish students more detail on atomic structure, radioactivity, radiation biology, and nuclear science careers.

Mikeska trained with the AEC at Oak Ridge, Tenn. He is a graduate of Sul Ross State College in Alpine and taught in Texas schools 14 years.

Starting his scouting experiences in Cub Scouts in 1962, Mike joined the Boy Scouts in 1965. At the age of thirteen he was awarded scouting's highest honor—the Eagle Scout Award. Since then he has earned the Gold Eagle Palm.

Mike has attended Junior Leader Training Camp, and as a member of the Order of the Arrow he attended the Region 9B Conference at Sam Houston College this past summer. He also attended the National Boy Scout Jamboree held at Farragut State Park, Idaho in July, 1969.

He was selected as a Patrol Leader in one of the troops that represented the Trinity-Neches Council at the Jamboree.

Active in school activities, Mike is a sophomore student in Kirby High School. He is an honor student, a member of the Student Council, and assistant editor of the school paper.

He is a member of St. Lawrence Catholic Church.

The Vice President's address has now served to bring the issue squarely before us on a national basis, and it has sparked a dialogue between representatives of the various news media, public officials and the people.

This dialogue will be significant even if it serves only as a reminder to each individual news reporter and broadcast commentator of the broader responsibility he must shoulder as a journalist.

The journalist holds a unique position in the American democratic system. His daily efforts to report to the citizen the activities of government contribute his most vital link between elected officials and the people.
