Indians To Install Lifetime Chief Thursday

Parade To Be On TV Thursday

The Sugar Bowl Parade in which the Kirby High School band marched Tuesday night as representative of Texas will be shown on the ABC television network at 10:00 Thursday morning. Local outlets are KBMT, channel 12, in Beaumont and KTRE, channel 9, Lufkin.

The parade was taped Tuesday night for televising New Year's morning.

The band left Tuesday morning for New Orleans and participated in the parade at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday. The KHS band was one of 18 marching units in the parade which also featured 20 floats.

The band traveled to New Orleans in two chartered buses. The band truck, which carried the instruments, and several private automobiles made the trip.

While in New Orleans, the 88 band members were guests of the Sugar Bowl Committee at a dinner following the parade, a breakfast today (Thursday) and a boat ride on the Mississippi River New Year's Eve.

The band members will have reserved seats at today's Sugar Bowl game which pits the Kansas Razorbacks against Mississippi. The group will leave for Woodville following the game.

Besides Band Director Jerry W. Brown and wife, adults making the trip are Mrs. Sam Robles, president of the Band Boosters' Club; Mr. and Mrs. Dee Fortenberry, Jose Cordeiro, Mrs. R. A. Jernigan, Gerald Maynard, Jack Risinger, Mrs. John Bowen, Mrs. Jamie Pike, Mrs. Gayle Burton, Mrs. Mayme Canada and Mrs. E. G. Sheffield.

The band's trip to the Sugar Bowl was first announced in early December when Director Brown received a letter from the Sugar Bowl officials inviting it to represent Texas in the parade. Funds for the trip was contributed by the Band Boosters' Club, service clubs, and business establishments in the county.

Fulton Battise, "Mikko Atakola" (Second Chief)—for 35 years to become "Mikko Choba" (Big Chief) on January 1, 1970. Born March 16, 1909

and has lived on the Reservation all of his life. He is a timberman that can fell a tall pine tree on a dime. He has been a dedicated leader of his people and of the Indian Church.

The Tribesmen of the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation will hold the Inaugural Ceremony for the Installation of Lifetime Chiefs on January 1, 1970 at Texas only Indian Reservation, 17 miles East of Livingston on U. S. Highway 190.

This is a once in a Lifetime occasion seldom witnessed. Few organized Tribes have Chiefs as in yesteryear. The last Traditional Tribal Chiefs Ceremony took place in 1936, when Cooper Sylestine was made "Mikko Choba" (Big Chief) and Fulton Battise "Mikko Atakola" (Second Chief).

Chief Cooper Sylestine died in February of 1969 at the age of 89 and Tribal members have selected Fulton Battise as "Mikko Choba" and elections are being held for "Mikko Atakola". The public is invited to share in the Ceremony that will take place in the same manner as performed through hundreds of years of history.

At 10:30 a.m., January 1st, Congressman John Dowdy, Senator Charles Wilson, Representative John Hannah, Representative Dave Allred and Texas Indian Commission Chairman Dempster Henley will open the Ceremony with welcoming addresses and at 11:00 a.m. the men of the Indian Clans, the Medicine Man and a former "Mikko" (Little Chief) Clem Fain, will begin the colorful ritual of installing New Chiefs.

After the ceremony, which will be over by noon, the barbecue building, dining room, museum and all activities will be open.

Tex-La Neches Singing To Be Held Here Jan. 17-18

The annual session of the Tex-La Neches Valley Singing Convention will be held in the Kirby High School auditorium in Woodville Saturday and Sunday, January 17 and 18, under the sponsorship of the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce.

On Friday night, January 16, a concert will be presented in the auditorium by several well-known gospel singing quartets.

The Friday night quartet concert was initiated three years ago by the late Burl Carter and has proven to be one of the most popular features of the singing convention.

Also scheduled is an afternoon session Saturday, January 17, for young people. This was started last year and proved very successful.

The Saturday night session will begin at 7:00 p.m. and will feature quartets, groups, and congregational singing.

The Sunday morning session will begin with a short devotional service, and will recess at noon for lunch. Singing will

resume in the afternoon with the usual schedule for quartets, congregational singing, and groups.

Following the death of Burl Carter, longtime president of the Tex-La Neches Valley Singing Convention, Jesse Harper of Jasper was elected president and the organization's permanent home was continued in Woodville. However, instead of two sessions annually the group voted to have only one session annually in January.

Bob Bell, chairman of the local arrangements committee, said this week that the Band Boosters Club of Kirby High School has taken over the concessions for the session in January and will serve food and refreshments at all sessions.

Savings And Loan Authorized To Issue 6% Certificates

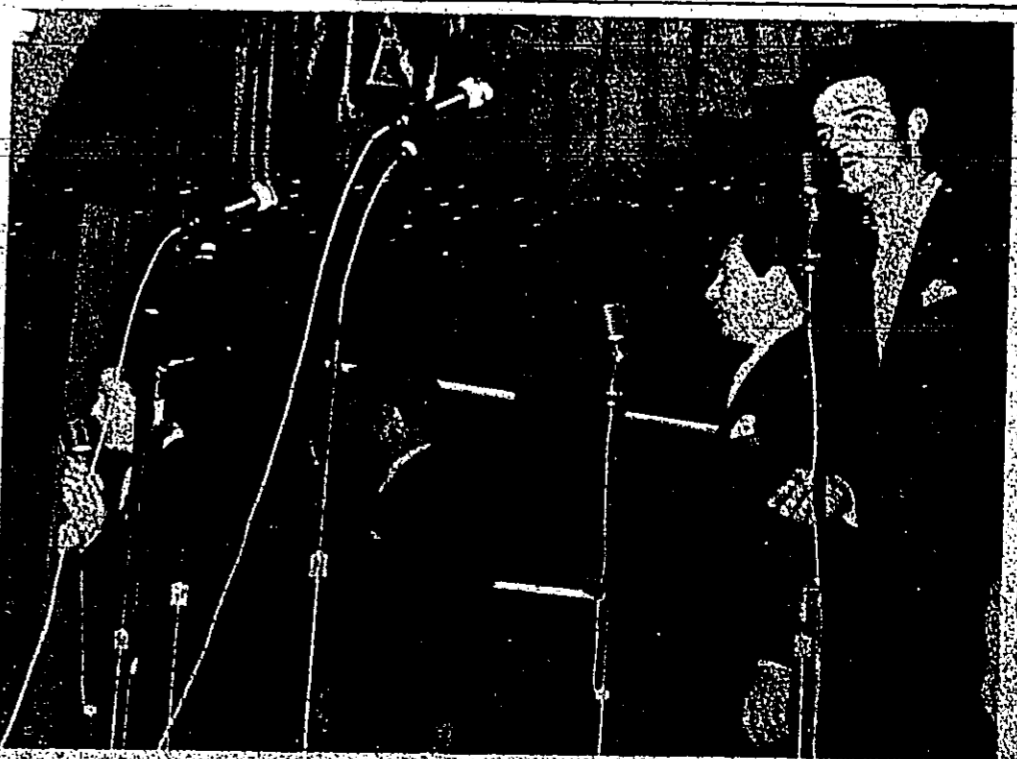

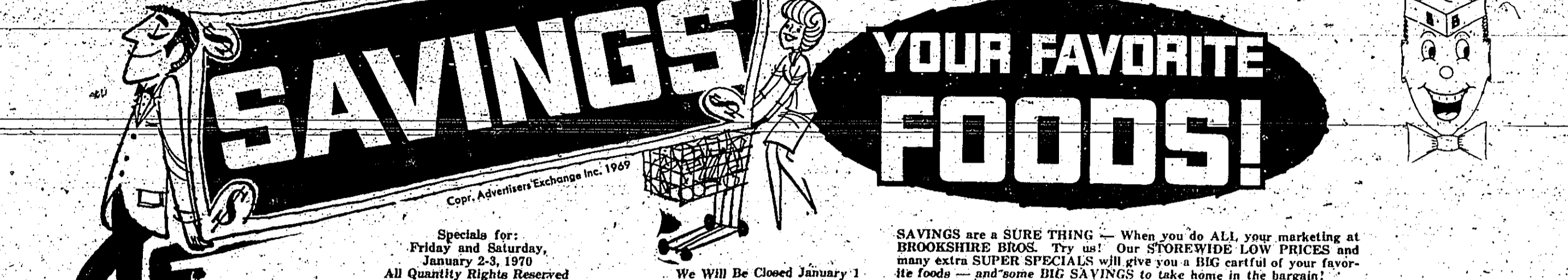

A certified check will be mailed to winner after they are announced in the Tyler County Booster on January 8, 1970.

The same rules will apply in each prize category and the width of the rack will determine the winner in all cases. The number of points will not be taken into consideration.
