(The following is taken from the Lima (Ohio) News and gives one fighting man's views of the Vietnam war. It was sent our way by former Woodville resident Jerry Gafford):

The Christmas "Star of Peace" is one more paradoxical grim jest that marks our modern existence once again shone over Vietnam this past week, calendar another year in the struggle now several decades long that has ravaged the southeastern Asian nation.

And once again Lima's J. Gregg Mikesell, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edwin E. Mikesell, 84 Sherwood Ct., finds himself spending another Christmas season amid the blood, stench, filth, humidity, heat and death. It is his second duty tour in South Vietnam.

In December 1966, he was 2nd Lt. Mikesell, a shavetail Army infantry officer wounded twice and decorated with the Bronze Star and Purple Heart.

He returned to this country to his family and his Korean wife Azea Kim, also residing in Lima. He underwent helicopter pilot training, was advanced to captain and went back to war.

Earlier this month word was received Capt. Mikesell was awarded the Air Medal for Valor and five other air medals.

Capt. Mikesell knows exactly why he's in Vietnam and why the United States are fighting this war. But the captain is also "confused" and admitted it in a letter this past week to News city editor George Dunster.

"I know there are many sad stories of Vietnam and I truly can understand how our people at home could believe them. I know that right now there are people in Lima that are confused about the My Lai story (site of alleged U.S. troops' massacre of Vietnamese civilians) and I can understand that."

"What confuses me is the lack of stories about all the good that has been done by our men here." Capt. Mikesell wrote.

Rep. Don Adams On Committee To Study Penal Code

Speaker G. F. (Gus) Mutscher has asked State Representative Don Adams of Jasper to serve as a member of the House Criminal Law Study Committee.

State Representatives James E. Nugent of Kerrville, chairman of the committee, and H. Tati Santisteban of El Paso will also be members of the committee to study the code of criminal procedure and the revision of the penal code.

District Attorney Carol S. Vance of Houston has been appointed by Speaker Mutscher to serve on the committee. The defense attorney to serve as a committee member will be Phil Burleson of Dallas, a partner in the law firm of Abney and Burleson.

According to the resolution which creates the committee, H.S.R. 488, "the magnitude and number of problems within the criminal jurisprudence of this state encountered by the Criminal Law Study Committee (created during the 60th Legislature and headed by Representative Nugent) were such that the committee was not able to complete its study and, continued study in this field is considered of vital necessity to the continued well-being and development of the State of Texas."

Top Gospel music quartets, groups, and scores of singers will raise their voices in song here Friday night, Saturday and Sunday before as many as 5,000 listeners during the annual session of the country's largest Gospel singing organization, the Tex-La Neches Valley Singing Convention.

The event, sponsored by the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce, will take place in the Kirby High School auditorium. The first and one of the more popular sessions will be the Quartets Concert Friday night. At least eight popular Gospel music quartets, including the Sons of Calvary, are expected to arrive Friday for this session, which will begin at 7:00 p.m. There is no charge for any of the sessions, but donations will be accepted at the quartet concert Friday night to help the various quartets in expenses in coming here.

Among the well-known quartets coming this year, in addition to the Sons of Calvary, are the Singing Taylor Family of Mississippi, the Conn Family of Dallas, and the Harris Family of Lutkin.

The Youth Session, another popular feature, will be held Saturday at 1:30 p.m. under the direction of Gary Davis, who is Louisiana vice president of the organization. Adults are urged to attend also.

The Saturday session will begin at 6:30 a.m. and will feature well-known quartets, singing groups, song leaders and individual singers. The Saturday night session usually has an overflow of singers and those attending are urged to come early to get good seats.

Jess Harper, president of the singing convention, has reported that singing groups from at least five states have indicated they will be present. Music publishing and record firms will have displays and representatives at the three sessions.

The Sunday session will begin at 9:30 a.m. and continue through the day with a break at noon. A short devotional service will be held prior to the noon recess. The Band Boosters Club will serve sandwiches and drinks at all sessions.

Jess Harper of Jasper is president of Tex-La Neches Valley Singing Convention. Vice president is Gary Davis of Louisiana. Other officers are: Miss Irma Duncan, Louisiana secretary; Miss Carli Stewart is Texas secretary and Mrs. Jackie Harper is treasurer.

Special committee chairman are Dick Davis, concessions; Wyatt Bell, electronics and sound; Dave Woodmore, building and grounds; Miss Noellene Rawls, registration; and the hospitality committee consists of Jimmie Brown, D. V. Felps; Walter Fox and E. F. Havard.

Commissioners In Annual Session

The Tyler County commissioners court Monday began its annual session during which it sets salaries, makes courthouse policy, and confers with other county officers regarding clerks and deputies.

The Monday morning session was short as the court recessed to attend a funeral. They resumed that afternoon and recessed until Tuesday.

In salary discussions the commissioners indicated they will continue the present salary schedule of elected officials. They were due to take up the matter of increases for clerks and deputies before the session is adjourned.

The first meeting of each year is designated as the one in which the court makes a number of decisions, and often the court meets several days before adjourning.

Decisions of the court on salaries and other matters will be carried in next week's Booster if the commissioners have adjourned by that time.

Four Members Of Board Of Trustees To Be Elected

The terms of four members of the board of trustees of the Woodville Independent School District will expire this year and will be filled at an election on April 3.

Usually school board candidates are announced in late February or March, the date of the election and the vacancies were brought to public attention this week when John Spanhanks, pastor of Fairview Baptist Church, announced that he will be a candidate for one of the places to be filled.

Members whose terms expire are W. S. Jarrott, board president; W. S. Nichols, L. G. Burton, and Jim Galney. Mr. Galney was appointed last year when Jim Parks moved from the district and according to law the remainder of the term will be filled in the election in April.

Spanhanks did not indicate which place he will fill in the election.

Two Commissioners To Have Opponents

Confests developed this week in the commissioners races for both precinct two and precinct four in Tyler County.

James R. (Bo) Jordan announced that he will seek re-election. Filing for the same office was Adnell Odom, also of Spurlock, who has been serving with the Tyler County sheriff's department.

In precinct two a candidate filed for the position now held by H. H. Powell, who last week announced for re-election. He is H. M. Parks.

Last week the other incumbent office holders whose terms expire at the end of this year announced that they will seek re-election with one exception. County Judge Jeff R. Mooney told the Booster that he will retire from the office at the end of his current term.

Employer Deadline For W-2 Forms Is February 2

Employers were reminded today by the Internal Revenue Service that employers must prepare two copies of a W-2, Form W-2, on or before February 2, 1970.

Wesley C. DeLocher, administrative officer of the Internal Revenue Service at Jasper, said this statement shows the total wages paid and the income tax and Social Security tax withheld. If any during the calendar year 1969, total wages shown on an employer's W-2 must include amounts received as sick pay. Sick pay is not required to be shown separately.

If it becomes necessary to correct a W-2 after it has been given to an employee, a revised statement must be issued and marked "corrected by employer."

W-2s have to be filed with income tax returns. Taxpayers who had more than one job last year should attach all W-2s to the back and top of their Form 1040 return.

New Vehicle Registration Is Easy To Follow?

The Texas Highway Department is sporting a red face. In recent news releases announcing the new computerized motor vehicle registration system, Department Information specialists write:

"Easy-to-follow instructions are printed on the three-part form."

The Department has gone to the new system, which includes an order-by-mail program for obtaining 1970 motor vehicle license plates.

But just to make sure that motorists do understand the "easy-to-follow instructions," they are:

1. Each motorist whose vehicle was registered last year has or will receive in the mail a long, narrow envelope with a printed message on the front

reading: "Important -- This is Your License Plate Renewal Application."

2. The envelope will contain a three-part form. Do not separate the three parts.
3. You may renew your motor vehicle license registration during January and February by mailing the three-part form (attached) and your check to the tax collector's office or substitution.
4. You may renew your motor vehicle license registration during February and March by taking the three-part form (attached) and your check to the tax collector's office or substitution.

That's it. Now see if you are one of the seven million-plus Texas motorists who can follow these "easy-to-follow" instructions.

EASY FRUIT COBBLER
Canned fruit cocktail and refrigerator biscuits make this cobbler a snap to make.
Quick Cobbler Compote
4 tablespoons sugar
1/2 tablespoon corn starch
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
1 (1-pint, 13 ounce) can fruit cocktail
1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
1 can refrigerated pan-ready biscuits
1 tablespoon margarine, melted
Mix 2 tablespoons of the sugar, corn starch, and 1/4 teaspoon of the cinnamon in saucpan. Mix a small amount of juice from fruit into corn starch mixture, then stir in remaining juice, fruit and rind. Bring to boil, stirring constantly. Pour into 1/2 quart baking dish. Top with biscuits brushed with margarine. Mix remaining sugar with cinnamon and sprinkle over biscuits. Bake in 425°F. (hot) oven about 20 minutes. Makes 6 servings.

Texas Forest Fire Laws
Burning Woodland or Prairie
Article 1331, Vernon's Penal Code
Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person negligently to set on fire, or cause to be set on fire any woods, forest, timber, range, or grassland, or to set on fire, or cause to be set on fire, any brush, range, or grassland belonging to himself, and allowing such fire to spread to the property of another.

Section 2. Failure to prevent such fire from spreading to the property of another shall be prima facie evidence of negligence.



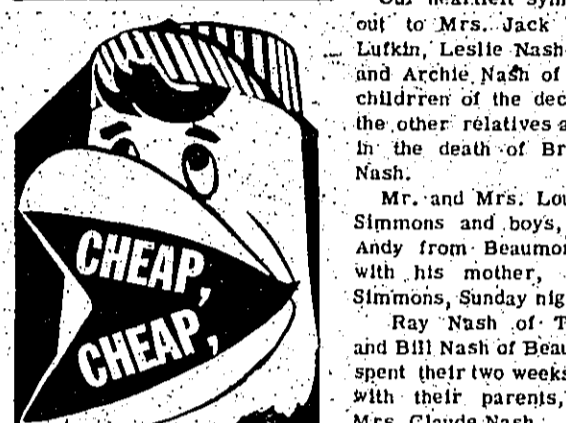

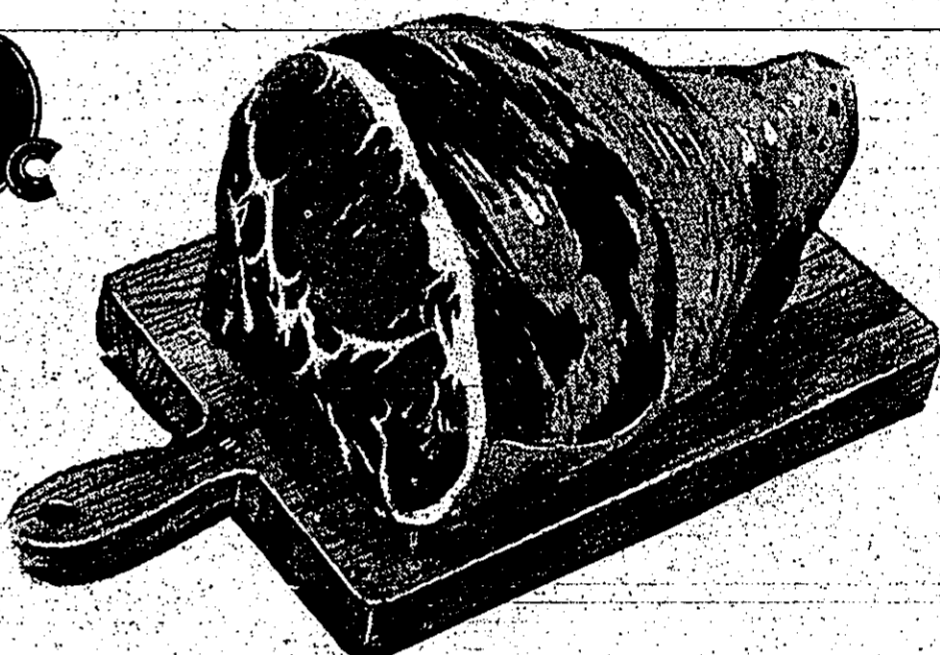
