## Fishing Tourney Slated At Dam B

The annual Southeast Texas Bass Fishing Tournament at Dam B Lake will be held March 19, 20 and 21, according to C. A. Williams Sporting Goods, sponsor.

The tournament offers outstanding trophies for all winners with prizes given for most bass caught by an individual, largest bass caught; most bass caught by any two men team (trophy to each team member); and most bass caught by a husband and wife team.

According to the rules, each team may fish only one of the three qualifying days, March 19, 20, and 21. Top 50 percent of the anglers on these three

days will advance to the finals on Sunday, March 22.

Winners, except for largest bass, will be determined on the basis of their catch made on final day. Entries for largest bass may be entered on either a qualifying day or the final day.

All state fishing laws, including limit rules, must be observed by the contestants.

Only artificial lures and casting, spinning or fly equipment must be used.

Contestants must register on the day they wish to qualify at the official weigh-in station, C. A. Williams Sporting Goods. Fishing will begin at daylight and all catches must

be weighed in at Williams by 6:30 p.m. on qualifying day and by 4:30 p.m. on the final day.

All bass must be at least 12 inches in length to be eligible, and winners will be determined by the weight of their fish.

They must be brought in for weighing before being drawn and gutted.

Williams said that contestants will fish in teams of two and that each entry blank must carry the names of two contestants along with the entry fee of \$4.00 (\$2 for each contestant).

Interested persons may pick up a complete set of the contest rules at C. A. Williams Sporting Goods at Dam B.

## Bond Election Set By Council

The Woodville City Council at its meeting Monday night passed an order for the issuance of \$20,000 in water revenue bonds and the second for the issuance of \$200,000 in revenue bonds for the sewer system extension and expansion.

Two propositions will appear on the ballot, the first at the city hall and appoints Wood Fain as presiding judge and Mrs. Neil Fuller as alternate presiding judge. The presiding judge is authorized to appoint three clerks to assist in holding the election.

Two boxes will be maintained at the election with ballots of qualified taxpaying voters who have duly rendered property

for taxation being placed in one, and the other used for non-taxpaying voters.

The council passed the order for the election following several weeks of discussion on utility rates for a proposed chicken processing plant for Angelina Poultry Company, now located in Lufkin. The company's Lufkin plant is antiquated and they will have to build a modern plant somewhere under an August 1 deadline set by the U. S. Department of Agriculture. Over \$300,000 of the bond issue is to finance facilities to serve the poultry plant.

The council's order for the election is printed as a legal notice in another part of this issue of the Booster and interested citizens may refer to it. (See page five and six.)

Councilmen also set a meeting for next Monday night at which time the method of retirement, the full cost to the city and other pertinent details of the issuance of the bonds will be set forth in an organized manner for publication in the Booster. All members of the council and Mayor Jimmy Freeman said they wanted to give the city's voters the full story so that they could have the facts before them when voting on the issuance of the bonds.

This action followed a statement by Councilmen T. L. Guyley and Clay Miller that stories in the Booster during the past three weeks might mislead the voters.

In other business, the council again discussed the request of Southwestern Bell Telephone Company for a rate increase here. After hearing Bell District Manager Jack Martin answer questions by councilmen and City Attorney Joe Wheat, the decision on the rate increase was again put off until a later meeting.

The council voted to buy a new radar unit to replace a wornout one in the city patrol car.

### Join Pollution Fight

Tyler County commissioners at its regular meeting Monday accepted the low bid of Gulf Oil Company to furnish gasoline, fuel and oil for continuity use during the year.

The commissioners also adopted a resolution regarding sanitary landfill, garbage disposal areas on county wide basis; to promote county wide planning for water and sewage disposal; and to make an all out effort to remove and keep trash off roads and highways.

Copies of the resolutions were sent to President Nixon, Governor Smith, U. S. Senators Towers and Yarborough, Congressmen Wright Patman and John Dowdy, and the Deep East Texas Development Council.

The resolution was prompted by the current concern by national and state agencies with the water and air pollution problems which is considered to be serious.





