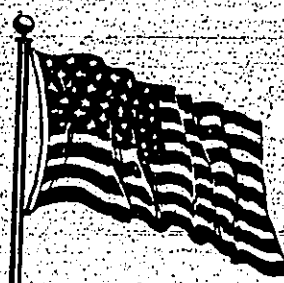

Warren School Bond Vote Set

Voters in the Warren Independent School District will cast ballots in an election called for May 27 in which two propositions will be decided. If Proposition 1, voters will be asked to approve the removal of the ceiling limit of five percent on bonds in the amount of \$1,800,000 voted in 1967 and not issued due to lawsuit involving an oil company. At that time, there was a ceiling of five percent on such bonds and today's bond market interest rate is higher. The second proposition is for approval of an additional \$500,000 in bonds to supplement the \$1.8 million voted in 1967.

Three voting boxes will be open on May 27 for the bond election. Precinct one is in the Warren High School building, Precinct two in the auditorium of Fred Elementary School, and Precinct three at the Long Station Methodist Church in Village Mills. Polls will be open from 8 a.m. until 7 p.m. Absentee voting is in the superintendent's office at Warren with Mrs. Joan Brackin as clerk. Office hours are 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 12:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. except on Saturdays, Sundays and official holidays.

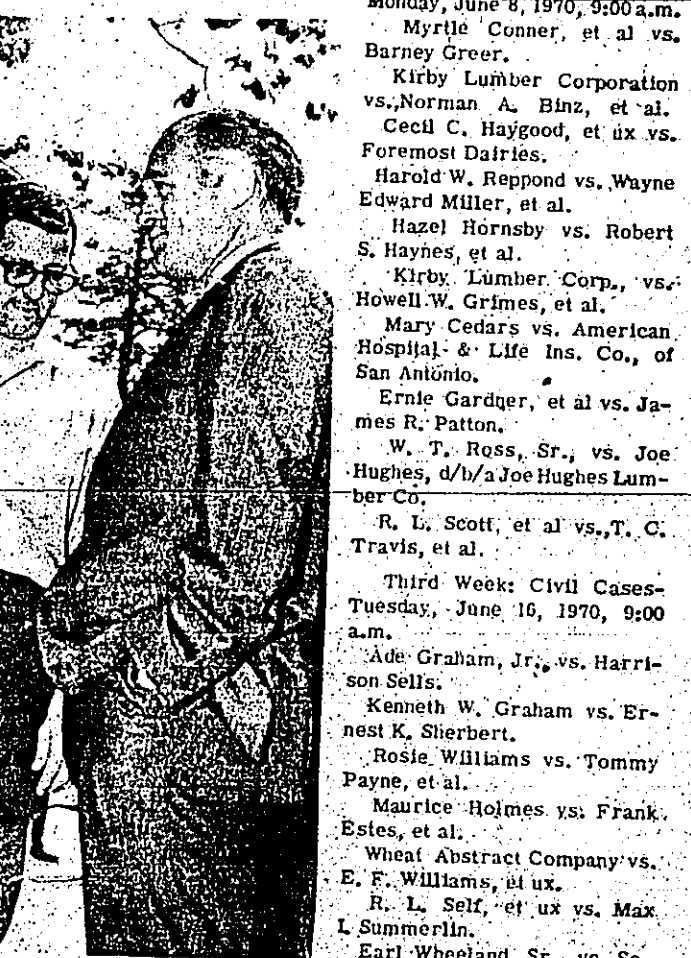

Gov. Preston Smith proclaimed the week of May 23-30 for the annual Buddy Poppy sales of VFW posts and auxiliaries throughout Texas.

Gov. Smith said, "Proceeds from the sale of Buddy Poppies are used for the benefit of the men now serving in the Armed Forces, needy war veterans, and orphans and widows of deceased veterans."

"This annual sale of Poppies gives our citizens an opportunity to show their gratitude to those who have served in the Armed Forces to preserve our liberty and freedoms. Therefore, I, as Governor of Texas do hereby designate the week of May 23-30 as VFW Buddy Poppy Week in Texas, and urge every person to buy and wear a Buddy Poppy during this period."

Buddy Poppies will be sold in Woodville Saturday, according to G. P. H. Riehl, District 19 commander. He urged the public to support the sale and pointed out that the VFW has only this once-a-year project to assist in its aid to needy veterans, widows and children.
