

Area Boy Scouts To Raise Flags Memorial Day

Members of the Boy Scouts of America in this area will be involved in patriotic happenings on Memorial Day, Flag Day, and Independence Day as part of a nationwide patriotism expression by the Nation's largest youth organization.

Scout units are being asked to provide an honor guard for the flag raisings at all public buildings in the 13 county area of the Three Rivers Council, according to H. R. Sontag, Council President.

Each flag-raising ceremony will include the Pledge of Allegiance, an appropriate prayer, and the reading of a letter to the North Vietnamese government.

In addition, over 15,000 Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Explorers, and adult volunteer leaders will be asked to display the flag at home.

"Our Scout units will demonstrate their deep concern over the treatment of American prisoners of war by writing a letter to the president of the Republic of North Vietnam in Hanoi," Sontag said. "To urge humane treatment, the release of all names of men being held as prisoners of war, inspection of prisoner-of-war camps by appropriate international agencies, and to allow prisoners to write and receive mail."

Two Too Many Coral Snakes

Reports of two more coral snakes having been killed in the area were made this week. The colorful little snakes are extremely poisonous and regular snakebite anti-venom does not work on their bites. The coral snake's poison attacks the nerves of the victim and it is necessary to get special anti-venom from the State Department of Health in Austin. 




