### Summer Remedial School To Begin Here Monday

The Woodville Independent School District will operate a remedial summer school program beginning June 8. The program will operate eight weeks on the secondary level and six weeks on the elementary level.

On the senior high school level, remedial work will be offered in English, history, and mathematics. The summer program is open only to those pupils who have failed a course or who need to repeat a course to improve a grade.

On the junior high level, remedial work will be offered in English and mathematics. On the elementary level, remedial work will be offered in reading and mathematics for pupils in grades 4-6.

All levels of work will be taught in the Kirby High School building. Classes will begin at 8:00 each morning and will generally last two hours. The summer school day will end at 12:00 noon. There will be no tuition charge.

Pupils will register June 8. Registration will be limited to the number of pupils and classes as defined by accreditation standards and will be limited only to pupils of the Woodville district.

Unofficial returns showed that proposition one, for the issuance of \$1.8 million in bonds total in 1967, was defeated 526 to 277. Proposition two, for the issuance of another \$500,000 in bonds, lost by 466 to 217.

## Post Office To Curtail Service

It is a known fact that the United States has the best and cheapest postal service in the world today.

However, increased cost of operation and relatively unsatisfactory working conditions for many postal employees over the nation is bringing about many changes in the Post Office Department. This increased cost must be adjusted to our economy.

Our nation has become a 5-day, 40-hour work week nation. Most businesses are adjusting this schedule as are state, county and city offices.

Because of the above mentioned trends and facts it has become necessary to make some changes in the services at the local post office. Beginning Saturday, June 5, 1970, window service on Saturday will be discontinued. Stamps will continue to be available in the lobby stamp vending machine. City, rural and star route car-

riers will continue to make Saturday delivery. They will handle no financial transactions however except the sale of stamps by the rural and star carriers. Mail dropped after 3 p.m. Saturday will be dropped in the outside box in front of the post office. This will be picked up and carried to Lufkin for working and distribution. No one will be on duty in the office on Sunday.

Tyler County's Democratic voters will go to the polls Saturday in the runoff primary to determine the nominee for county judge and for county commissioner in precinct two.

On the runoff ballot for county judge are Allen Sturrock and Richard (Tom Dick) Mann who were forced into a runoff when the third candidate in the first

primary, Robert E. Jackson, polled enough votes (280) to deny either the majority of the votes cast.

In precinct two the voters will decide between H. A. Powell, incumbent, and H. M. Parks. In the first primary Cecil Barnes was third man and neither Powell nor Parks

received a majority of the votes cast.

Tyler County has 5638 registered voters this year and in the first primary a little over 3100 turned out. Of these, 309 voted in the Democratic primary. Normally fewer voters turn out for the second primary than the first and all candidates have been urging a good vote Saturday.

County Clerk Otha Miles said Tuesday, the last day for absentee voting, that 95 voters had applied for absentee ballots. In the first primary on May 2 the absentee vote was 116.

All regular polling places in the county will be open Saturday. In all but three—Chester, Campround and Bethany—only the county judge race will be voted on.

In the 15 boxes in the county in the first primary several of them, including Woodville, had less than 50 percent of the registered voters who cast ballots. The 15 boxes and the number who voted in the Democratic primary May 2 and registered voters in parenthesis follows:

Tribal members of the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation, 15 miles west of Woodville, will host an Inter-Tribal Pow-Wow Saturday, June 6.

The Dallas Inter-Tribal Association will join the Alabama-Coushatta Na-Ski-La dancers on Texas' only Indian Reservation.

A special feature will be the Tigua Indian dancers from El Paso with a 300-year-old drum, highlighted by a traditional war dance contest.

The program for the day includes an Indian girls softball game at 2:00 p.m. between the Dallas Indian girls and the Alabama-Coushatta Indian girls. A men's softball game will be held at 5:00 p.m. between the Dallas Indian men and the Reservation Tribe team.

The grand event of the day is an 8:00 p.m. inter-tribal Pow-Wow when all the guests and tribesmen will enjoy the colorful presentation of Southwestern and Central Nations dances. All will be in full costume and a team of excellent drummers and chanters will guide the Pow-Wow.

The events will take place at the ball park on the Reservation just off U. S. Highway 190. The public is invited.

Mrs. Madeline Mooney, Tyler County Home Demonstration Agent, made arrangements for the appearance of Mrs. Masterson.

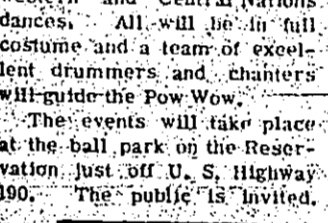
### TWO LAWSUITS Settled Monday In District Court

### Why Should We Care?

In last week's booster, there appeared a notice concerning delinquent taxes on the property known as The Woodville Inn. The Taxing Agencies involved are, The City of Woodville, and Woodville Independent School District. Since the motel is a facility serving the public, with approximately forty-one employees on the payroll, and the City receiving in an excess of \$2,000.00 a year, which represents the 1% sales tax collected by the motel, we feel the motel is an asset to Woodville and Tyler County. In shifting the City receives from \$300.00 to \$100.00 a month for utility services, furnished by the City to the Woodville Inn.

In the past several months we have remodeled 52 motel rooms, with new carpets, drapes, tile, paint, bed spreads, pillows, shower curtains, etc., over-hauling the air-conditioning equipment, furnitures, kitchen equipment, and swimming pool. In an effort to up-grade the motel bringing more outside money and business into Tyler County. We realize there were back taxes owed on the motel at the time we purchased the mortgages from the government. We felt however, by paying the taxes, it would become an asset to the city, the Taxing Agencies would consider compromising the back due taxes.

Some of the members serving on the school board or connected with the City did not pay these taxes when they were a member of the board of directors of The Woodville Community Inn of America. 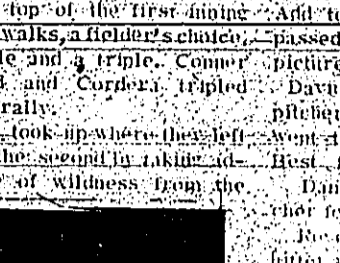

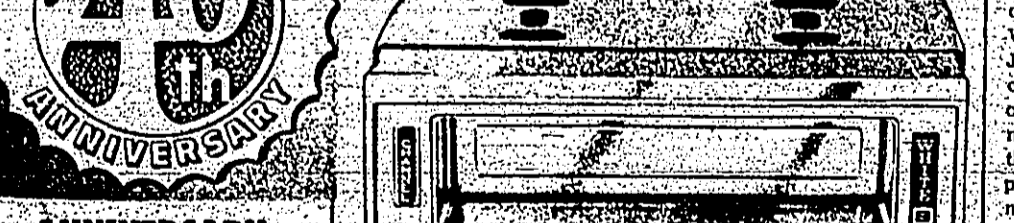

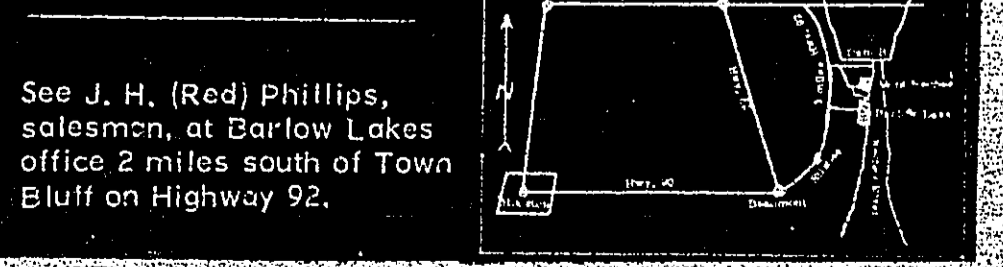
