Pulpwood Truck Hits Herd Of Cattle, Kills 9

An empty pulpwood truck plowed into a herd of cattle on Farm Road 1745 four miles southeast of Chester Saturday afternoon leaving nine cows and calves dead on the roadway.

The livestock was being moved from a pasture to a pen down the road when the accident occurred. The truck, returning toward Chester for another load of pulpwood, topped a hill where flagmen on horseback attempted to wave it down but the driver of the truck was unable to stop it before it hit the cows and calves at the foot of the quarter-mile downhill grade.

The cattle belonged to Ray Barnes who did not estimate the dollar value of the loss. However, Highway Patrolman Gary Hennigan, who investigated, estimated the loss at about \$2000.

The pulpwood truck driver escaped injury and only slight damage was done to the truck. The driver was charged with having no driver's license and with driving with defective brakes.

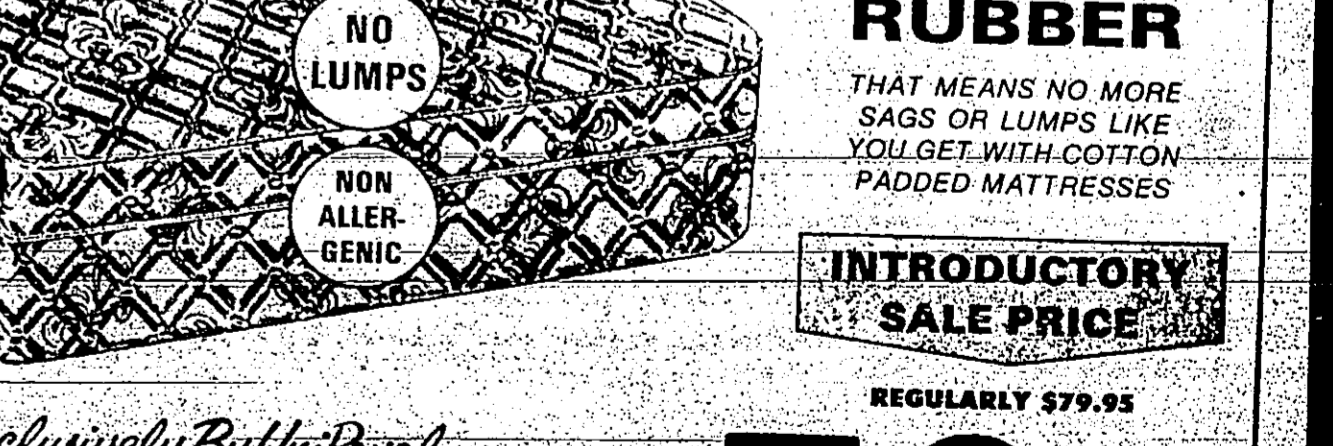
