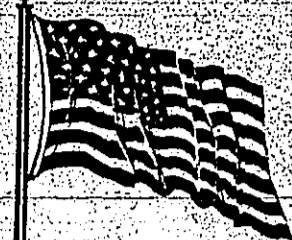

Amendment 3 Opposed By Adams

To Be On TV With Apache Belles

Of the seven amendments to the Texas Constitution which voters will decide in the November general election, the one generating the most controversy at the present time is Amendment 3 which deals with taxation of farm, ranch and timber lands. It proposes to allow the legislature to provide by law for the establishment of a uniform method of assessment based upon the capability of the lands to support the raising of livestock or to produce farm and forest crops.

Readers Favor Vietnam Victory

Readers of the Tyler County Booster who returned forms in the National Securities Issues poll conducted by this newspaper in cooperation with the National Security Council expressed their views on 10 statements in which they marked squares for "agree," "disagree" and "undecided."

State Representative Don Adams, who spoke to the Colmesnell Service Club Tuesday night, feels that passage of the amendment could wreck the financial structure of East Texas school districts and county governments.

Adams points out that the enabling legislation has not been written and says the wording of the amendment leaves the door open to almost anything.

The law now in effect uses "fair cash market value" on farm and ranch land and only if the farming and ranching is the primary occupation and source of income of the owner.

Adams says the present law was written to help the true rancher and farmer and not the city professional or businessman who buys a farm or ranch for a tax write-off, has helped those it was intended to help—the true farmer and rancher.

Visitors To Crowd Lakes This Weekend

An estimated 300,000-plus persons will swarm into East Texas this Labor Day weekend for the final fling at outdoor recreation for the summer season.

They will come in campers, in cars pulling boats, in pickups loaded with tents and camping equipment. And they will crowd into the available state and national park camping and boating areas and overflow into commercially-operated trailer spaces, motels and campsites.

State and national park officials estimate that Saturday through Monday there will be 33,000 persons at Dam B and Martin Dies Jr. State Park, 125,000 at Sam Rayburn, 60,000 at undeveloped facilities at Lake Livingston, 25,000 at Huntsville State Park, and perhaps 70,000 on the Texas side of Toledo Bend Reservoir.

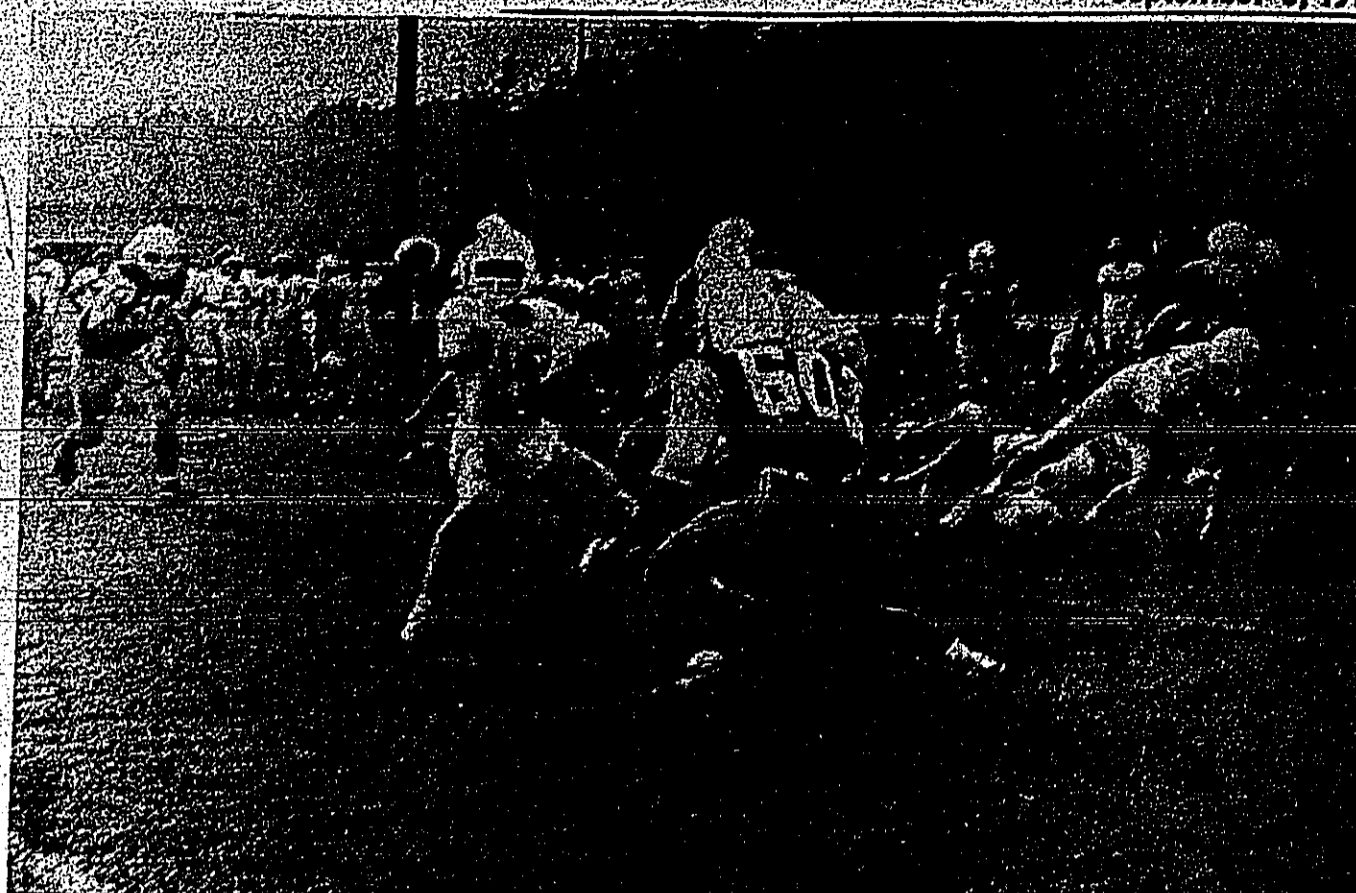

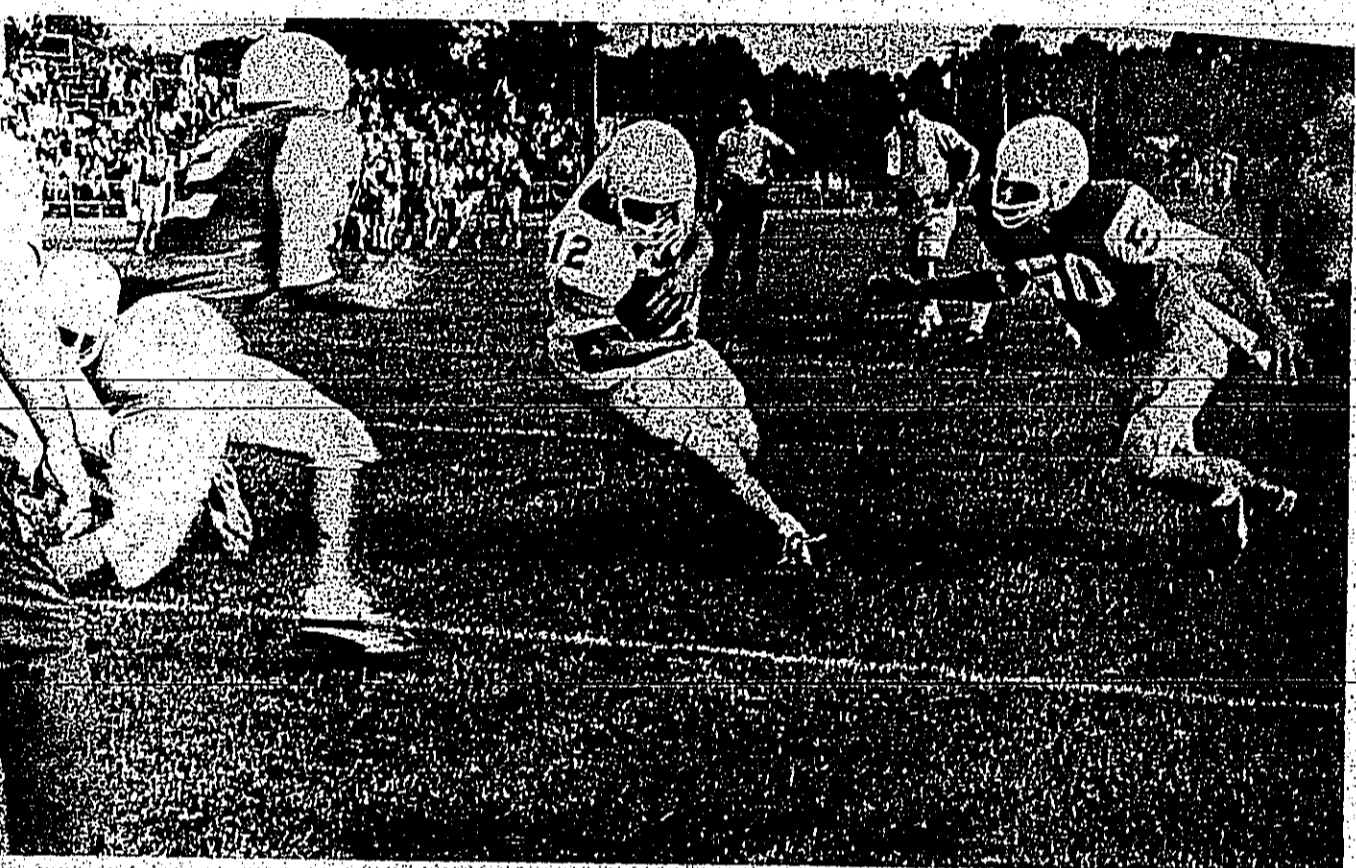
Woodville Loses Scrimmage
