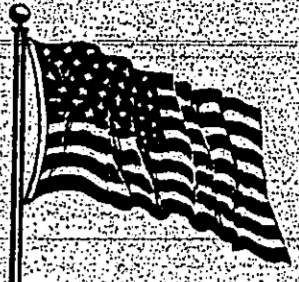

Three Men Charged In Burglaries

Absentee Voting Explained

Any qualified Texas voter who plans to vote absentee in the general election in November should keep the requirements and procedures for such voting in mind, Secretary of State Martin Dies, Jr. reminded Texans this week.

In order to vote absentee by mail in this election, a voter must: (1) be unable to appear Nov. 3 at the polling place because of sickness or physical disability; or (2) expect to be absent from his county of residence on Nov. 3 and during the county clerk's office hours throughout the period Oct. 14-Oct. 30, inclusive.

All applications for absentee ballots must be received in the county clerk's office not later than Oct. 30.

Details as to absentee voting procedure may be obtained from the voter's county clerk. Generally, these provisions apply: A voter applying for an absentee ballot by reason of sickness or physical disability must mail his application to the county clerk. It should be accompanied by the voter's registration certificate and by a certificate of a duly licensed physician, chiropractor or accredited Christian science practitioner certifying to the voter's illness or physical disability.

A voter desiring to vote absentee by reason of absence from the county may either deliver or mail his application for absentee ballot to the county clerk. In the application, the voter must state that he expects to be absent from the county on election day and during the clerk's regular office hours for the entire period of personal appearance absentee voting (Oct. 14-Oct. 30). The absentee ballot then must be mailed to the voter at an address outside his county of residence. Also, the envelope in which the voter returns the ballot must be postmarked from a point outside his county of residence.

Voter registration in Texas this year hit an all-time high of 4,150,645. On Nov. 3, voters will express their preference in state, district and local races, as well as on seven proposed state constitutional amendments.

WISD Budget Adopted

The board of trustees of Warren Independent School District has adopted a budget totaling \$753,180 including \$34,870 in federal funds. The trustees voted to keep the same tax rate of \$1.20 on local maintenance and 10 cents on bonds based on a market value of \$34,042,624.

County Gets By Without Accident During Holidays

No traffic accidents were reported on Tyler County highways during the long Labor Day weekend, Highway Patrolman Joe Willmon said Tuesday. The three-man highway patrol detachment stationed here was on extended duty throughout the weekend and issued a number of traffic violation tickets as well as charging seven drivers with DWI. The other patrolmen are Gary Hennigan and William Bradberry.

The flow of traffic was heavy especially Friday and Monday as thousands of motorists took advantage of the last summer holiday to go to East Texas lakes for the long weekend. The sheriff's department and city police reported that no serious offenses against the peace occurred although the weekend arrest for drunkenness, disorderly conduct, and the like was up slightly.

Three young men from Beaumont have been charged here with two counts of burglary following their arrest early Tuesday after they attempted to enter Bob's Prescription Shop, 1010 West Bull.

Two of the young men also were charged with possession of dangerous drugs. The two charges of burglary against the trio is the result of local officers connecting them with the burglary of the same place on August 5.

Timothy O'Neal Kellison and Robert Allen Weaver, both 19, are charged with two counts of burglary and one count of possession of dangerous drugs. The third man, James Douglas Franklin, 18, is charged with two counts of burglary.

They were arraigned Tuesday morning before Justice of the Peace Joe H. Loggins, who set bonds of \$5000 on each count.

The men were arrested by Ed Sumrall, night police chief, and Highway Patrolman William Bradberry when a resident living near the pharmacy reported hearing noises and seeing the men attempting to pry open the rear door. This was shortly after midnight Tuesday.

When the officers arrived at the pharmacy, they found Kellison and Weaver hiding in their car parked nearby. Franklin was arrested about an hour later at Woodville Inn. A vial of drugs in their possession resulted in the charge of possession of dangerous drugs against Kellison and O'Neal.

The trio was linked to the August 5 break-in at the pharmacy when a ring of keys in their possession had one on it which fitted the lock on the rear door of the pharmacy. However, following the burglary on August 5, Bob Boykin, proprietor of the pharmacy, had added a bolt-type lock to the door.

In the first burglary the men apparently had either found an extra key to the lock or had taken an impression and made a key to fit it.

Sumrall said one of the men has been handled by Beaumont officers and faced burglary and drug possession charges in Jefferson County.

Jasper County officers have placed a hold order on the three men in connection with burglaries in that county.

The Third Annual Open Horse Show sponsored by the Tyler County 4-H adult leaders and the Young Farmers organization will be held Saturday at the 4-H and FFA arena at the airport.

This will be an all-trophy show with trophies awarded to the first six places in each class. There are 26 classes including halter and performance, and in performance, Bub there are pee-wee, junior and

senior classes for the various age groups. County Agent Clinton Currie said there is a total of \$1600 worth of trophies to be awarded in the show, and entries are expected from as far away as Crockett, Huntsville, Kountze, Silsbee and Center.

The show begins at 9:00 a.m. Saturday, and entries will be accepted in each class until the preceding class begins. Bub Richardson will be show judge.

Class 1 through 15 in halter are pony, 54 inches and under; 1970 stallions, 1969 and older stallions, 1967 and older stallions, champion stallion, 1970 mares, 1969 mares, 1968 mares, 1967 mares, 1969 and older mares, champion mare, gelding, 3 years and younger, gelding, 4 years and over; and champion gelding.

der; junior western pleasure ages 11-15; senior western pleasure 16 and over; junior reindeer 15 and under; senior reindeer 16 and over; pee-wee pole bending 10 and under; junior pole bending 11-15; senior pole bending 16 and over; pee-wee barrel race 10 and under; junior barrel race 11-15; and senior barrel race 16 and over.

A few surprises await Bulldog fans and this Friday night could be the start. 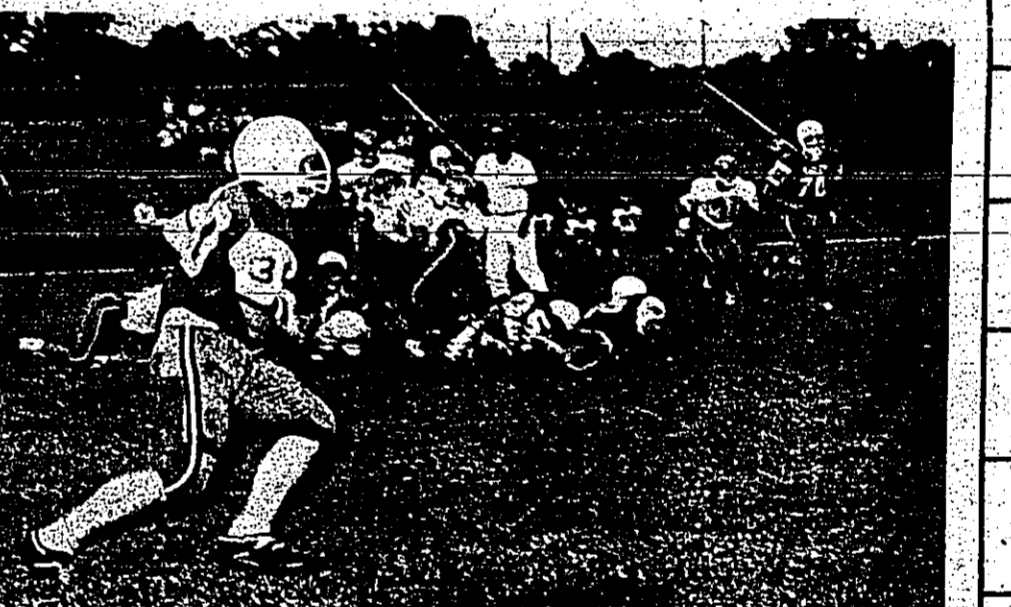

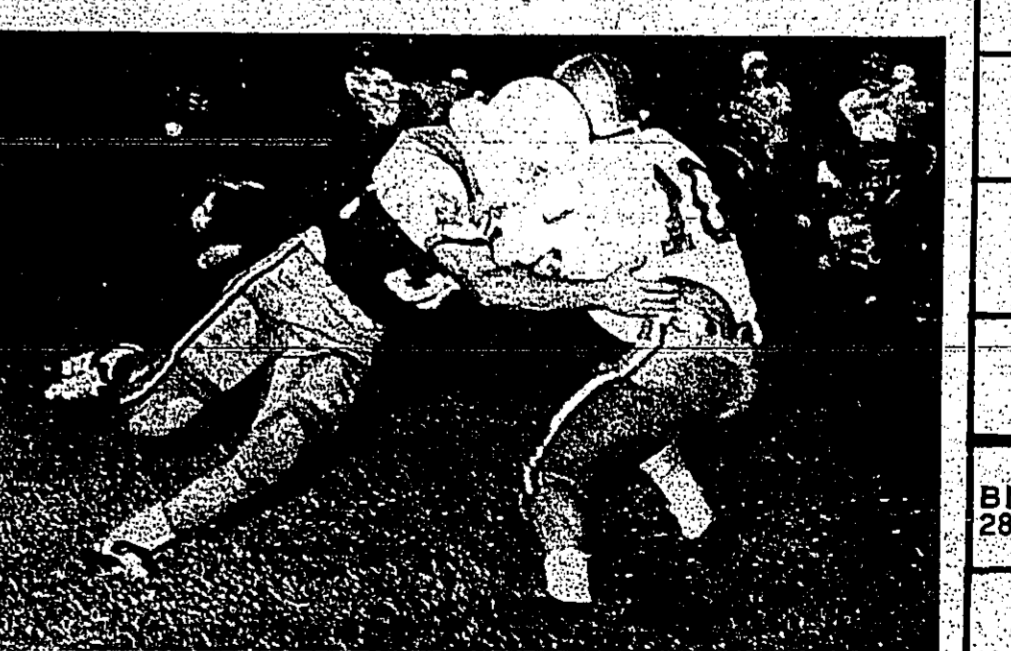
