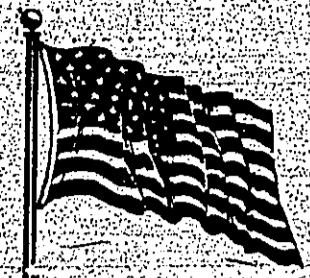

## Hay Show Slated

The annual Tyler County Hay Show will be held Monday beginning at 7:30 p.m. in the new vocational agriculture building on the Woodville school campus, according to Clinton Currie, county agent.

Hay will be judged in three classes—perennial grasses, annual grasses, and legumes. Judges will be Wayne Taylor, area farm management specialist; George Allison, area agronomist, both with the Texas A&M system at Overton; and Dr. J. L. Sullivan of Stephen F. Austin State University, Nacogdoches. The three men also will give a program on hay management practices.

Hay shows have done a lot for the East Texas area in emphasizing hay as a source of livestock feed rather than a filler, Currie said.

The hay show is being sponsored by the agriculture committee of the Tyler County Program Building Committee, vocational agriculture departments of county schools, Soil Conservation Service, ASCS, Long Leaf Soil Conservation District and the Bull East Texas Program.

Currie urged all farmers, livestock men and others interested in producing hay to attend the hay show.

## Mini-Bike Owners Given Time To Register Vehicles

Owners of minibikes in Woodville are being given time to get them licensed and for operators, where eligible, to secure drivers licenses before city policemen will begin enforcing the statutes applying to them, the city office said this week.

Many owners of the vehicles have already applied for license tags without which they cannot be operated on any public road.

At the last city council meeting the city secretary was instructed to publicize the fact that many of the small vehicles were being operated contrary to state laws requiring licensing of motorized cycles and their operators.

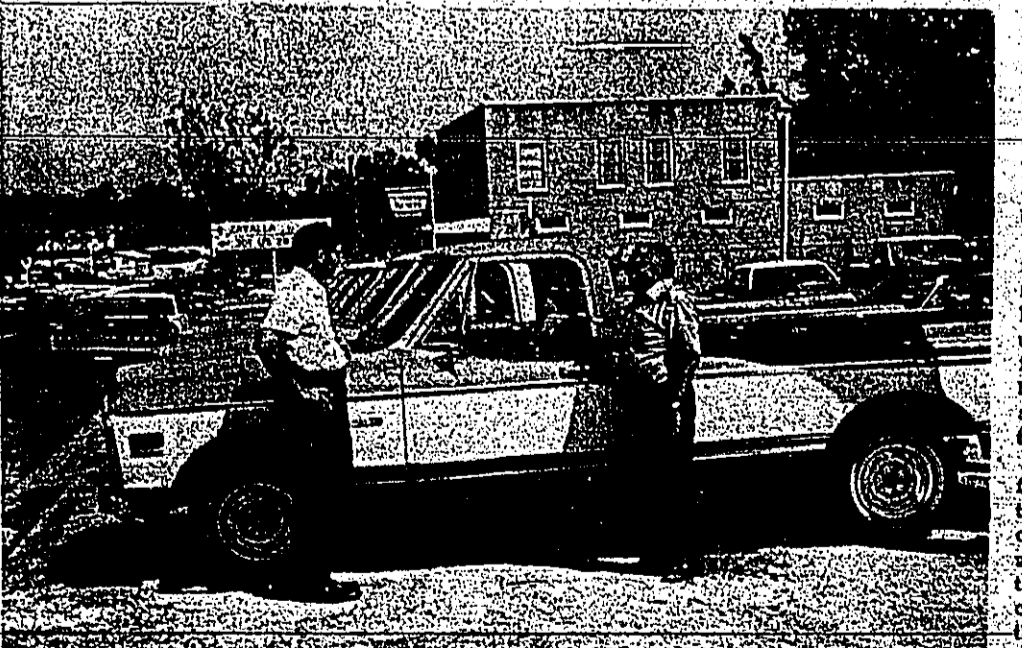

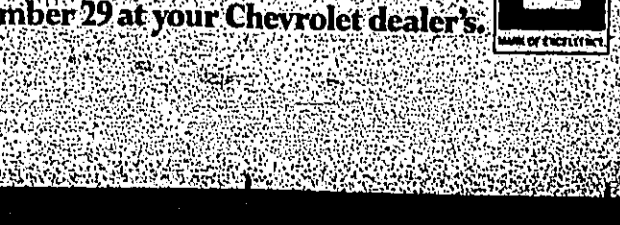
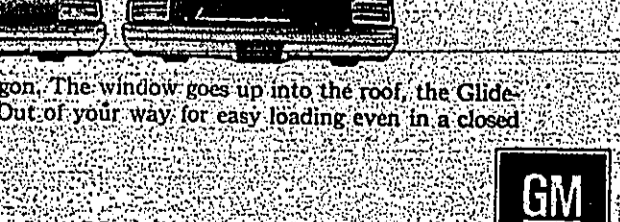

PASSAGE OF AMENDMENT 3 ESSENTIAL FOR EQUITY

Texas Farm Bureau National Affairs Director (Reprinted with permission from the Sept. 1970 issue of "Texas Agriculture", published by the Texas Farm Bureau)
The ad valorem (property) tax has rightly been labeled as the most inequitable tax ever assessed. As applied to farm, ranch and forest lands, the ad valorem tax reaches its highest degree of inequity. These lands are assessed for value on the basis of their most intensive use, which is usually agriculture. This is not fair because the value of these lands is determined by their ability to produce crops, livestock and/or produce.

TYLER COUNTY BOOSTER

Approved by Texas voters in November, Amendment No. 3 will give the Legislature authority to pass necessary enabling legislation. An interim study committee of the Legislature has held hearings throughout Texas to determine the true nature of the land tax situation. The committee will be presented to the 62nd Legislature in 1971. The committee will make recommendations which will be presented to the Legislature. The Legislature will have the option of passing or not passing such legislation. Following are some questions and answers that cover the major issues involved.
Q. What is the real purpose of Amendment No. 3 and the enabling legislation?
A. In a nutshell, the purpose is to keep farmers, ranchers and timber growers from being taxed out of existence. Farm real estate taxes are skyrocketing upward at an average annual rate of approximately 22 per cent. But this is another case where averages do not tell the whole story. In numerous independent school districts throughout Texas, farm real estate taxes have jumped from 50 per cent to 150 per cent in the past five years!
