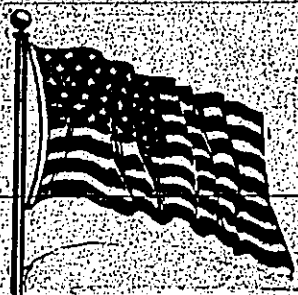

Catfish In Cages To Be Topic Of Meeting

The Agricultural Committee of the Tyler County Program Building Committee is sponsoring a meeting on raising channel catfish in cages. The meeting will be held in the Vocational Agriculture Building in the Woodville school, November 24 at 7 p.m.

Dr. H. B. Schmittou, fisheries specialist from Texas A&M University, is the guest speaker. Dr. Schmittou is recognized as the leading researcher in raising catfish in cages.

The cages dimensions are 3 feet wide, 4 feet long and 3 feet deep and will hold 500 fingerlings. The fingerlings should reach about 180 days. The stocking rate of catfish in cages is about 2,000 per acre. Persons interested in raising channel catfish in cages, are invited to attend the meeting on November 24.

A sample cage will be on display.

Seven People Killed In Rural Accidents In County

Sgt. C. L. Taylor of the Texas Highway Patrol has announced that during the month of October 1970, in Tyler County there were no rural fatal accidents in which people were killed. The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 15 rural motor vehicle traffic accidents in which one person was injured. Through October 1970, there have been rural accidents in Tyler County killing seven people and injuring 47 people. During the same period in 1969, there were 17 rural traffic accidents killing six people and injuring 68 persons.

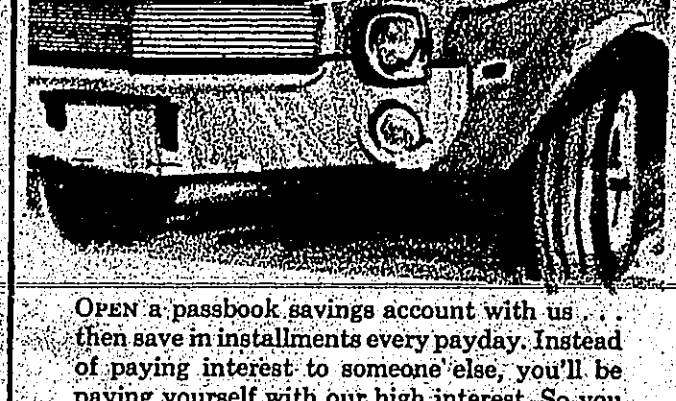

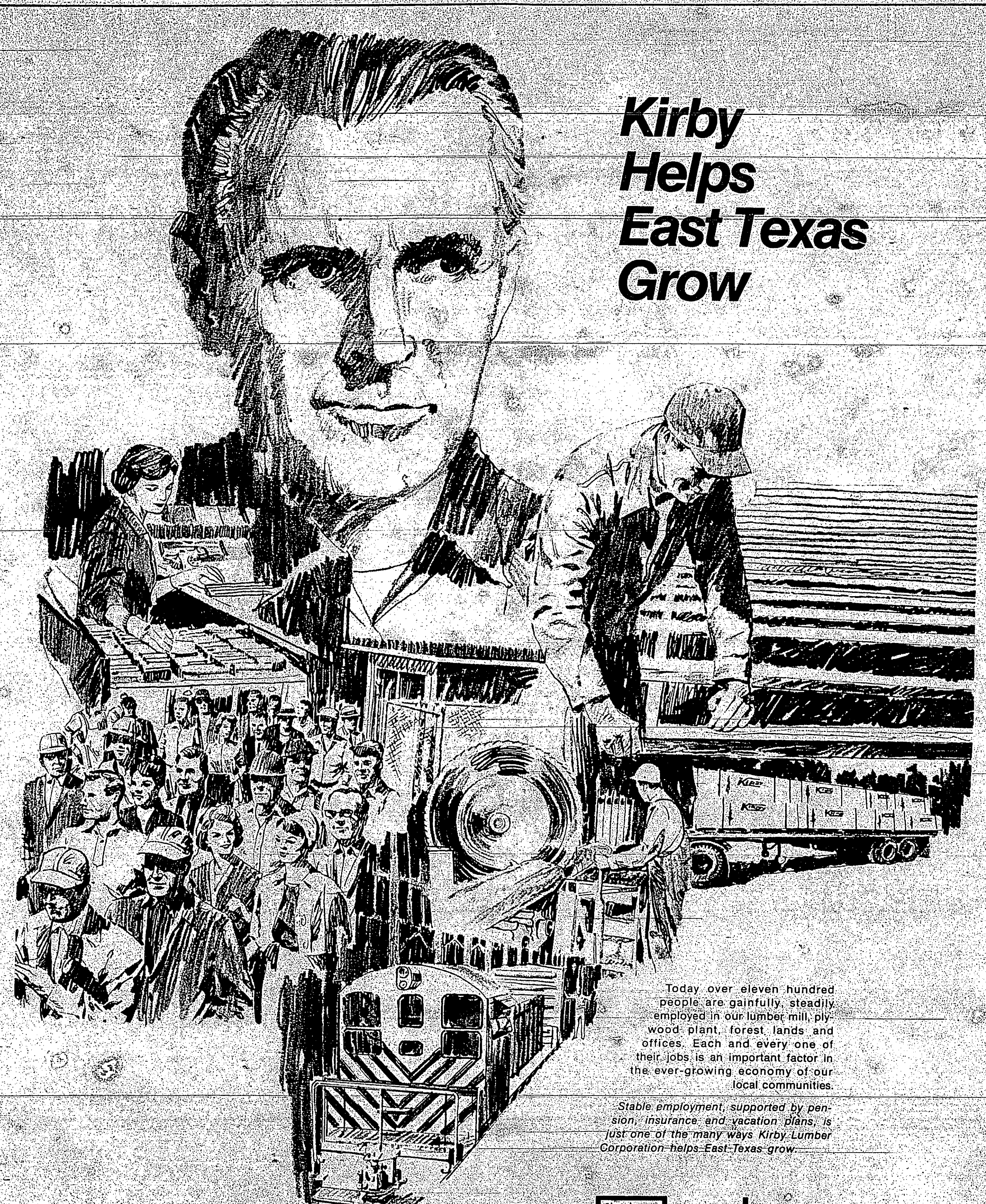

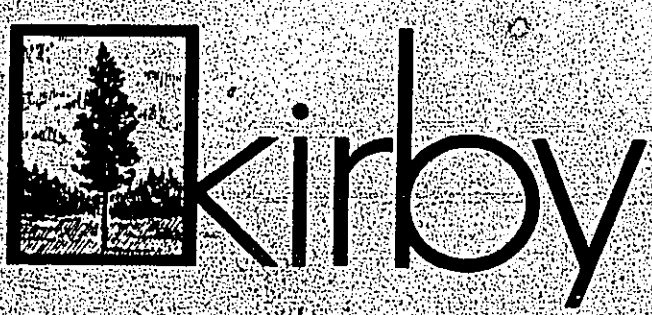
