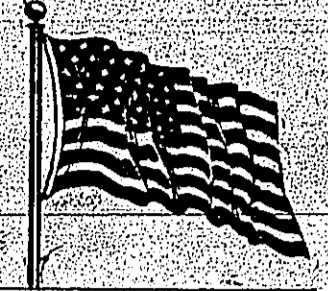


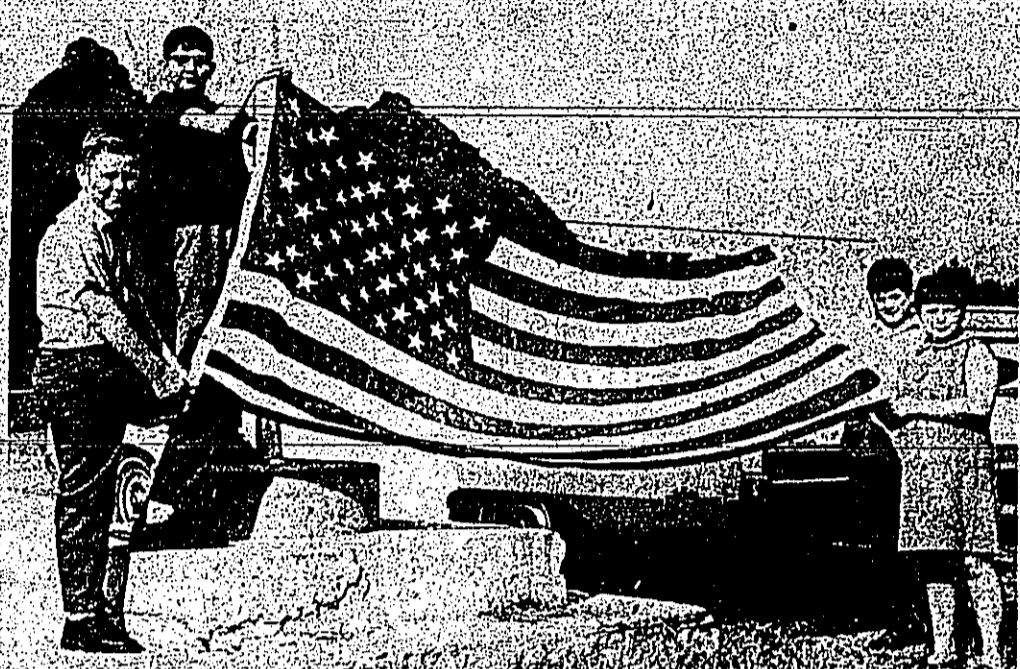

## RE: HOT CHECK LAWS

### A Message To Businessmen

By ROIS L. BROCKMAN, County Attorney, Tyler County

To the businessmen of Tyler County:

This synopsis is designed to help prevent and report crime.

The Harris County District Attorney's Office and the Dallas District Attorney's Office have in recent years provided the businessmen of their respective counties with an outline such as this one to enable them to protect themselves against worthless checks and other crimes usually associated with the operation of a business.

I have tried to take the best from the aforementioned outlines and compile them into an outline which will be of great value to you. I sincerely urge you to read this outline carefully and to follow the procedures contained herein. If you do so it can and probably will save you a great deal of time and money.

Whether the offense is passing a worthless check, theft, burglary, vandalism or robbery, knowledge of what constitutes an offense and how to notify proper authorities will help prevent crime. The County Attorney's Office, which represents the State in misdemeanor or criminal cases, needs your full cooperation in the prosecution of offenders.

I hope that every one of you will report each violation known to you and will insist on and participate in vigorous prosecution. The individual who lets an offender go free today sometimes encourages that violator to commit another crime tomorrow.

## Sharon Bracken and Alaskan Trophy

Sharon also had shot a 300 pound caribou three days earlier.

She is a 1970 graduate of Kountze High School and the Alaskan hunting trip was a graduation gift from her family. Her younger sister Donna also made the trip to Alaska but had returned home and to school a month earlier.

The Brackens went to Talitna, Alaska, and were taken to Cache Creek on the Alaskan Range by a bush pilot, Don Shelton, who had his plane equipped with snow shoes in order to land. He put the party

in the right spot for good hunting.

However, successful hunting sometimes has its drawbacks. After Sharon shot the large moose, it took the family two days to carry the meat over the snow to a point one-half mile away where Shelton could land his plane.

Her father explained that they had to cut up the meat and carry it across the snow fifty and sixty pounds at a time. And the horns off the moose, weighing about 80 pounds, had to be carried to the plane landing spot. It was quite a job.

The Brackens gave the meat to Shelton who distributed it among needy families in the area.

Sharon comes by her hunting ability naturally. Her father is an avid outdoors enthusiast as is her grandmother, Mrs. Sue Bracken of Woodville.

## Two Are Tied In Wide Rack Contest

Herman Risinger, Jr. of Woodville and H. W. Johnson of Village Mills have tied for first place in the Booster's wide rack contest in entries made so far. Each killed a deer with an antler spread of 19-3/4 inches.

## RAT ERADICATION CAMPAIGN SLATED

A county-wide rat eradication campaign is being conducted by the Tyler County 4-H Council according to County Agent Clinton Currie, with all persons being urged to order bait by January 15, 1971.

Rats are one of the most destructive and dangerous pests to have around a farm or ranch. Currie points out. They contaminate stored grain and exposed food and feed, they kill poultry and young livestock and they start fires. Disease such as leptospirosis, contagious trichinosis, distemper, streptococcal, plague, typhus, salmonella, food poisoning and rabid fever are carried from place to place by these pests.

The rat population on a place can be controlled, however, if with a little time and effort he says. An extensive sanitation program, coupled with the use of anticoagulant baits, will effectively control the rat population. Once the rats have been eliminated, a small number of permanent baits and continued sanitation will help prevent reinfestation.

As long as there are rats in the area, however, a farm or ranch is in constant danger of becoming infested, Currie declared. He said rat bait orders must be turned in at one of the stations below by January 15. The orders will

## THREE MEN CHARGED Six Stolen Cars Found Here

Two young Houston men arrested in Woodville on a traffic violation last Thursday face charges in the alleged theft of six autos and a motorcycle in Harris County. Houston officers were here Tuesday to return them to Harris County.

They are Thomas Glenn Blakney, 19, and Paul David Ramey, 17, who gave addresses in Houston when picked up here by Highway Patrolmen Gary Hennigan and William Bradberry following an unreported accident in one of the autos.

Blakney was booked at the Tyler County jail on charges of failure to report an accident, operating a vehicle with no valid motor vehicle inspection sticker, driving without a license, using fictitious (stolen) license plates and driving at an unsafe speed.

Ramey was charged with violating restriction Code 2 (operator's license) on driver's license, no motor vehicle inspection sticker, and fictitious license plates on a vehicle.

When arrested the two young men were driving a 1962 Triumph. They were arraigned before Justice of the Peace Joe Loggins and bond of \$3,000 was set.

After five days of investigation by Hennigan and Bradberry assisted by the Tyler County sheriff's department, the Houston Police Department and Harris County sheriff's department the young men were charged, in addition to the Triumph, in connection with the theft of a 1968 Red Camaro, 1968 Silver Camaro, 1967 blue Camaro, 1969 blue Mustang, 1967 Super Sport Chevelle and a 1970 Bridgeport motorcycle.

Five of the vehicles were stolen inside the Houston city limits and two in Harris County, Hennigan said.

Six of the stolen vehicles were found in an auto wrecking yard located on the Chester highway, Hennigan said. They had been stripped and the motors removed. One of the cars, the 1967 Camaro, had been burned after being stripped and positive identification of it was made Tuesday.

Owners of the vehicles have been notified, Hennigan said. Charges of receiving and concealing stolen property have been filed against Herbert Morrell, owner of the wrecking yard.
