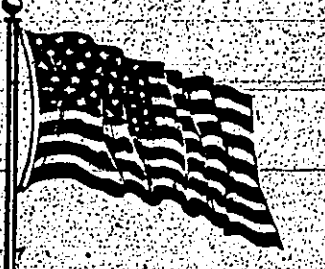

Chester State Bank To Observe 50th Anniversary February 6

Fifty years ago this coming February 6 a newly chartered state bank opened its doors for business in Chester with a young man named George C. Enloe serving as cashier and chief executive officer.

Fifty years and one day later, on February 6, 1971, Chester State Bank will hold an open house to observe its Golden Anniversary of service to the people of northwest Tyler County under the able direction of George C. Enloe, now its president.

The open house celebration will be held at the bank on Saturday, February 6, from 2 to 5 p.m. All its customers and friends throughout the area are invited to come by during those hours for a visit, refreshments and souvenirs, plus a chance to win one of the three prizes to be awarded. These are savings accounts in the amounts of \$75, \$50 and \$25 to be drawn for first, second and third prize.

Incidentally, anyone who has patronized the bank during the past 50 years will have no trouble locating the building. It is the same one in which the bank opened on February 6, 1921. The only change has been the addition of a conference room at the back.

To this triple anniversary of bank, officer, and building there is one other worth mentioning—an adding machine. When the bank opened in 1921 its only bookkeeping machine was a Burroughs' adding machine. And on a stand in the bookkeeping department among the new-fangled electric machines is that same adding machine. It still is used daily to total out of town checks.

Officers of the Chester State Bank when it opened in 1921, besides Mr. Enloe, were Alex Thompson, a widely known lumberman and banker, who was president, and the late Lee M. Feagin, who was vice president. On the board of directors of the new bank were Mr. Thompson, J. C. Feagin, J. R. Goolsbee, B. F. Adams, and E. J. Riley.

The bank was chartered with capital stock of \$10,000. First day deposits were around \$25,000, Mr. Enloe recalls. Among those making a deposit on February 6, 1921, and who has kept an account in the bank throughout the 50 years is Vincent Goolsbee, now living in Woodville. Mr. Enloe said that there may be others and if there are he would like to know.

The first daily debit and credit ledger of the bank has been preserved and shows that Chester State Bank had total resources of \$50,738.71 at the end of its first month on March 5, 1921. Resources first passed the \$1000 mark on August 19, 1925 with \$102,243.29. Any old timer will agree that was a lot of money back in those days.

Another anniversary mark is that the Chester State Bank has had accounts with American National Bank in Beaumont, First National Bank in Houston, and Citizens State Bank in Woodville since its opening day in 1921.

Present officers of Chester State Bank are David A. Feagin, chairman of the board; Mr. Enloe, president; Bertie Best, executive vice president; R. C. Fairchild, vice president; Mrs. Elaine Harvey, cashier; and Mrs. Vera Bradley, assistant cashier.

SATURDAY NOON IS DEADLINE • Voter Registration To End

SIXTH ANNUAL PAGEANT • ABWA To Sponsor Miss Tyler County

The Wisteria Chapter, American Business Women's Association, will again sponsor the Miss Tyler County Pageant in June, Beverly Cole, president, announced Monday.

Winner of the county pageant will enter the Miss Texas Scholarship Pageant held to select the state queen, who will compete for the crown of Miss America in the national competition at Atlantic City, N. J., in September. The 1971 Miss Texas, Phyllis George of Denton, is the reigning 1971 Miss America.

The event this year will be the sixth annual Miss Tyler County Pageant sponsored by the Wisteria Chapter, ABWA. "We are again serving as sponsors of the pageant this year because we believe it provides a valuable contribution to the community and to the young ladies who will enter the competition," Mrs. Cole said in announcing plans of this organization.

"We believe it serves the community well because it focuses attention on the high caliber of young ladies who are residents of our area and we believe it serves you well because it provides the opportunity for the young ladies who compete to gain added poise through participation in a community program such as the Miss Tyler County Pageant," Mrs. Cole added.

Lions To See Medical Emergency Film

Joe Pearce, field consultant with the division of civil defense and traffic safety of the State Department of Health will bring the program at the noon meeting of the Woodville Lions Club Thursday.

Mr. Pearce's topic will be improvement of local emergency medical services. He will show a film, "Before the Emergency," which dramatically illustrates the value of good emergency care to individuals involved in all too common emergencies. The film points out that an estimated 20,000 accident victims die unnecessarily each year as a direct result of inadequate emergency care and at least another 25,000 are permanently disabled from the same cause.

The film shows how a Wisconsin town set up an outstanding rescue, ambulance, and hospital service, and how these saved the lives of many school children in a mock bus accident. The film ends with specific suggestions as to how a city or town can bring its emergency care system up to a similar level.

Farm Income Increase Predicted To \$3.76 Billion

Cash income to farmers and ranchers in Tyler County should be more than \$6,461,330 by the end of 1971, according to Clinton R. Currie, county agricultural agent.

Principal speaker at the banquet will be Delph Briscoe, Jr., Uvalde rancher, banker, and civic leader.

This will be an increase of more than \$2,014,740 from 1969 figures with livestock contributing a large part of the gain. The projections are based on studies of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and are part of the '73-76 program, a state-wide project to increase Texas agricultural cash receipts by more than one billion dollars.

Harry Stafford, Woodville attorney, will be master of ceremonies at the banquet. He will introduce the 1971 chamber of commerce officer and speaker, Mr. Briscoe.

Total cash receipts from all agricultural enterprises in Tyler County are presently about \$4,454,900, says Clinton Currie. The most important ones are broilers, livestock, and timber. They are expected to account for about 85 percent of the projected 1976 totals.

Dr. Raymond Park, who will be the invocation, special guest, and Mr. Ashworth will preside. Chamber officers, and committee chairmen, Hoyt Hanna will give the benediction. Dinner music will be played by Dr. Jim Jimenez.
