School Board Renews Teachers Contracts

The board of trustees of Woodville Independent School District at its regular meeting Monday night acted on mostly routine business and then in an executive session reemployed the teaching staff and administrators for 1971-72.

Commissioners In Meeting March 8

Tyler County commissioners court at the regular meeting March 8 authorized the payment of current bills, approved the bond of the county surveyor, Roy Pridden and voted to purchase one acre of land from H. G. Sutton on which to locate the precinct three barn.

Art Home Tour Set

The Beaumont Art League will sponsor an art collectors' home tour, Sunday, March 28 at 2 p.m. until 5 p.m.

The trustees voted to add May 28 as a teaching day and add Thursday, June 3, as a work day for teachers. Under the new regulations this year schools are required to have 180 teaching days and 10 teacher work days in addition to teaching days.

The board also approved the 1971-72 school calendar and approved the textbook committee's recommendations for next year.

Mr. McCombs also reported that insurance policies on school buildings and contents have been issued for one year effective from March 20, 1971 through March 20, 1972 through the three local agencies as approved by the board at an earlier meeting.

The blanket 90 percent co-insurance policy was obtained on the school properties through four companies represented by Globe-Mann, Clemmons and Feagin Insurance agencies. On the total sworn values on buildings and contents of \$2,437,500 the companies issued policies totaling \$2,193,750.

Hartford Insurance, represented by Globe-Mann, took one-half of the coverage, or \$1,096,875. Pacific Employers Indemnity, represented by Fire Insurance Company and Western Fire Insurance Company, both represented by Feagin Insurance Agency, each took one-fourth of the coverage, or \$848,437 and \$548,437.50 each. Total premiums for the policy was \$14,000.

The trustees named J. B. Coffman, Dick Davis and Morris Clemmons as the board of equalization for the coming year.

The executive session was for the purpose of considering the employment of the professional staff for 1971-72.

Friday Is County Clean-Up Day

Volunteer workers from Tyler County's five high schools and interested adults will make what they hope is a "clean sweep" of litter and trash from the roads and other spots in a day-long effort Friday.

County commissioners will have a truck at each school Friday at 9:00 a.m. and are to be joined with other volunteers will pickup trucks in a coordinated drive to remove refuse dumped along roads and garbage piles which have accumulated illegally in the edges of woods and other places.

Carl Nichols, coordinator of the countywide cleanup campaign, said Tuesday that it appeared that the effort will have the support of the public from the responses he and others heading the drive have received.

Each county commissioner will furnish a truck and driver at the schools in his precinct, Nichols said. The commissioner or a representative will direct the cleanup work in his precinct.

County Judge Tom Mann said that he had contacted all five high schools in the county and that each superintendent has agreed to furnish volunteers to work on the project.

He said that Commissioners Carl Shepherd, Leon Fowler and James R. Jordan have agreed to help in their precincts by furnishing trucks and drivers. He said that he was trying to contact H. M. Parks in precinct two Tuesday but felt sure that he too will participate by furnishing a truck and driver.

Mr. Nichols said that everyone who could furnish a pickup truck and driver is urged to be at the school in the precinct in which he lives Friday morning at 9 a.m. He hopes that a good many people will furnish trucks in addition to the commissioners so that the cleanup drive will be a success.

He said that volunteers with trucks or individuals who wished to help may call 283-3058 on Thursday (today) and they will be listed so that efforts may be coordinated throughout the county.

Residents are urged to cooperate in the drive by cleaning up their premises by Saturday.

There will be three voting boxes, at Warren High School Library, with Oliver Hutton as election judge; Village Mills Methodist Church with Mrs. Lee Evans acting as election judge, and Fred School with Amos Hutto, judge.

At 7 p.m. March 29, there will be a public meeting in Warren High School Auditorium in which each candidate has been invited to express his views.

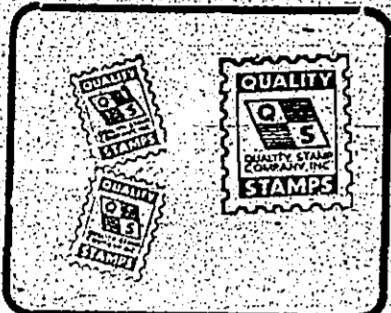

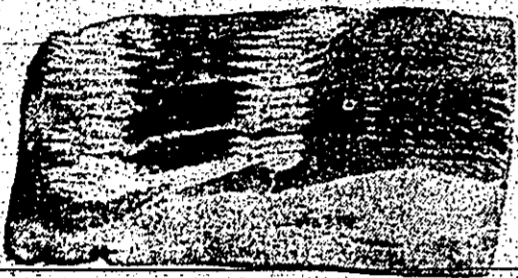
