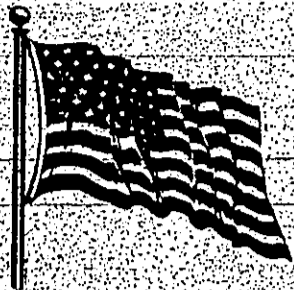

## Dogwood Queen Chosen Tuesday

The King's Men Tuesday night selected the 1971 queen of the Tyler County Dogwood Festival in the final judging at Woodville Inn.

She was named from the five finalists who were chosen at the second judging on March 9. They are Lynette Standley of Warren, Cordell Moore of Colmesnell, Robbie Crawford of Woodville and Debbie Walker of Chester.

The identity of the queen will not be revealed until the coronation ceremony at Dogwood amphitheatre on April 3. The first runnerup will be Miss Tyler County and the other three will be princesses from their respective schools.

Trainbearers to the queen will be Lahoma Gardner of Woodville, Marilyn Wilson of Warren, Dora Fowler of Colmesnell, Jan Woodrome of Chester, and Cynthia Guy of Spurger. Each was a runnerup at the second judging when the

five princesses were named. John Elliott, a professional football player with the New York Jets and a former Tyler Countyman, will crown the queen on April 3. He also will serve as parade marshal for the parade that afternoon at 2:30 p.m.

The coronation of the queen will begin at 7:00 p.m. on April 3. Over 30 duchesses from towns and cities outside Tyler County will be in the queen's court along with their escorts. The duchesses also will be in the parade in open convertibles. The five princesses and the 1970 queen, Miss Jill Ogden, will be on the queen's float.

Malcolm Collier, parade chairman, said that the dogwood parade on April 3 will have the usual number of decorated floats, high school bands, and commercial floats which along with the duchesses' convertibles make this one of the most attractive parades in Texas.

## 13 TRAIL RIDES HEAD FOR PARADE

Thirteen trail rides, some starting as early as today (Thursday), will ride into Woodville in time to form for the parade Saturday.

The Baytown Rough Riders will camp at the ball park at the Indian Reservation both Thursday and Friday nights. Friday night they will be joined by the Polk County Dogwood Trail Riders from Livingston. This group will start the weekend with a dance at the VFW Hall in Livingston Thursday night and leave Friday at noon to camp that night at the Indian ball park.

The Jefferson Quarterhorse Association trail ride will form near Kountze Friday and ride to a point south of Warren to camp that night.

The Schwab City Trailriders also start their weekend with a dance Thursday night at the Trailride Recreation Hall. They will leave at 8:00 a.m. Friday and will camp enroute Friday night.

Corrigan-Moscow Trailriders will leave Friday and camp Friday night near the old Gulf Pump Station location near Chester.

Hardin County Wagon Masters will camp Thursday night at W. C. Rice's Circle 2 Ranch and on Friday night three miles east of Hillister.

Tri-County Trail Blazers will camp at Triple D Guest Ranch Friday night.

Tyler County Youth Ride will leave from Spurger at 9:00 p.m. Friday and camp at the youth arena Friday night. A schedule of "Playday" events are scheduled Friday night.

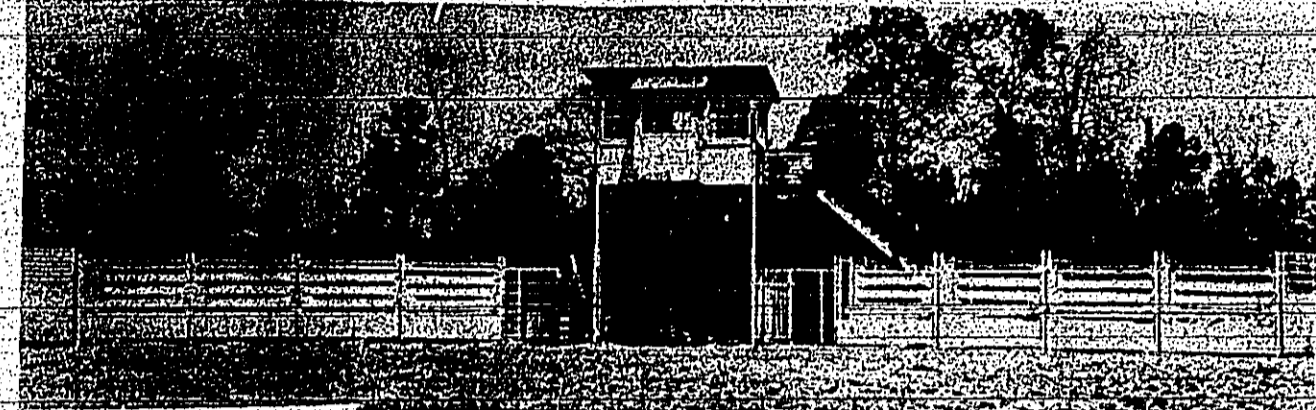
Spurger Brush Riders will ride to the James C. Chapman Ranch for a dance Friday night.

Tejas Saddle Club will leave Zavalla Friday morning and camp at the W. C. Crews ranch Friday night. They will have a "chicken house" dance that night.

Wildwood Stables will form south of Woodville on Highway 69 and ride in for the parade Saturday.

Yoath Night Riders, making their seventh annual ride here, will camp at Kountze Thursday night and at Warren Friday night. Dressed in black, the Night Riders front four represent aid to the poor, love, charity, and support for those who are fighting so that we can do what we are doing today.

Jasper County Trail Riders will form on Highway 190 east and ride in for the parade. Whether the trailride starts Thursday or Saturday or in between, each will ride into Woodville Saturday morning to form the second largest trail ride parade in Texas.

The first weekend of the 1971 Tyler County Dogwood Festival will feature a trailride parade at 2:00 p.m. and an open rodeo at 4:30 p.m. Saturday.

It is estimated that there will be as many as 1500 horses and riders in the parade which will begin on Pine Street (Chester highway), come down Magnolia to Bluff (Highway 190) and turn west through the business district and disband at the western city limits.

All trailriders are invited to go on to the 4-H and FFA Rodeo Arena following the parade and take part in the grand entry at 4:30 p.m.

Pullon Battise, chief of the Alabama-Coushatta Indians, will serve as parade marshal for the western parade. Jack Battise and Gilbert Thompson will be honor guards for the chief.

The open rodeo is being produced by Bradford Ivy of Fairfield and those who want to enter any event must call him Friday morning from 9:00 a.m. until noon. His telephone number at Fairfield is AC 214 389-3596.

Rodeo events will include bareback bronc riding, calf roping, steer dogging, barrel racing and bull riding.

Ivy has produced some of the best rodeos in the Southwest and his stock is said to be rough and rugged. It will be well worth the admission charge of \$2.00 for adults and \$1.00 for children, western day sponsors promise.

The Jefferson County Mounted Drill Team will perform during the rodeo and their horsemanship alone will be worth the admission charge.

Saturday night an adult western dance will be held at the Lions Den with the Nite Lites furnishing the music. The teenage western dance at Kirby Gym will have the Raspberry Revolution furnishing the music.

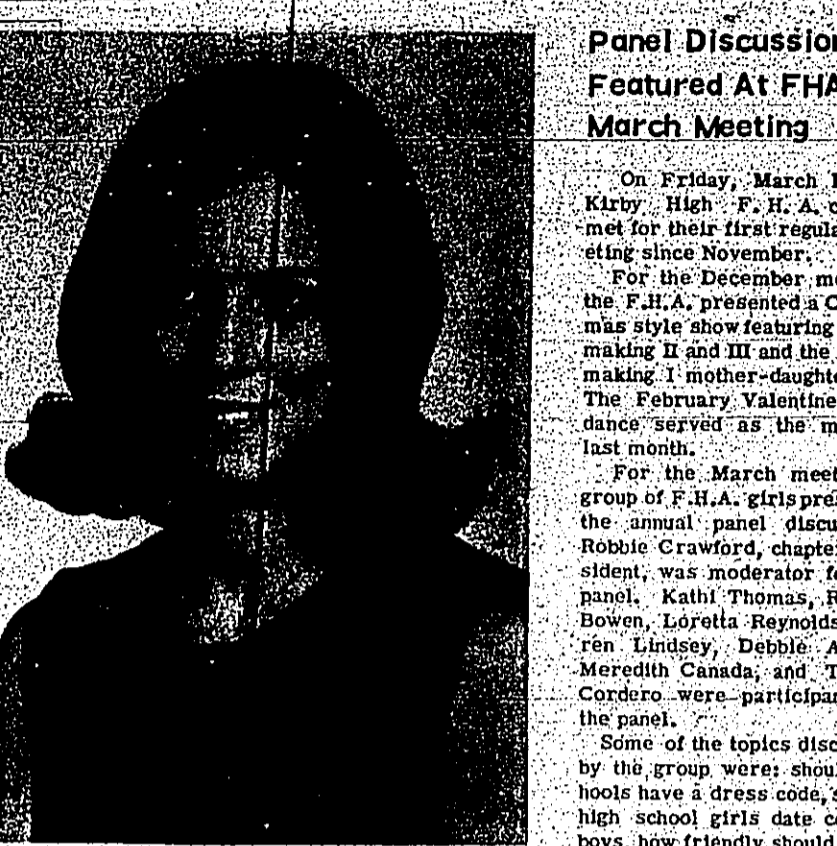

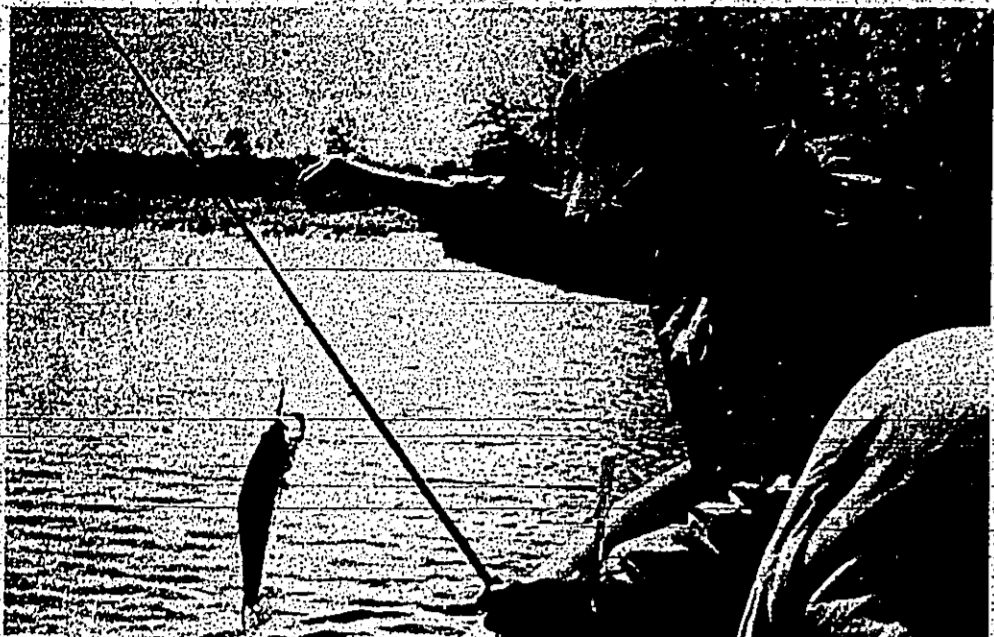
