Meeting Called On Festival's Future

A public meeting of all those interested in the Dogwood Festival has been called for Tuesday night, April 13 at 7:00 p.m. in the Community Room at the Citizens State Bank.

All citizens of Tyler County who are interested in the continuation of the Festival are invited to be present without regard to whether they were able to work on this year's Festival or not. Those attending will be invited to make suggestions as to how the Festival can be improved and to make comments and give criticism concerning the 1971 activities.

Josiah Wheat, current president of the Tyler County Dogwood Festival Association, stated "It is important that we have the suggestions and comments as well as the criticisms of all of those who are interested in the future of the Dogwood Festival. We know that there are many things which could be done better and we need all of the suggestions we can get."

"Additionally, there are still unfortunately too many people who think that Dogwood Festival jobs are by invitation only when in truth and in fact we desperately need volunteers if we are to continue having a Tyler County Dogwood Festival. Every job in the Festival, including mine, is open to anyone who will take it."

"Slots will be handed out Tuesday night for those interested in working on next year's Festival to indicate in what capacity they would be willing to serve. However, whether you are able to work on one of the committees or not we need your presence Tuesday night in order that you can tell us where we have missed the boat and what we can do to have a better Dogwood Festival."

"The Tyler County Dogwood Festival is either everybody's Festival or we have wasted 32 years of effort. Please come to the meeting Tuesday night."

Funeral services for Carl Shepherd, 62, county commissioner of Precinct One in Woodville, were held at 3 p.m. Sunday at the First Baptist Church with Dr. Raymond Parker officiating, assisted by the Rev. Gene Paul Daniel.

Burial was in Magnolia Cemetery under direction of Edwards Funeral Home.

Nephews served as pallbearers. They were Billy M., Kenneth and Edward Hamilton, Floyd E. Fortenberry and Tommy E. and James Davis.

Mr. Shepherd died at 9 p.m. Thursday while visiting in the home of his son, Dr. James L. Shepherd in Georgetown. He was a lifelong resident of Tyler County and was formerly associated with Harrison Construction Co. and Trott Thompson Construction Co. until retirement several years ago.

He had been serving as commissioner for two years. He was a Baptist.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Edith F. Shepherd; one son, Dr. James L. Shepherd of Georgetown; one daughter, Mrs. Ronald McBride of Logansport, La.; one brother, Guy Shepherd of Doucette; two sisters, Mrs. Otto Fortenberry of Port Arthur and Mrs. Tommy Davis of Groves and seven grandchildren.

Judge Mann Appoints Joe Best To Post

County Judge Tom D. Mann said Tuesday morning that he had appointed Joe L. Best, former commissioner, to fill out the unexpired term of Carl Shepherd, precinct one commissioner who died Friday.

The term will expire December 31, 1972.

Mr. Best served one four year term as precinct one commissioner just previous to Mr. Shepherd's term which began January 1, 1969.

Write-In Winner At Warren

Halls Taylor, write-in candidate for Place 1 on the board of trustees of Warren Independent School District, won over the two candidates on the ballot for this position Saturday.

Taylor received 284 votes to 162 for Guy Conner and 90 for Albert Reese.

For Place 2, James Evans and Sarah Shimpin were tied in the returns with 269 votes each.

Place 3 was won by Johnny Barndon with 219 votes. E. L. Warner received 117 votes, Manuel Ard. 115 and Estelle Prince 95.

Clyde E. Smith received 155 votes and L. P. Hicks 77 for two unopposed seats on the county school board.

Pete Winter Dies In Vietnam



PFC Peter Louis Winter, 23, of Woodville, was fatally wounded by mortar fire in the Republic of Vietnam on April 1.

His wife, Jo Carol Winter, and parents, Mr. and Mrs. Milton Winter, all of Woodville, Monday received notification of his death from the Department of the Defense. No other details were available.

Pete, as he was known to his friends here, was inducted into the Army April 22, 1970. He received his basic training at Fort Polk. He was sent to Vietnam in October 1970 where he was serving with the 101st Airborne Division. He had reached his 23rd birthday on March 17 of this year.

He was a graduate of Kirby High School and attended Sam Houston State University one year and Lee Junior College for one semester.

Besides his wife and parents, he is survived by one son, Paul Louis, 2; three sisters and one brother.

Fred Man Killed In One-Car Wreck Sunday Morning

A rash of traffic accidents over the weekend resulted in one death and resulted in injuries to members of two families, one from Houston and the other from Lufkin.

Dead on arrival at Silsbee Doctors Clinic was Jerry Lynn Hays, 24, of Silsbee. The accident occurred at 3:30 a.m. Sunday when a car driven by Donald Ray Hollifield of Fred went out of control at Fred and rolled over three times. The car was traveling south when it left the road.

Hays was a passenger in the car along with Lynn and Steve Hollifield. The others were not seriously injured.

Hays, a veteran of Vietnam, was a native of Fred and had lived in Silsbee 10 years. Funeral services were held at Franks Branch Church at 2:00 p.m. Tuesday.

At 12:50 p.m. Sunday, two cars collided head on two miles south of Hillister resulting in injuries, none serious, to two persons. The cars were driven by Troy Gerald Smith of Lufkin and Marcus Lee Horton of Houston. Highway Patrolman Joe Willimon, who investigated said that one of the cars was on the wrong side of the highway.

Six other accidents occurred in the county but none resulted in injuries.

Miss Lynette Standley was the runner up and was named Princess of Tyler County. Other princesses are Deborah Ann Phillips of Spurger, Cordell Moore of Colmesneil, and Debbie Walker of Chester.

The queen's lady-in-waiting chosen from among the 30 visting duchesses, is Miss Debbie Freeman of Silsbee.

Josiah Wheat, president of the festival association, introduced the visiting duchesses and their escorts. He then presented John Elliott who introduced the trainbearers, crownbearers, ring bearer, and flower girls, the princesses, king and finally the queen.

Miss Jill Ogden, the 1970 queen, made her farewell appearance at the opening of the coronation program. The Mr. East Texas Award, which this year was extended to "Mr. and Mrs. East Texas," was presented to former Governor and Mrs. Allan Shivers.

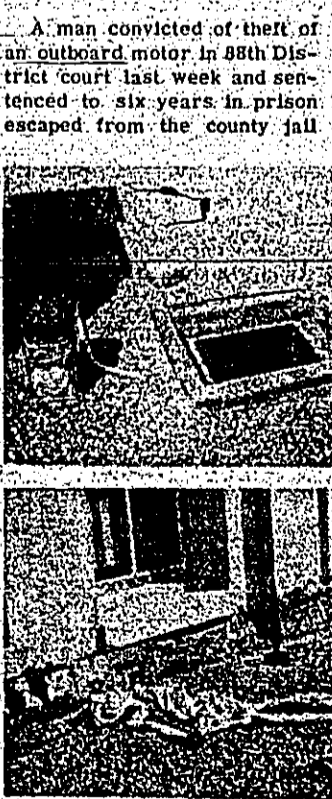

Man Escapes From County Jail

A man convicted of theft of an outboard motor in 88th District court last week and sentenced to six years in prison escaped from the county jail sometime Sunday night.

Roy Oliver Prichard, 59, of Houston, but lately of the state prison in Huntsville, pulled the screen from an air vent in the jail, squeezed through the duct to the roof, knocked the cap and fan off, and emerged on the roof. He then took a rope he had made from sheets, lowered himself to the roof of the extension of the building on the south side, entered an unused room and walked through the courthouse to freedom, according to a surmise by the sheriff's department.

Prichard had a long list of felony convictions on his record. He was back in the Huntsville prison on a parole revocation which, if he served out his time, would have kept him there until 1968. He was brought here on a bench warrant issued by Judge H. A. Coe, presiding judge of 88th district court.

A jury returned a guilty verdict against Prichard and gave him the six-year sentence Wednesday of last week. Previously he had been convicted of theft, robbery by firearms, and robbery by assault (among other things) in Texas and Oklahoma.

Chamber Hears Reports On Trash Cleanup At Meet

Tyler County Chamber of Commerce members at the regular meeting Monday night heard the March financial report, progress on prospective industries, and a report on the county cleanup drive for the annual dogwood festival.

Wyatt Bell, president, said that the cleanup campaign under the direction of Carl Nichols, chairman, was a real success and that he thought more progress in continuing the anti-litter campaign throughout the year is certain now that such a good start has been made.

Jack White reported that book circulation at Allan Shivers Library in March was 4200 which is up considerably above last year. He also pointed out that April 18-24 is National Library Week and urged everyone to visit the library during that time.

Mr. Bell said that the East Texas Chamber of Commerce annual meeting will be held in Dallas at the Baker Hotel April 15-16. He said that Mr. F. Alford planned to attend and urged that others who can do so make this meeting.

Mr. Alford told the members that the East Texas Chamber will hold a tourist development conference in Nacogdoches April 20-21 and said that, since this area is seeking more tourists, more local people should be present.

On a motion by George Reynolds, the members approved drafting a resolution of sympathy to the wife and parents of PFC Pete Winter's who received word Monday that he had been killed in Vietnam.

Incumbent City Councilmen Win In Woodville

The three incumbent members of the Woodville city council were re-elected in the election Saturday.

Clay Miller polled 184 votes, Gardner Parks 180 and T. L. Guley 168. The fourth candidate, Willie Jerue, received 78 votes. There was one write-in vote each for Jim Gainey and J. P. Miller.

VICA First In Parade

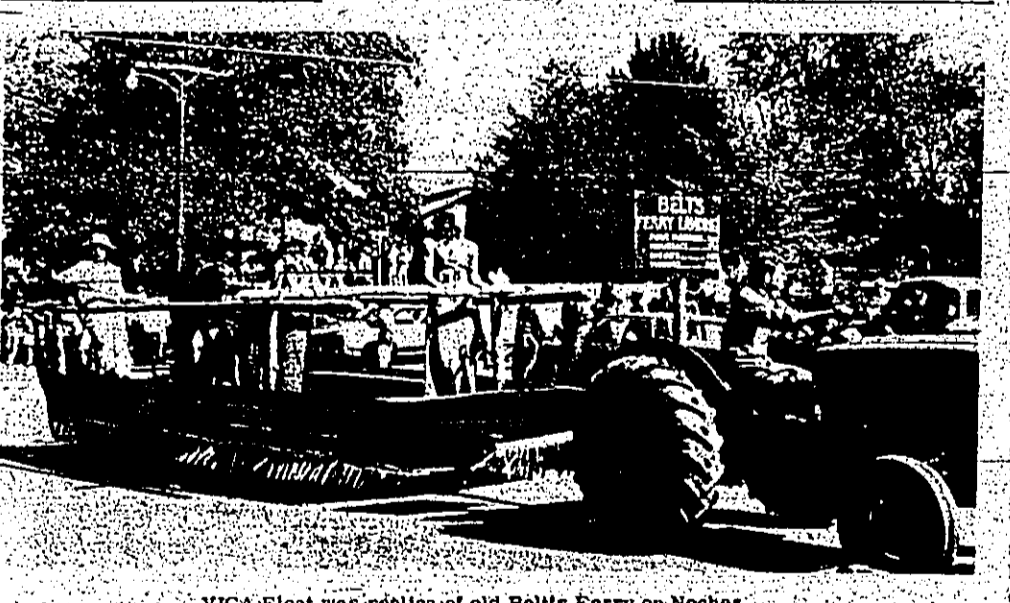
The Tyler County Dogwood Parade Saturday was one of the longest and one of the best in its history.

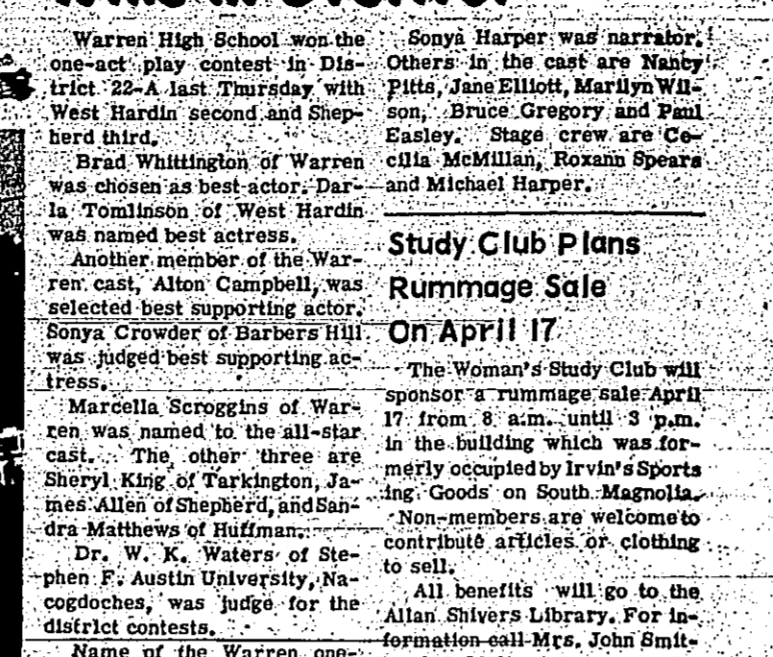

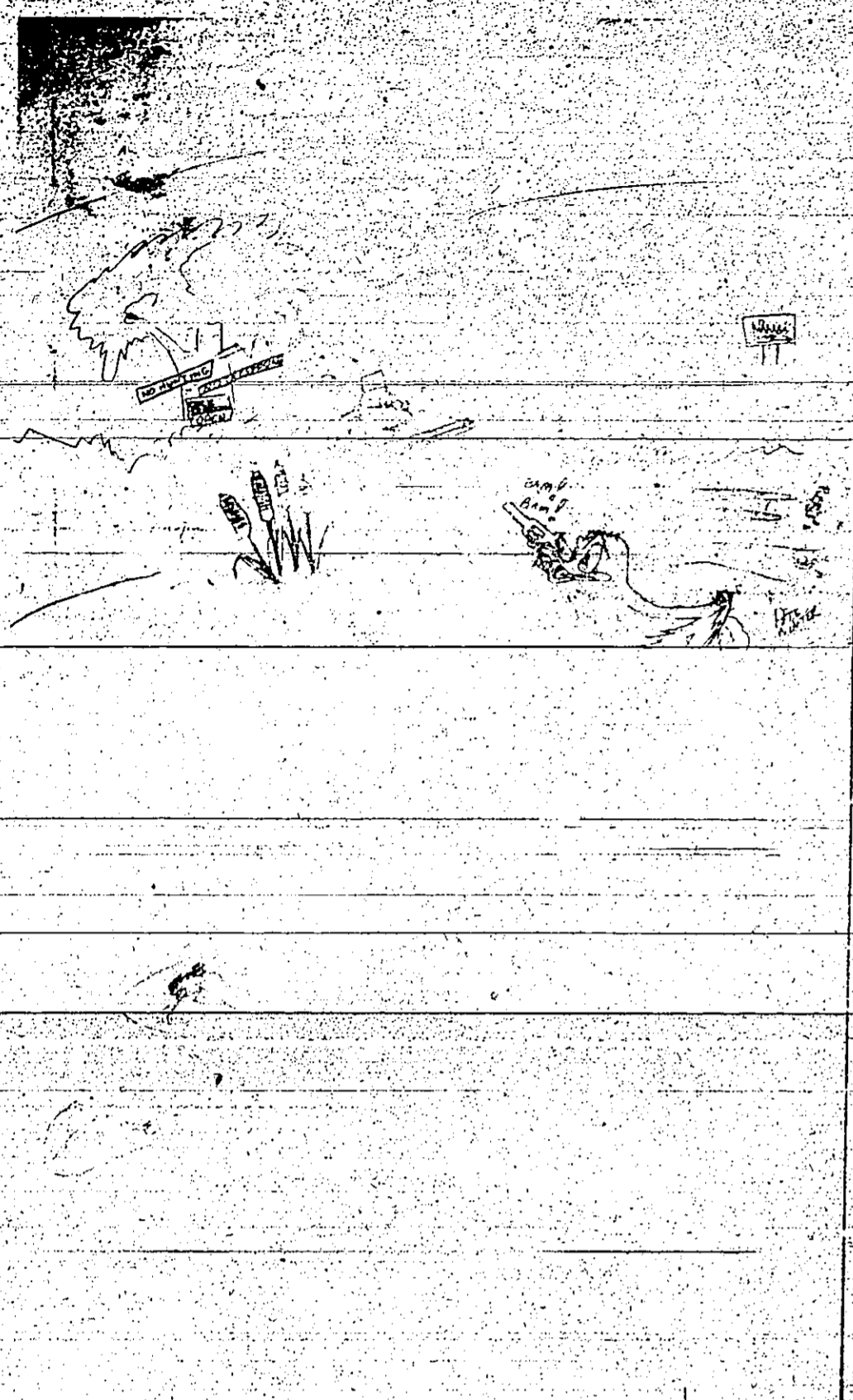

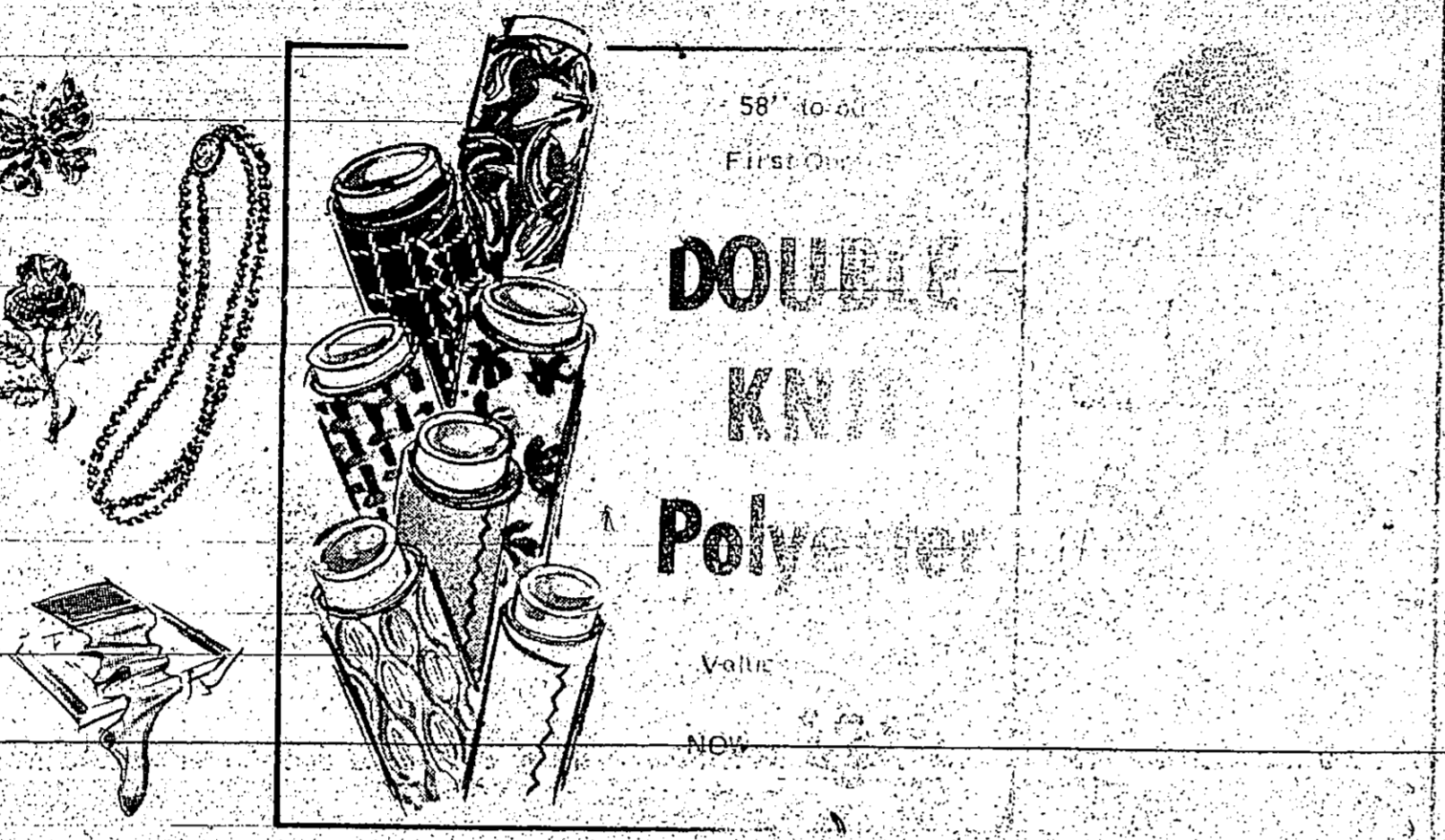
